Militant Mario on Payroll at Berkeley

Mario Savio, leader of the Free Speech Movement, has been on the payroll of the philosophy department at the University of California in Berkeley since October.

Employed as a reader at \$2.97 per hour, he drew a check for \$15.53 on Feb. 8 while out on bail pending trial for his part in the Dec. 3 sit-in demonstration at Sproul Hall.

His payroll form was cleared by the administration in October, after he had been suspended for his part in the initial Free Speech demonstrations.

As late as January, while he was no longer a student, he was called in for 7½ hours work. As of yesterday his card still was in the files as a reader.

Readers are employed to review and suggest a grade on examination papers. Over the years this work has been done, for pay, by graduate students and in some instances by senior students. Savio was a junior at the time his application was received and accepted.

Savio was hired on the approval of Joseph Tussman, head of the Department of Philosophy, who acted upon the recommendation of Prof. John Searle.

Tussman has been an outspoken advocate of the Free

Speech movement and was present during certain of the FSM demonstrations.

Searle, in a TV discussion, said it was he who drafted the provisions contained in the initial statement adopted by the Academic Senate in support of the FSM, a statement which later was modified.

Searle was an unsuccessful candidate in a faculty election naming members of the special Academic Senate committee which dealt with the Board of Regents and administration on the FSM problem.

Savio Plan-March Over Gate Bridge

Mario Savio told a rally at Sproul Hall yesterday of plans to stage a Selma sympathy march across the Golden Gate Bridge at 11 a.m. tomorrow. The marchers, Savio said,

would cross the bridge from Marin County, walking across all six auto lanes. California Highway Patrol District Inspector Daniel J. O'Connell, when informed of Savio's plan, said: "The CHP will assist all lawful activities of student demonstrators."

He warned, however, that this means staying on the pedestrian walkways.

When asked what should happen if they should block the lanes of traffic, O'Connell said: "We'll arrest them."

Savio expressed hopes for a massive traffic tieup, adding: "So that people out for a quiet Sunday drive will have time, when they are stuck in the traffic jams, to think about things in Selma, Ala."

He told the student rally that he is hoping for between 1,000 and 2,000 demonstrators to join him in the march during which they will refuse to pay the 10 cent pedestrian toll.
