EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;

SUBJECT: Request for Interview of Dr. Margaret
Singer, Berkeley, California

On May 18, 1977, representatives of the Criminal Division met with [redacted] a professor at the University of Washington; [redacted] Yale Divinity School; Dr. Margaret Singer, Berkeley, California and Representatives [redacted] and [redacted] to discuss allegations of brainwashing and mind control as they relate to religious sects. During the meeting, Dr. Margaret Singer advised that she had interviewed persons associated with religious sects that had information concerning the imposition of physical restraints on members and associates of certain religious sects. Because we were not able to obtain additional information from Dr. Singer during the meeting, it is requested that the Federal Bureau of Investigation interview her regarding this information for the purpose of obtaining the names and addresses of individuals who were physically restrained by religious sects or were present and observed such restraints being placed on others by religious sects. It is also suggested that Dr. Singer be requested to provide any information she may have concerning the interstate transportation of any persons who were physically restrained. For your information, Dr. Singer consented, at the meeting, to such an interview.


SF should expeditiously conduct this interview and furnish results via cover LHM and FD-302, to facilitate dissemination to the Department.

In a letter dated May 23, 1977, addressed to "The Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation", Mr. Benjamin R. Civiletti, Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, U. S. Department of Justice, advised as follows:

On May 18, 1977, representatives of the Criminal Division met with [redacted] a professor at the University of Washington; [redacted] Yale Divinity School; Dr. Margaret Singer, Berkeley, California, and representatives [redacted] and [redacted] to discuss allegations of brainwashing and mind control as they relate to religious sects. During the meeting, Dr. Margaret Singer advised that she had interviewed persons associated with religious sects that had information concerning the imposition of physical restraints on members and associates of certain religious sects. Because we were not able to obtain additional information from Dr. Singer during the meeting, it is requested that the Federal Bureau of Investigation interview her regarding this information for the purpose of obtaining the names and addresses of individuals who were physically restrained by religious sects, or were present and observed such restraints being placed on others by religious sects. It is also suggested that Dr. Singer be requested to provide any information she may have concerning the interstate transportation of any persons who were physically restrained. b7C

Dr. MARGARET THALER SINGER, 17 El Camino Real, Berkeley, Ca.
advised that she is a Professor of Psychology at the University of California at Berkeley (UCB), and the University of California at San Francisco (UCSF), and has been thus employed since 1958. Furthermore, Dr. SINGER advised that she obtained her Ph.D. degree in Psychology at the University of Denver in 1952.

Dr. SINGER further stated that she has been interested in "brainwashing" techniques and the effects of "brainwashing" since her service in the United States Army at the Walter Reed Army Hospital during the early DC 1950s, immediately following the Korean war. Dr. SINGER stated that she did a five-year "follow-up" study on the "brainwashed GIs" who had been prisoners of the Koreans during that war. Dr. SINGER stated that she has been studying the subject of "brainwashing" for over the past 25 years.

Dr. SINGER further stated that she has been interested in "brainwashing" by the so-called "religious sects" since approximately 1970. Since that time, according to Dr. SINGER, she has interviewed numerous persons who were members or had been members of such religious sects as the Unification Church, members who are commonly known as "Moonies", Hare Krishna and the Church of Scientology.

Dr. SINGER advised that during the course of her study on the religious sects, she has interviewed numerous persons who have told her of incidences wherein which persons were physically restrained or taken away to other parts of the country and even to Vancouver, British Columbia, against their will. However, Dr. SINGER advised that she did not record in her conversations with those persons which involved specific incidences of criminal activity such as kidnaping, fraud, theft, etc., because she was more interested in the "psychological and sociological coercion" techniques used by the various sects. However, Dr. SINGER stated that she would provide a list of persons who have firsthand knowledge concerning actual physical abduction, fraud or other

criminal activities perpetrated by members or leaders of various sects.

Furthermore, Dr. SINGER advised that the "Moonies" practice a program of "brainwashing" new members in a similar manner as practiced by the Koreans on the American prisoners of war during the Korean war. In other words, according to Dr. SINGER, the "Moonies" have practiced:

- 1) Sleep deprivation.
- 2) Low protein diet.
- 3) Isolation of new members from each other.
- 4) "Oral sharing" in which new members "confess their sins" before others in the sect.

For example, Dr. SINGER pointed out that if a young person is "invited for dinner" at the local "Moonie" house, which is located in Berkeley, California, at 2717 Hearst Street, he is requested to sign what appears to be a "guest registration card". However, according to Dr. SINGER, the "guest registration card" is actually folded in half to conceal words to the effect that the young person is "voluntarily joining" the Unification Church. This card bearing the young person's signature is, according to Dr. SINGER, then shown to inquiring friends and relatives to prove that the young person has "voluntarily joined" the Unification Church.

Furthermore, according to Dr. SINGER, during the dinner the young person is subjected to the "peanut-butter-jelly position" in which new members are separated from each other at the dinner table during conversations by the older members. Then, according to Dr. SINGER, the young person is taken to the "Moonie" ranch which is located in Booneville, California, an isolated area in Northern California. Dr. SINGER advised that during the ride to Booneville, the young person is kept awake by continued chanting (sleep deprivation). When the young person, according to Dr. SINGER, finally arrives at the "Moonie" ranch, he is placed on a low protein diet and isolated from other new members by the older members of the sect. According to Dr. SINGER, the new members are encouraged to join in "oral sharing", which is in effect, according to Dr. SINGER, "confessing their sins" in front of the other members of the sect.

Furthermore, Dr. SINGER advised that in one of her interviews a former "Moonie" told her that at the Booneville ranch there was a "on and off" switch located in the office to the pay telephone located at the ranch. Dr. SINGER advised that during this interview the former "Moonie" told her that if a new member wanted to make a telephone call to his parents or friends he would have free access to the pay telephone; however, when he placed his money into the pay telephone, the telephone was "switched off" in the office, resulting in a "dead line".

As mentioned previously, Dr. SINGER stated that she has interviewed numerous persons against whom crimes such as kidnaping, fraud and theft were committed; however, she did not record the specific instances or circumstances of those crimes. However, Dr. SINGER furnished the following list of persons who she stated could provide first-hand knowledge, including specific individuals, incidences and circumstances in which criminal activity occurred:

In conclusion, Dr. SINGER advised that she would be more alert in the future when conducting her interviews of members or former members of religious sects in that she would obtain specific incidences such as the date, time, place and circumstances of alleged criminal activities by these sects.

SUBJECT: Allegations of "Brainwashing" by
Various Religious Sects

Reference is made to FBI memorandum dated June 27, 1977, at San Francisco and captioned Dr. Margaret Singer; Religious Sect Brainwashing-Kidnaping Matters.

As you know, the Department has received numerous inquiries from Congress and from citizens, expressing concern that members of certain religious sects are the victims of "brainwashing," "mind control" or "mental kidnaping" by leaders of these groups. Consideration has been given to the possibility that the imposition of mental restraints upon the freedom or movement of religious sect members might constitute a violation of the Federal kidnaping statute. However, we have concluded that a prosecution under the Federal kidnaping statute could not be sustained based on evidence that an adult of normal intelligence had been "brainwashed" by a religious sect and subsequently transported across state lines.

It has been our experience, based on FBI interviews of former sect members and parents of sect members, that members are not and have not been restrained from leaving the sect if they choose to do so. In a meeting on May 18, 1977, with representatives of the Criminal Division, Dr. Singer said she could furnish the names of individuals who were physically restrained by religious sects, or who were present and observed such restraints being placed on others. In her interview of June 23, 1977, Dr. Singer furnished the names of 18 individuals who may have such information.

As time passed, [redacted] advised that their critical thinking processes were diminished and a person really did not think of "escaping" the Church. If an individual indicated he had a desire to leave, no physical restraints were placed upon them, however, the person was interviewed on a one-to-one basis by a member of the Church and usually following this interview, the person would agree to stay on a day or two longer, which normally would extend to months.

He said this occurred on a fairly frequent basis and served to keep people in line who were wavering in their commitment to the church. [redacted] stated at Barrytown, New York, all of the church members had to attend two workshops a week, one on Saturday, Sunday and Monday, and the other on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. He said he was mostly involved in the Saturday, Sunday and Monday workshops when the abovedescribed tactic mostly occurred. He said his responsibility during these workshops was to see the church members remained loyal to the church regardless of the tactics used to keep them in line.

He said it was possible for a determined, angry recruit to walk out, but he would be left stranded in an unfamiliar place with no street signs or friendly people nearby or any ready means of being transported back to the city. He advised anyone who wanted to leave would have to request to be transported home but they would discourage such a person from seeking to be taken home. He said he and others would tell such a person that the driver who brought them up was not available and they should wait until the program was over. He said this was especially effective on women who were reluctant to leave and be stranded in a strange locality.

[] further advised during the summer of 1973 he was advised by a [] whom he described as a fanatical "Kamikaze" follower of Reverend MOON and who at the time [] about strong arm tactics being used to recruit members. He said [] would have church members go to various locations in New York City where young recruits could be found, such as the public library at Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street. They would contact likely prospects, engage them in conversation and then at a given time would put their arms around their shoulders and usher them into a waiting van where they would be driven to the Unification Church center at East 73rd Street and Madison Avenue. There the recruits would be talked to continuously and ushered into a lecture hall for more indoctrination. If a recruit tried to leave, one of the indoctrinators would put his arm on him and talk him back into sitting down. He said over 200 people were recruited into the church during this summer, using these tactics. He said prior to this the church was having a hard time getting recruits to attend the workshops in Barrytown, but during this period [] bragged to him that he recruited 80 to 120 persons in one week, using these tactics. He advised he knows of no one who complained about being victimized through these tactics.

[] stated as far as physical restraints being used in the Unification Church, it is hard to draw the line because of the tremendous psychological and social pressure placed on recruits to keep them in the church. He advised the Federal Government should be made aware of these tactics.

[] stated when a recruit is brought into the Unification Church, he is transported to some out of the way place, such as Barrytown. Once there, the recruit is effectively isolated from his family, friends and familiar surroundings. He said recruits are not allowed to make telephone calls. He said the emotional pressure is intense and recruits are subjected to indoctrination that is so sincere and uplifting that it appeals to their sense of justice and feelings about God and they are disarmed by it. He said they are put on a strict schedule which allows them no time alone, they are always in a group and are accompanied by a church member even when they go to the bathroom. He said a recruit is given no time to reflect on what is happening to him and all his time is spent in participating in the church's program. He said they are fed food low in protein. He said recruits are encouraged to sleep only two to three hours a night and are not permitted to sleep more than four to five hours a night. He said the result is the recruits are kept in a sluggish state and submitted to pressure of constant indoctrination so their resistance is broken down. He said only one viewpoint is allowed, that of the Unification Church teachings; no discussion or varying from the church doctrine is tolerated. He said strict obedience is demanded or the recruit is subjected to severe humiliation. The indoctrinators identify God with the church and if a recruit disagrees with anything, he is MADE to feel he is going against God and he is sinful and he is opening himself to Satanic attack.

[] said a recruit is brainwashed by such tactics which keep him away from friends and associates. Poor food, sleep deprivation, constant praise or censure and tremendous peer pressure are used to break down his resistance. He said he and some other leaders were instructed to weed out those people who were not docile and who insisted on independent thought and action. On 9-20-77 [redacted] telephonically contacted and advised he was happy to learn of FBI's interest in captioned matter and supported it thoroughly. [redacted] advised that he felt he had a wealth of information to furnish the FBI but had some reservations regarding possible recrimination from religious sects if he was not granted complete confidentiality. [redacted] advised that "religious" sects had no need to physically restrain its members since they were so successful in brainwashing and hypnotic techniques that the restraint was more of a psychological nature. b7C

[redacted] advised that the religious sects, particularly the Unification Church had amassed unbelievable sums of money and reportedly had been quite generous to some ACLU attorneys. 

When asked if she had been physically restrained from doing anything of her own free will while a member of this Church, [redacted] advised that she decided to leave the Church after being a member for approximately three years. At that time, she lived at [redacted]

[redacted] a house belonging to the Unification Church.

[redacted] stated that when she made her intention to leave known to others in the house, her immediate superior, [redacted]

[redacted] physically restrained and abused her by holding her arms and shaking her violently for a few minutes. [redacted]

additionally hit [redacted] a few times with his hand, stating that she was possessed by the Devil for having such thoughts.

[redacted] additionally told her that, because of this possession, she would commit suicide if she left the Church because of depression which would come to her. [redacted] stated that

[redacted] told her many other things, all of which combined with the physical restraints placed on her, intimidated her into not leaving the Church. [redacted] further stated, that true to Unification Church procedure, [redacted] had assumed a position much like a father to her, in that to hit him back or to further counter his physical restraints would have been unthinkable.

When asked if she had seen anyone else physically restrained while a member of the Church, she recalled that in February, 1977, a registered nurse, name not recalled, from North Carolina, had a "schizophrenic breakdown" approximately two weeks after joining the Church. She stated this nurse was acting as if she was several people at one time, spoke through several voices consistantly, and would then

'switch back into a coherent state of mind. [] stated that she met this girl at the Unification Church farm at Booneville, California, on a Monday morning. When [] arrived at the farm on Monday morning, this nurse had been locked in a barn on the farm at the direction of [] [] was told by [] to guard the door of the room in the barn where she was locked up, insuring that she did not leave. Later that day [] told [] to take the nurse to Highland Hospital in Northern California and drop her off outside the hospital doors. [] advised that she was unable to do this and that she transported the nurse to the Highland Hospital and took her and checked her into the hospital. She then stayed with the nurse for several hours while hospital staff began treatment. [] had no idea what the outcome of this individual's case was. She noted, however, that this person had been locked in the room in the barn all the previous weekend prior to [] arrival at the Booneville farm.

SUBJECT: Religious Sects Allegations
of Unlawful Confinement

Reference is made to FBI memorandum dated September 28, 1977, at San Francisco and captioned Dr. Margaret Singer - Religious Sect Brainwashing.

We have reviewed the interview of [redacted] concerning her experiences with the Unification Church. The allegations of physical restraint described by [redacted] are not of an aggravated nature and do not indicate a violation of Federal law. Accordingly, interviews of the individuals mentioned in the [redacted] interview should not be conducted.

In the future, we can expect additional allegations of misconduct on the part of religious sects. As you know, the Department of Justice cannot conduct a general inquiry into the activities of a religious group. Any investigation must be based on an allegation of a violation of Federal law.

In responding to allegations of physical restraints being imposed on sect members, the Department must balance the interests of the religious group in the free exercise of their religion against the right of the sect member not to be confined against his will.

Any unlawful confinement of a sect member accomplished by threats, force, violence, or other aggravating circumstances would be a prosecutable violation of the Federal kidnaping statute, assuming the jurisdictional

element of interstate travel is present. However, where the confinement is accomplished primarily by zealous, aggressive proselytizing, a Federal investigation would not be warranted.

It is requested that the FBI continue to furnish the Criminal Division with reports of interviews of citizens alleging wrongdoing by religious sects.

agent and provided the following information:

[redacted] advised that he was associated with the Unification Church after being recruited approximately one year ago in the Los Angeles area. [redacted] advised that he was living in Los Angeles and was in somewhat of an estranged situation in that he was not living with his parents nor did he have any close personal friends at the time. He advised that he was walking down a street in Los Angeles in the Westwood area when he contacted a representative of the Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP). These individuals contacted him in the street and after a brief conversation in regards to religion, he was asked to go to dinner with them. He went to a dinner and a series of lectures that followed the dinner and was subsequently transported to a mountain retreat in the San Bernardino Hills for further indoctrination into the what he had then learned was the Unification Church. [redacted] advised that he received many, many hours of religious instruction and ended up staying well past a weekend, more into eight or nine days, at the retreat. He then went back to the Westwood area of Los Angeles with other individuals from the Unification Church and began collecting donations from people they would contact in the street in shopping centers and in any other public areas. [redacted] advised that he would collect somewhere between fifty and a hundred dollars per day in donations for the church. A portion of the money went for the physical support of the individuals living in Westwood and the remainder was forwarded to higher officials in the Unification Church and he is unaware as to the final destination of the money, although he believes it went to North Korea to the Reverend MOON. [redacted] advised that after being in the Church he was receiving a tremendous amount of pressure from his parents to leave the Church and on one weekend visiting his parents in San Leandro, a former member of the Church. [redacted] was there at his parents' residence and after spending three to four

days in conversations with his parents and [redacted]
[redacted] finally realized that he had been used by the
Unification Church and that many of the things that he had
been told by them were untrue. At this point [redacted]
dropped out of the Church and is no longer associated
with its members. [redacted] advised that he did not
witness any incidents of individuals being physically
restrained from leaving the Unification Church, from
leaving the retreat or from leaving any residences where
they stayed. However, [redacted] advised that he is
firmly convinced that not only he, himself, but that most
individuals associated with the Unification Church were
"brainwashed" and therefore were not associated with the
Church on a voluntary basis. [redacted] felt that once
an individual had been indoctrinated into the Church
itself that it would be very difficult for a person on his
own to drop out, but that it requires "deprogramming" by
another member or in a situation away from members of the
Church in order to allow an individual to think clearly
enough to drop out.
