EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

collaborate with a proposed Universities Committee to be created for the purpose of coordinating the work of similar committees throughout the country.

Since the last report, the Committee on Correspondence has maintained its connections with the Defense Groups and similar organizations in the New England colleges. Communications dealing with various subjects such as the availability of speakers for lectures, and lists of books on the background and course of the war, have been issued. Since June the area of correspondence has been spread beyond New England and embraces the entire country, the Committee now being in close contact with some 350 colleges and universities. Communications on post-war problems, India, the manpower problem, inflation, and relations with China have been sent out, and have met with generally favorable response. 


