LEARY ADVISED THAT HIS WIFE, JOANNA, WAS VERY RECENTLY IN TOUCH WITH ONE MICHEL HAUGHARD, A EUROPEAN CON MAN WITH INTELLIGENCE CONNECTIONS, WHO HELPED LEARY SETTLE IN SWITZERLAND IN 1971.

HAUCHARD TELEPHONED FROM FRANCE, MOST LIKELY PARIS, AND ADVISED THAT ROSEMARY LEARY, TIMOTHY'S FORMER WIFE, WAS PRESENTLY LOCATED IN A MENTAL HOSPITAL SOMEWHERE IN EUROPE, MOST LIKELY SWITZERLAND, FRANCE, OR HOLLAND. HAUCHARD ADVISED HE HAD RECENTLY MET WITH WUC SUPPORT FIGURE AND LAWYER MICHAEL KENNEDY. LEARY ADVISED HE FEELS HAUCHARD AND KENNEDY COULD LIKELY BE KEEPING ROSEMARY LEARY CONFINED TO A MENTAL HOSPITAL IN ORDER TO KEEP HER FROM TESTIFYING BEFORE A UNITED STATES GRAND JURY REGARDING LEARY'S WUC-ASSISTED ESCAPE FROM CALIFORNIA PRISON AUTHORITIES. LEARY FURTHER ADVISED THAT IF LOCATED AND INTERVIEWED, ROSEMARY LEARY MIGHT POSSIBLY HAVE VERY VALUABLE INFORMATION PERTAINING TO CHICAGO'S CURRENT PROJECT.

SAN DIEGO IS CONDUCTING NO FURTHER INQUIRY REGARDING THE ABOVE UNLESS DIRECTED TO DO SO BY THE BUREAU OR CHICAGO.

3. PROSECUTIVE ACTION TAKEN DURING PRIOR MONTH

4. WEATHERMAN FUGITIVE INFORMATION DEVELOPED DURING PRIOR MONTH

With regard to the address 1211 Oak Street, San Francisco, California, used in the purchase of a 1956 Chevrolet station wagon with Oregon license EGS 673, and the address 1411 Oak Street, San Francisco, California, used in the purchase of a 1958 Chevrolet station wagon with California license CSE 070, both addresses are non-existent and would be across the street from the Golden Gate Park Panhandle in the Haight-Ashbury area. These vehicles are believed to be driven by WILLIAM CHARLES AYERS. FOIA(b)(7) - (D) is attempting to determine the significance of these addresses. The other extremist sources have been alerted to the above information

Dr. ~~TIMOTHY LEARY~~ in a recent interview advised that following his escape from prison in September, 1970, he was taken to a two-story residence on 15th Street in San Francisco where Albion Street deadends. Other than commercial buildings, there are four houses in this location with ten separate units. Each unit has its own entrance on 15th Street. Interviews with persons residing here who were here in 1970 have failed to identify anyone participating in the LEARY escape. All advised that the turnover of tenants is extremely high. The renters presently are mostly Chinese. Investigation is continuing in this matter.

All new Weathfug identities recently developed have been checked through birth and death records, Voters Registration, public libraries, welfare, Bank of America Travelers Check Fraud Unit, etc., with negative results.

There has been no communal activity noted within the Seattle Division during October, 1974. The Revolutionary Union (RU) continues under investigation, however, these individuals have not been determined to be residing in communal fashion.

II. INFORMANT PROGRAMS INITIATED AGAINST COMMUNES AND ORGANIZATIONS UNDER INVESTIGATION DUE TO THEIR REVOLUTIONARY POSITIONS

[redacted] continuing to provide daily coverage of the Seattle RU chapter. [redacted] has recently been targeted against PAUL RUDOLF ZILSEL, father of Weatherfug JOANNA ZILSEL (see section IV for additional information regarding ZILSEL). [redacted] also continues to provide coverage of individuals and activities in various areas of Seattle in which are indigenous to extremist type activity. [redacted] advised on 10/29/74, of recent personal contact with Spectar target CONSTANCE ALPENE LONG. Source has scheduled a subsequent meet with LONG within the next two weeks and will attempt to develop information which might assist in setting up a secure interview with LONG under favorable conditions.

III. PROSECUTIVE ACTION, LOCAL OR FEDERAL, INITIATED AGAINST ANY REVOLUTIONARY INDIVIDUAL DURING OCTOBER, 1974

Regarding prosecution of KAREN LEE LATIMER for passport visa matter - giving false statement, it was reported during October, 1974, by the San Francisco Division that LATIMER's attorney MICHAEL KELLY of San Francisco, has finalized arrangements with AUSA OLSON of Seattle regarding plea bargaining pertaining to the aforementioned charge. Although requested to obtain information from LATIMER regarding Weatherman with whom she might have had contact, KELLY has advised that LATIMER has no information to offer and KELLY would appear at this time to have no intention of making his client available for any interview with the FBI.

Seattle and San Francisco Divisions are following and will report results of prosecution pertaining to LATIMER's conviction.

IV. WEATHERFUG

TIMOTHY LEARY

During October, 1974, no significant developments were made concerning investigation initiated by information obtained in former debriefings of TIMOTHY LEARY.

During October, 1974, the Minneapolis Division developed information that individuals located at 2106 State Game Road, Gig Harbor, Washington, were corresponding with LINDSTROM during August and September, 1974. Investigation instant residence has initially determined that a male and female, JOHN and KAREN (LNU) are currently residing at instant residence which is a remote farmhouse and have advised sources that they are from the New York area, previously attending Columbia University. Investigation is currently underway to further identify these individuals and determine if connected with ongoing Weatherman investigation.

"PRAIRIE FIRE"

During October, 1974, [] contacted PAUL ZILSEL at the New Left Bookstore, Seattle, and learned that ZILSEL is promoting the Weatherman study group idea although it is strongly opposed by RU members in Seattle. Source further learned that Left Bank Books is a primary outlet in the Seattle area for "Prairie Fire" and source has been invited to become part of the first "Prairie Fire" Weatherman study group expected to commence during November, 1974. Source further noted that in conversation with members of the Seattle RU chapter that the "Prairie Fire" concept is being strongly opposed by the RU and its supporters which has apparently resulted in few book sales, little attention to "Prairie Fire" and efforts by the RU to discourage formation of study groups as called for by "Prairie Fire".

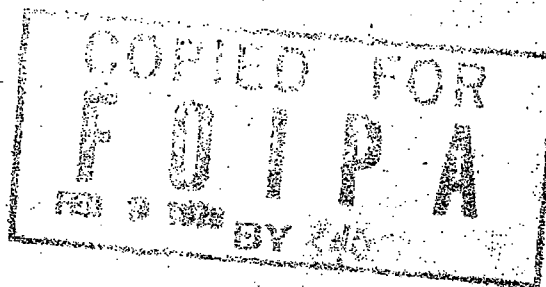

Enclosed herewith to the Bureau are one copy each of a booklet entitled, "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love", and another entitled, "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love", Supplement 1, Comprehensive Name Index. These booklets were prepared by the California Department of Justice, Division of Law Enforcement, Organized Crime and Criminal Intelligence Branch.

Also enclosed herewith for each recipient office is one copy each of the above described enclosures.

The Brotherhood of Eternal Love, according to representatives of the Orange County, California, District Attorney's Office, is an organization which they have characterized as a "hippie - psychedelic" group involved in extensive narcotics distribution in the Southern California Area, the San Francisco, California, Bay Area, the Santa Barbara County, California, and the Idlewild, California, Areas. In addition, they are active in the State of Oregon, particularly in Josephine County, and in Hawaii.

The enclosed confidential publication entitled, "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love", sets forth on page 1, an organization outline and general history of this organization. In 1967, a group of subjects were identified as major drug dealers, and established a psychedelic shop which they called "Mystic Arts World." Investigation revealed individuals involved in that

During 1967 and 1968, TIMOTHY LEARY was observed by investigating officers to be associated with one ROBERT LEE ANDRIST and MICHAEL BOYD RANDALL. Both ANDRIST and RANDALL *8/27/43* have been identified as major figures in the illicit drug *CALIF* traffic. LEARY has been identified by subjects involved in these investigations as dealing in LSD, as a religious leader, and in 1967 and 1968, was publicly encouraging the "expansion" of the mind through religious use of LSD. In December 1968, LEARY and his family were arrested by Laguna Beach Police Department in the Laguna Canyon area of Orange County, California. LEARY was subsequently sentenced to State Prison upon conviction of Section 11530 of the Health and Safety Code. It was at that approximate time that individuals involved with LEARY began referring to themselves as "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love."

CALIF. In August 1968, Agents of the California Bureau of Narcotics Enforcement arrested ANDRIST for violation of Section 11912 of the Health and Safety Code. *Carla Schmitt* *Robert Lee Andrist*

According to EDWARD BANKS, Senior Investigator, Orange County District Attorney's Office, an investigation was undertaken by representatives of the various police departments in the Orange County area; California State Narcotics Agents; Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs personnel; United States Customs authorities; and, later, law enforcement authorities in the San Francisco, California, area, as well as Oregon and Hawaii.

Agents assigned to the Los Angeles Division, and particularly in the Santa Ana Resident Agency, kept in touch with local authorities because it was learned that numerous individuals alleged to be involved with this organization were subjects of Bureau investigations and/or in fugitive status. These cases involved Parole violations; Bond Default investigations; Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution (UFAP) investigations; and Selective Service violations.

The Los Angeles Times Newspaper publication of 8/6/72, carried a lengthy article reflecting that an Orange County Grand Jury had returned 29 secret indictments charging numerous individuals with narcotics distribution in connection with this organization.

The above referred to confidential publication sets forth the modus operandi of this organization and names the individuals known and suspected to be involved as distributors as well as their areas of operation.

In addition to the foregoing, the above enclosure entitled, "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love", Supplement 1, is a comprehensive name index of those individuals known and suspected to be involved with this organization.

Orange County law enforcement authorities have advised that a special task force has been organized for the purpose of gathering information directed toward prosecution of individuals involved in this organization.

Inasmuch as the Los Angeles Division has under investigation numerous individuals involved in a fugitive status, liaison has been maintained with Orange County authorities. Arrests made following the above mentioned Orange County Grand Jury indictments have included persons whose whereabouts are being sought by the Bureau.

In addition to the foregoing, information has also been received from those local authorities that this organization is alleged to contain members who have some affiliation with Weatherman fugitives currently being sought by the Bureau. Information has been received from these authorities that members of the Weatherman group were instrumental in effecting the escape of LEARY from the California State Penal System and his subsequent flight from the United States. Specific information regarding this allegation has not yet been positively established.

Special Agent DONALD STRANGE, Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, Los Angeles, has advised that there is in custody one individual who, upon interview with members of this task force, stated that he had knowledge that the Weatherman

element had, in fact, rendered escape assistance to LEARY. It was alleged by that individual (identity not known to the Bureau) that for their assistance the Weatherman fugitives received \$25,000.

In view of the foregoing and at the specific request of members of the task force, agent personnel of the Los Angeles Division attended a conference in Santa Ana, California, on 9/13/72. Present at that conference were members of the above mentioned law enforcement agencies. During the conference those members were briefed by Agents of the Los Angeles Division concerning the Weatherman fugitives and copies of wanted circular flyers of all of the Weatherman fugitives were distributed to those present.

During the investigation and subsequent arrests made by members of the task force, they received information from informants and one of two of the arrestees indicating a very good likelihood of a relationship existing between members of this organization and the Weatherman faction. Furthermore, during this investigation this task force has positively established that members of the Brotherhood have successfully obtained and are continuing to utilize excellent false identification which is similar to the modus operandi of Weatherman fugitives. It is felt by the task force that members of the Weatherman underground or sympathizers may have coached or offered assistance to the Brotherhood organization in establishing false identities in order to leave the country or go into seclusion in order to avoid arrest.

It is the intention of the Los Angeles Division to maintain close liaison with members of the task force to insure that information developed by that group concerning Bureau fugitives will be made immediately available to Bureau personnel. In addition, members of the task force have agreed to furnish to the Bureau information concerning the false identities of individuals known to them. During the course of continuing investigation, members of the task force will further direct inquiries to their informants and sources regarding the Weatherman fugitives. It is felt by the Los Angeles Division that this approach is valid in that additional informant coverage will result by virtue of the continuing narcotics investigation.

In addition to the foregoing, a number of the individuals named in the Grand Jury indictment are not yet in custody and Orange County authorities are in the process of preparing requests for UFAP investigations to locate those individuals.

The Los Angeles Division is also currently in the process of reviewing the office indices regarding all of the individuals involved with the Brotherhood for the purpose of assisting this task force group and possibly locating Bureau fugitives and/or Weatherman fugitives.

GEORGE H. CHULA, JR.

According to members of the task force, GEORGE H. CHULA, JR., a Santa Ana, California, attorney, has actively participated in the defense of members of this organization arrested in the past in California, Hawaii, and Oregon. His 23 year old son, STEPHEN CHULA, is likewise known to be a Steve Chula member of the organization and involved in narcotics distribution.

D.O.B. 4/9/44 BRIAN KENDALL MC ADAMS and JOHN CHARLES GALE are two individuals currently in custody who are considered to be, along with ROBERT LEE ANDRIST, leaders in this organization. MC ADAMS is married to one YONICA MENNE, also recently arrested in connection with this narcotics investigation. MENNE is free on bond.

BANKS has indicated that MC ADAMS, through his attorneys, is attempting to determine whether or not he can receive consideration for information he might furnish.

It is felt by members of the task force that MC ADAMS knows the whereabouts of ANDRIST and could very probably furnish information which would lead to his apprehension.

For the additional information of the Bureau, Agents of the Los Angeles Division have maintained contact with personnel of the various law enforcement agencies in Orange County during the past 18 months regarding the members of captioned organization. Detective ROBERT F. ROMAINE of the Laguna Beach Police Department has previously advised that on 1/4/72 and 1/5/72, a meeting of members of this task group was held in San Francisco for the purpose of pooling information in the investigation of this organization and its members.

As the Bureau is aware, the Swiss Government has recently ordered LEARY to leave that country not later than 10/31/72. As a result of this investigation, members of this task force have heard rumors and received information indicating that members of the Brotherhood are attempting to purchase property in the Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, area which they hope to utilize as a haven for LEARY at such time as he actually leaves Switzerland. The Los Angeles Division intends to pursue this aspect of the task force investigation so that the whereabouts of LEARY might be established in the event that he does, in fact, depart from Switzerland.

The Los Angeles Division intends to follow this matter closely and maintain liaison with members of the task force to insure that any information developed by them concerning FBI jurisdiction will be made immediately available. In addition, members of the task force have been specifically requested to keep Bureau personnel advised, on a continuing basis, of the activities of members of the task force.

THE BROTHERHOOD OF ETERNAL LOVE

The Brotherhood of Eternal Love, according to Edward Banks, Sr. Investigator, Orange County, California, District Attorney's Office, Santa Ana, California, is an organization which is characterized as a "hippie-psychedelic" group involved in extensive narcotics distribution in California, Oregon, and Hawaii.

Detective Robert Romaine of the Laguna Beach, California, Police Department, advised that The Brotherhood of Eternal Love is a group of individuals who have been identified as major drug dealers. Romaine made available a copy of a confidential publication entitled "The Brotherhood of Eternal Love" prepared by the California Department of Justice with the assistance of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs and other law enforcement agencies. This publication sets forth that the organization was formed in 1967 when a group of individuals established a "hippie-psychedelic" shop which they called "Mystic Arts World". Investigation revealed that individuals affiliated with the Mystic Arts World established the store to use as a front for illicit drug traffic. Continuing investigation of individuals identified in connection with the foregoing from 1967 through 1969 revealed they were the major source of supply for LSD in Southern California. Additional investigation revealed that in 1967 those subjects were obtaining their LSD from sources in the San Francisco area. Robert Lee Andrist and Michael Boyd Randall were identified as major figures in the establishment of the Mystic Arts World store and in the illicit drug traffic. Randall was determined to be the licensee of the store. *Calif*

During 1967 and 1968 Timothy Francis Leary, Jr., was observed to be associating with Andrist and Randall and also known to frequent the Laguna Canyon - Woodland Drive area of Laguna Beach. According to this publication, Leary has

since been identified, by many of the individuals dealing in LSD, as a religious leader of this group and who, at that time, was publicly encouraging the "expansion of one's mind through religious use of LSD". Leary has been observed meeting with Andrist in the Laguna Beach area.

In December 1968 Leary and members of his family were arrested by the Laguna Beach Police Department in the Laguna Canyon area. Leary was subsequently sentenced to California State Prison following his conviction of violation of Section 11530 of the California Health and Safety Code. It was at about that approximate period of time that individuals affiliating with Leary adopted the name of the "Brotherhood of Eternal Love" for their organization.

In 1969, according to the California Department of Justice publication, a major fire of unknown origin consumed the Mystic Arts World store. Since that time investigation has revealed that many of the members of this organization have moved to different parts of California and the United States where they are continuing their illicit drug traffic. Investigation has revealed that these individuals have found their primary market for drugs in Southern California. They continued to utilize shops in the Laguna Beach area as fronts for their illicit drug traffic. These stores have been identified as follows:

In addition, the California Department of Justice publication sets forth an explanation of the method of operation and distribution of LSD, hashish, cocaine, and marijuana.

Locations of activities have been identified as Josephine County, Oregon; Idyllwilde; Santa Barbara; and the Southern Orange County areas of California; San Diego County; San Francisco Bay area, both in California and Hawaii.

The publication sets forth information indicating that individuals engaged in the traffic of narcotics have been known to sell "orange sunshine" or "Christ" LSD (red and green). It has been established that they smuggle and distribute large quantities of hashish in vehicles originating in the United States. Individuals involved in this organization have, on a continuing basis, utilized Attorney George Chula and associates, of Santa Ana, California, as their attorneys. They also have readily available at their disposal the facilities of the Orange County Bail Bond Company, also in Santa Ana. They have been known to operate under assumed identities and utilize false identification which includes birth certificates from New York and other states, Selective Service registration cards, student identification cards from the University of California, and driver's licenses from Oregon, Utah, Hawaii, Nevada (which do not contain photographs), and California. They have also been known to use military service identification, other than military identification cards.

Edward Banks of the Orange County District Attorney's Office has advised that numerous individuals involved in this narcotics traffic are currently in a fugitive status and their whereabouts are not known. The "Los Angeles Times" newspaper, a daily newspaper published in Los Angeles, California, on August 6, 1972, carried a lengthy article reflecting that an Orange County Grand Jury had returned 29 secret indictments charging numerous individuals with narcotics distribution. All of those individuals were named as belonging to the "Brotherhood of Eternal Love".

Special Agent Donald Strange of the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, Los Angeles, California, advised on October 11, 1972, that he had recently returned from San Jose, Costa Rica. He returned with him to the United States Edward Jeffrey Lange, who was ordered deported to the United

States by Costa Rican authorities following his arrest by police representatives of Costa Rica for narcotics activities.

Strange advised that numerous other individuals apparently had been in Costa Rica just prior to the arrest of Lange and are believed to have fled to other foreign countries, including Honduras.

Strange advised further that the continuing investigation into the narcotics traffic activities of these individuals has determined they have connections in West Germany, Chile, possibly Mexico, and Guatemala.

Numerous members of this organization are currently in custody in the Orange County, California, Jail, Santa Ana, California, awaiting trial following their having been indicted by an Orange County Grand Jury in August 1972.

A preliminary inquiry has been initiated concerning the subject for the purpose of determining if subject is involved in Weatherman activities which could involve a violation of Title 18, U.S.C. 2383 (Rebellion or Insurrection), 2384 (Seditious Conspiracy), 2385 (Advocating Overthrow of the Government), 837 (Unlawful Possession and Receipt of Firearms), 844 (d) (Explosives and Incendiary Devices), 2101 (Antiriot Laws), Title 26, U.S.C. 5861 (d) (Unlawful Possession of Destructive Devices).

During July, 1974, the Seattle Division received information that TIMOTHY FRANCIS LEARY JR., former drug cult guru, had identified the farmhouse at Route 3, Box 193, Monroe, Washington, as the safe house at which he had been harbored during September, 1970, after his escape from California prison. This commune had earlier been identified by Seattle as a temporary residence of RICHARD JAMES AYERS (Fude) and MELODY KAY KILIAN (former paramour of Weatherman BILL AYERS and common-law wife of RICK AYERS) during 1970 and early 1971. During February, 1971, AYERS/KILIAN turned the farmhouse over to a group of individuals who are presently being investigated to determine their extent of involvement with the Weatherman. Investigation has thus far determined varying degrees of contact with AYERS/KILIAN and other known Weatherman support by these individuals presently believed to number about nine subjects. Captioned subject has been identified as one of these individuals.

Subject is a white male, born December 4, 1951, and currently residing at 3842 - 35th Southwest Seattle and employed as a driver for Service Paper Inc., 14-0 Alaskan Way, Seattle.

During November through December, 1974, appropriate informants and established sources were queried for information concerning subject's current activities.

No information was developed to indicate subject is currently engaged in supportive activities on behalf of the Weatherman. Previous investigation determined subject is currently residing at 3842 - 35th SW, Seattle, and employed as a truck driver for Service Paper Inc., 1400 Alaskan Way, Seattle. On December 12, 1974, subject was telephonically contacted at his place of employment with regard to arranging for an interview of subject concerning his knowledge of RICK AYERS and MELODY KILIAN in connection with the Monroe farmhouse during 1970-71. Subject advised that he had no information to provide the FBI concerning instant matter and declined the invitation to meet personally with a representative of the FBI to discuss the matter further.

On December 13, 1974, inquiry was made at subject's residence in Seattle and it was ascertained from a female who answered the door but refused to identify herself, that subject was presently at work but had mentioned to her the previous night that the FBI had talked to him on the phone. Instant female further advised that although she and subject did not wish to appear uncooperative they merely had no information concerning the aforementioned farmhouse in Monroe to reveal to the FBI which they would consider pertinent to FBI interests. Instant conversation was thereafter terminated.

In view of the above it would appear subject has no intention of cooperating with the FBI, however, no information was developed specifically indicating that subject has or is presently

THE YIPPIES ARE COMING!

Nicotine Raiders in State U. Foray

Over 100 members of a hippie-inspired group, many in Keystone Kop costumes, were to launch a pre-dawn mock raid at the State University at Stony Brook this morning.

The "raid" is an obvious parody of the Jan. 17 Suffolk police raid in which 35 students and "drop-ins" were arrested on a variety of drug charges.

"We're going to surge through the dormitories arresting students possessing the dread drug nicotine and objects of pleasure such as balloons," Keith Lampe, a founder of Youth International Party, said last night.

WAITING BEHIND a roadblock at the campus gates were the State University security police, who were alerted to the raid.

In a display of unity, they were supported by students and police.

Lampe, a former Queens College English instructor, claimed those involved in the creation of the YIP group included LSD high priest Dr. Timothy Leary, beat poet Allen Ginsberg, the off-beat folk-singing

group called "The Fugs," and folksingers Judy Collins and Phil Ochs.

"This will be the year of the Yippie," said Lampe. "they're a little fiercer and a little more fun than the hippie."

But Lampe noted the gaub of the new yippie wave is not too distinct—as of now—from the hippie. And, he added, many of those not in Keystone Kop costumes this morning were to be garbed in their normal wardrobe of blankets, beads and sandals.

"OUR BIG project," said Lampe, "is a very large youth festival during the national Democratic party convention in Chicago. We want to manifest the cultural alternative."

Lampe said he would be dressed in a London bobby's hat and police cape which he purchased in an East Village shop yesterday.

He said the raiding party was to gather at 3:30 a.m. today in front of YIP international headquarters at 32 Union Square East and travel in a caravan along

the Long Island Expressway to Stony Brook.

"We expect to hit more than one dormitory," said Lampe. Noting the "suspects" were to be processed in the G-dorm lounge following the 6 a.m. synchronized round-up.

FOLLOWING the "arraignment," "The Fugs" were to give a performance in the lounge preceded by a recital by the Paganini Players, a way-out dramatic group.

"Country Joe and the Fish hope to attend," said Lampe, "but it's all a matter of cars."

Lampe is on leave from Queens College where he taught English as a foreign language at the College Institute. Before that, he worked on newspapers in Pittsburgh and Detroit and with the International News Service in Paris.

A Stony Brook administrative spokesman said: "This all sounds pretty weird." He said rumors of the YIP raid have been circulating on the campus all weekend, "and we thought it might happen early yesterday."

PURPOSE:

To advise that notorious drug advocate Dr. Timothy Francis Leary, Jr., a California state prisoner, is cooperating with authorities and providing information. He has identified Weatherman individuals who assisted him escape from a California state prison in September, 1970, and flee the country. Local authorities are interested in obtaining local process concerning Weatherman individuals who aided Leary in his escape, and this action could lead to obtaining Federal (Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution) process. This information is being furnished to the Department.

BACKGROUND:

Dr. Timothy Francis Leary, Jr., former psychology professor, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, is a well-known advocate of the use of drugs. On September 12, 1970, he escaped from California Men's Colony, San Luis Obispo, California, where he was incarcerated on local convictions regarding possession of marijuana. After his escape, Leary publicly stated the Weatherman underground helped him escape and flee the country. Leary departed the United States under false identification documents in the name of William John McNellis, which included a United States passport. After his escape and while in Algeria, Leary associated with Black Panther Party (BPP) representatives. During early 1973, Leary was recommitted to the California Men's Colony at San Luis Obispo, having been returned in custody from Afghanistan. He is incarcerated at the California State Prison at Vacaville.

A study of Leary's activities reveals he has knowledge of drug trafficking, BPP representatives and Weatherman underground organization. During late January, 1973, a Los Angeles source determined Leary may be interested in making a deal for his release from prison. This information was provided to the local District Attorney's Office, and FBI interview of Leary was held in abeyance.

It is apparent Leary realizes he has no alternative but to provide information to gain release from prison.

Leary recently agreed to cooperate with the Drug Enforcement Administration; FBI; Orange County, California, Narcotics Strike Force; and Office of California State Attorney General.

During interviews on May 25, 26, and 27, 1974, Leary advised his escape from California Men's Colony on September, 1970, was blueprinted and arranged by Michael Kennedy, Weatherman legal support, and Joseph Rhine, New Left attorney, both of San Francisco. Leary identified the following Weatherman who assisted him in his escape:

OBSERVATIONS:

Offices involved in escape route have been furnished pertinent information and requested to identify Irish-appearing young man who accompanied John Davis in effecting Leary's escape. These same offices were solicited for additional information developed which would assist Los Angeles Division in future interviews with Leary.

Los Angeles has determined that local authorities are interested in obtaining process for Weatherman who aided Leary in his escape and for the two attorneys. This could lead to Federal process (Unlawful Flight to Avoid Prosecution) as the majority of the individuals are underground. This information is being furnished to the Department.

Efforts are being made to locate Rosemary Leary, Leary's wife, to corroborate Leary's statements.

For information, DENIS LEE KELLY, DOB 4/14/42, has been identified by Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) as the individual who heads up one of the most unique LSD trafficking organizations in the world. KELLY's organization has developed the "window pane" technique for manufacturing LSD in which the LSD is painted onto large gelatinous squares subsequently reduced to 1/8"x1/8" "hits." KELLY's organization is believed to be the sole manufacturer of this type LSD which has been distributed nationwide as well as to five countries and four continents.

In the past the organization purchased over 200,000 packaging vials used to package 100 "hits" in each vial. This represents a potential production of over 20,000,000 dosage units or "hits" of LSD which sell anywhere from \$2 to \$8 on the street.

KELLY's organization disguises itself through the use of deceased infant false identities and front businesses. Its overt operations are conducted in San Francisco and its covert operations are conducted in Oregon. At present, the organization has a warehouse in Tualatin, Oregon, where its LSD manufacturing equipment is stored. They have purchased a farm in rural Cottage Grove, Oregon, for over \$50,000. The farm will be utilized for the manufacture of the LSD.

The organization is well represented by noted attorneys and is associated with many of the major rock groups in the country.

As can be expected, any organization of this type requires an enforcement and procurement arm. FBI investigation has determined that this phase of the organization is in violation of Federal law which in turn provides the elements for a RICO violation.

The organization is involved in the procurement and distribution of firearms and has all types of motor vehicles including boats and airplanes at its disposal for distribution.

The experience of this office has been that the Bureau has been requested for full field loyalty investigations on Government employees identified as having circulated petitions to place the Independent Progressive Party of California on the election ballot.

The petitions on file at the Alameda County Clerk's Office, Oakland, California, are maintained in numerical sequence rather than alphabetically. As a result, in the past it has been necessary for Agents whose loyalty investigations required that copies of various petitions be obtained, to spend several days chasing each individual petition in order to obtain the required information. Therefore, within the past week each petition circulator was listed, together with the circulator's address if shown, and the file number placed on the petition by the County Clerk's Office. In the future it will be necessary to obtain only the petition numbers circulated by a individual in order to locate the petitions he circulated.

Set out below in alphabetical sequence is the complete list of all petition circulators with addresses where available, and the file numbers of petitions circulated by them. All names have been indexed in the San Francisco Office for future reference.

It should be borne in mind that these petitions were signed by the circulators in their own handwriting, which in some cases was nearly illegible. Therefore, it was necessary for the Agents handling this project to list the name as it appeared to them, and the possibility of error exists in transcribing some of these names.

For information, DENIS LEE KELLY, DOB 4/14/42, has been identified by Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) as the individual who heads up one of the most unique LSD trafficking organizations in the world. KELLY's organization has developed the "window pane" technique for manufacturing LSD in which the LSD is painted onto large gelatinous squares subsequently reduced to 1/8"x1/8" "hits." KELLY's organization is believed to be the sole manufacturer of this type LSD which has been distributed nationwide as well as to five countries and four continents.

In the past the organization purchased over 200,000 packaging vials used to package 100 "hits" in each vial. This represents a potential production of over 20,000,000 dosage units or "hits" of LSD which sell anywhere from \$2 to \$8 on the street.

KELLY's organization disguises itself through the use of deceased infant false identities and front businesses. Its overt operations are conducted in San Francisco and its covert operations are conducted in Oregon. At present, the organization has a warehouse in Tualatin, Oregon, where its LSD manufacturing equipment is stored. They have purchased a farm in rural Cottage Grove, Oregon, for over \$50,000. The farm will be utilized for the manufacture of the LSD.

The organization is well represented by noted attorneys and is associated with many of the major rock groups in the country.

As can be expected, any organization of this type requires an enforcement and procurement arm. FBI investigation has determined that this phase of the organization is in violation of Federal law which in turn provides the elements for a RICO violation.

The organization is involved in the procurement and distribution of firearms and has all types of motor vehicles including boats and airplanes at its disposal for distribution.



The file has an estimated 30 pages, compiled as part of an internal security investigation conducted on April 18, 1947.

Both of these files require screening for categories of information exempted from disclosure under the terms of the FOIA, prior to public release. In particular, there are documents that may be redacted to protect the identities of confidential sources, including FBI informant codes and informant file numbers.

Requests for FBI case files that do not exceed 500 pages are assigned to our first-tier processing queue. Taking into consideration our existing backlog, the estimated time required to complete the processing of your request is approximately 18 months from the date of this letter.

FBI Case Files: 100-SF-78254-79P; 100-SF-25447-106-P13; 100-SF-28062-251P15, -904P1:

You requested access to FBI case file 100-SF-78254-79P which was identified by the FBI as potentially responsive to your request for files pertaining to Timothy Leary. My initial assessment confirms that the main subject of this case file is Denis Lee Kelly, however, the case file does reference Timothy Leary which is the subject of your request. The file was compiled as part of an internal security investigation conducted on November 26, 1975.

I have completed a line-by-line review of FBI case file 100-SF-78254-79P and released information to the greatest extent possible. Information exempted from disclosure in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act (5 USC 552) has been redacted. The redactions were applied to protect the identities of confidential sources per (b)(7)(D) and personal privacy (b)(6). A summary of the file, as released to you, is provided below:

- *FBI Case File: 100-SF-78254-79P; Subject: Denis Lee Kelly; Dates of Investigation: November 26, 1975; 6 total pages; 2 pages released in full and 4 released in redacted form.*

This concludes the processing of your request for case file 100-SF-78254-79P. I have enclosed a courtesy copy of the file. If you have any additional questions, please contact me directly by telephone or by e-mail provided to you above. If you would like to appeal any withholdings from either case files reviewed, please find the appeal instructions near the end of this letter.

In addition you requested FBI case files 100-SF-25447-106-P13 and 100-SF-28062-251P15, -904P1. We located both case files in our holdings. The main subject of FBI case file 100-SF-25447-106-P13 is the Communist Infiltration of the American Veteran Committee. However, serial 106-P13 references Timothy Leary which is the subject of your request. The entire serial consists of approximately 25 pages and it was compiled as part of an internal security investigation conducted on February 26, 1948.

The main subject of FBI case file 100-SF-28062-251P15, -904P1 is the Independent Progress Party. However, Serials 251 page 15 and 904 page 1 both reference Timothy Leary, which is the subject of your request. Serial 251 consists of approximately 27 pages and it was compiled as part of an internal security investigation conducted on February 24, 1948. Serial 904 consists of approximately 28 pages and it was compiled as part of an internal security investigation conducted on June 01, 1949.

As reviewed under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act (5 USC 552), there are no restrictions on access, and these pages from these serials are now open and available for research use. A courtesy copy of these specific pages are enclosed.

This completes the processing of your request for case files 100-SF-25447-106-P13 and 100-SF-28062-251P15, -904P1.

If you are not satisfied with our action on this request, you have the right to file an administrative appeal within ninety (90) calendar days from the date of this letter. Appeals must be in writing and may be delivered by regular U.S. mail or by e-mail. By filing an appeal, you preserve your rights under the FOIA and give the deciding agency a chance to review your request and reconsider its decision.
