You were found guilty by the jury some thirty days ago of transporting a quantity of marijuana which you knew to have been smuggled into the United States. Your Honor, I have a declaration -THE COURT:

My information from California is that the Defendant Timothy Leary has been convicted by a jury trial in that jurisdiction and is awaiting sentence, Your Honor, and that this is discretionary with the Courts under the laws of the State of California to admit to bail, and this was not done at the conclusion of the jury verdict; that the Defendant was committed to custody. At this time,

technically, Your Honor, he is a state prisoner of the State of California, a borrowed prisoner to us. The sentencing on this is set, as I understand it, on March 11 before the Santa Anna Court.

THE COURT:

The Defendant is on bond as far as our case is concerned?

MR. STANDARD:

has been here every time, on the bond hearing and trial, and, as you know, through two successive appeals and remands. There has never been any suggestion that Dr. Leary would not appear, and I ask that the bail be continued in the same amount, the amount he has been out on earlier appeals following conviction.

(4) THE COURT:

I think under Section 3148 of Title 18/I would deny bond during the course of appeal. I have no doubt that the Defendant would appear, but I have reason to believe that he, if at large, would pose a danger to other persons or to the community. I think his conduct over the past years, particularly since the time that he was tried here before, has been such as to lead me to believe, at least, that he has openly advocated a violation of these

laws. He has preached it the length and breadth of the land, and I am inclined to the view that he would pose a danger to the community if released.

It is my duty to advise you, too, that you are entitled to take an appeal from this judgment and sentence. In the event you are without funds to pay the expenses of an appeal, you may make application to appeal in forma pauperis. The Clerk will enter Notice of Appeal on your behalf, if you request that she do so, at this time.

MR. STANDARD:

If I may, Your Honor, I would like to ask if
the conclusions that you have come to represent findings
of fact on your part, and if they do, if they are findings
of fact not in anticipation of a hearing on the question,
since it is my understanding that what you are saying is
that because he has advocated, because he has exercised
the right of speech, not having performed any (5) other
criminal act, that he is to be remanded, and it is that
which I think you are suggesting makes him a menace to
the community. I would like the record to be clear that
I would like a hearing on the question, because I think
the burden falls, under 3148, to the United States Attorney, at least in the first instance, to show that he is



Dr. Leary and his Attorney, have requested that the facts of his cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) be furnished. These facts are as follows:

In May, 1975, Dr. Leary voluntarily agreed to cooperate with a multi-agency task force, including representatives from the FBI, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Department of State, California Department of Justice, and California Bureau of Prisons. In initial taped interviews, Dr. Leary provided extensive information concerning several state and Federal violations. transcript of these interviews totals over 400 typewritten pages. After successfully corroborating Dr. Leary's initial information, he was interviewed by the FBI over a three week period at a secure location in California. During this period, he consented to being transported to several other locations in California to identify "safe-houses," Also, Dr. Leary provided invaluable help to interviewing Agents by assisting them in retrieving and evaluating voluminous documentary evidence available in the Leary archives. In mid 1975, Dr. Leary was again interviewed by FBI Special Agents with representatives of the Department of Justice and the Office of the United States Attorney, San Francisco, present, in preparation for his grand jury testimony which was recently presented to a Federal Grand Jury, San Francisco. From May, 1974, to the present, Dr. Leary



Artman alone may be no serious threat, but if the temple is established and if it attracts, as it must, the Telegraph Ave. types intent on taking a trip, then it has no place in a quiet residential neighborhood.



He also commues to stand as an important force in American poetry, following mathe Remantic and visionary-tracitions of Blake and Whitman.

And his practical methods include lessons on how to make love. 

Leary Calls Use of Drugs 'Revolutionary; Says They Liberate People from Society

Dr. Timothy Leary is back in Dr. Timothy Leary 15 win. He's here to "groove in the place I've lived in for 20 years," ind, at the same time, give bene-At lectures at Berkeley's Free Univrsity (FUB).

In an interview at the FUB, Dr. Leary spoke of the power of psychedelic drugs.

"A dove-tailed joint is more. revolutionary than all the Molotoy cocktails ever thrown. The adt of turning on is in itself anti-Establishment.

"Drugs free you from any control; you can literally make up your mind to pick the social syst tem you want, be it the political, the farm, or whatever.

"Drugs demand that you take He cited the young advisory anarchize the nervous system. To Kennedy, who influenced Kendrop out is not to cop out, but help help with their pacifist ideas, and to free yourself from exterior also the unknown pools. control. You become a god of yourself."

Is the inner peacefulness of drugs incongrous to the active revolutionary movement? "No," he said. "You must feel goodwithin yourself before you can do anything. Turning on is not an escape."

Dressed in a sweater, corduroy, pants, sailing tennies and a lone string of beads, Dr. Leary seemed glad to be back in Berkeley. Unfortunately, he must soon leave. again, to appeal four charges of marijuana possession that could imprison him for 79 years.

Does being arrested discourage him from his beliefs? "It doesn't affect my consciousness. If this country is so up tight to arrest me for an ouce of grass, it would probably arrest me for any rea-son," he said. I am an advocate of personal pleasure and it can't stand that," he added.
Personal pleasure is the key

to a happy existence, he explained, and the first step to pleasure is psychedelic drugs. Not amphetamines, heroin, or alcohol, he was quick to add. "They en-slave you as much as the E tab-

lishment." Psychedelic drugs make it pos-

sible for a "silent majority of persons under 25 to quietly make love, be peaceful and yet overthrow the present system from within."


With a sincere, intense expression he announced that his "great revelatory powers have foreseen in 10 to 15 years the arrival of a Dope Society, to replace the Booze Society. He was asked if happiness brings boredom. Aren't many dope-users bored with life? "Baredom is a great evolutionary cause, but a child of 14 is bored with TV, not with LSD. Boredom is a challenge to change four life. The more godlike you become, the more bored you are.

By and large, violent people shin psychedelic drugs. The lumber of violent acts committed under these drugs is miraculously low, considering the unstableness of people," he explained.

With his long grey-streaked hair and handsome features radiating happiness, he said: "It's better to turn on with anything you do, be it the Army or business college."

Continuing, he said, "It is best to go back to the tribal way of life, away from the computer and the military."

"With tribes," Leary stated, "there is respect for one another. If the Black nationalists don't has, sle me, I leave them alsone. As man gets more free, he respects the freedom of others more."

In a final word of advice, Leary warned that "state-supported universities must stop. Free universities are the seed of the future. That is why I am giving these benefit lectures, to strengthen the one here (the FUB)."

As he turned to go, he sighed. "You know, being God isn't all pleasure. It's a lot of responsibility and the pax isn't very good."

A spokesman for the men's colony said Leary, a husky six-footer, had to scale a 12foot-high chain link fence topped by barbed wire to make his escape.

It is assumed that he was met somewhere outside the prison by a friend who had a car and a change of clothing.

Beyond that, the spokes man said, prison officials had no idea where Leary was helding - or what his motives were.

The 49-year-old crusader for legalization of LSD and marijuana was serving a six-month to ten-year term for possession of marijuana.

cause Leary is currently appealing a Federal Court decision involving his ten vear sentence for illegally import ing marijuana across the Mexican Border at Laredo Tex., in 1965.

Leary won a reversal following his first trial on that charge, but drew the ten; year sentence following a second trial.

Leary also was scheduled to begin trial Thursday, in Duchess County, N.Y., on 11 counts of drug-law violations. in 1965 and 1967.

Until his prison clothing was found at the service station here, authorities had speculated Leary might have gone from the prison —on a hill near Highway 1, over looking the ocean - to one of the many coastal clusters of drug-oriented hip pie types who consider him a folk hero.

Leary had been working in the clerical pool at the men's Car Correspondent colony.



Shortly thereafter, the Orange County Sheriff's Office issued warrants for 15 of those persons indicted.						
On October 2, a BROTHERHOOD fugitive, was seized in San Jose, Costa Rica, while attempting to smuggle into the United States a sizeable amount of hash oil.						
The oil was packed in the innermost bag of six self-sealing plastic bags which were then placed in a cloth bag bearing the BROTHERHOOD symbol.

At the time of his arrest, had in his possession an airline ticket for Phoenix, Arizona.						
To date, 14 BROTHERHOOD members indicted remain as fugitives. The State Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement, in conjunction with the Organized Crime & Criminal Intelligence Branch, is engaged in an all-out effort to apprehend these individuals.




