EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;

Reference is made to report of SA RICHARD B. LAVIN dated 2/25/54 at Washington, D. C., in a matter entitled ISADORE MIRIN, was., SECURITY MATTER - C. That report on page 2 sets forth information concerning MINNA and SOLOMON KULLBACH, 1259 Van Buren Street, N. W. MINNA KULLBACH is the sister of ISADORE MIRIN, the subject of referenced report.

Also included in referenced report is information concerning SIMON MIRIN and ANNIE MIRIN, brother and mother of MINNA KULLBACH, respectively, to the effect that they and ISADORE MIRIN have been considered sympathetic to the Communist Party. ISADORE MIRIN as set forth in referenced report has served in the Abraham Lincoln Brigade during the Spanish Civil War.

This office in attempting to trace down information concerning the present employment of SOLOMON KULLBACH ascertained from [redacted] Civilian Personnel, Office of Signal Officer, Department of Army, that KULLBACH is presently assigned to Division of Research and Development, Department of Defense, 3801 Nebraska Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C.

It is to be noted in this regard that the Division of Research and Development, located at 3801 Nebraska Avenue, N. W., is a highly security conscious area and it is difficult to ascertain any information concerning their employees without disclosing the exact nature of the inquiry. It is not known by this office exactly what position KULLBACH holds in the Division of Research and Development beyond the fact that he is employed there.

The files of another Government agency reflect that Isadore Mirin and his mother, Annie, were considered to be Communists by several persons in NYC. In addition, a person of the same name and address as that of Isadore Mirin signed two CPNPs in 1940, and a person apparently identical with his sister, Betty B. Mirin, of the same address, also signed a CPNP in that year. Also, reflet states that HCUA files reflect that one Annie Mirin is listed as a voter for the CP in the 1936 general elections in NYC.

In addition, Isadore Mirin reportedly signed two Communist Party Nominating petitions in New York City in 1940, and Betty B. Mirin, identified as his sister, also signed a similar petition that year. Employee's wife, Winna Mirin Kullbach, is reported to be the sister of Isadore Mirin.





RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION:

EMPLOYMENT

The 1937-38 Honolulu City Directory reflects that SOLOMON KULLBACK resided at 2237 Aloha Drive and was employed as an Assistant cryptanalyst in the Signal Office of the U.S. Army. A search of subsequent city directories failed to list the name of SOLOMON KULLBACK.

Miss HELEN NOBRIGA, Clerk in the Civilian Personnel Office, USARPAC, Fort Shafter, advised that her records contained no reference to SOLOMON KULLBACK. She advised that many of the older records have been destroyed on past employees inasmuch as all pertinent records were being forwarded to the mainland.

Mr. C. C. HURLBURT, Supervisor in the Communications Center, USARPAC, Fort Shafter, advised that he has been employed in this position since approximately 1940 with the Army Signal Corps and that the employee's name is unknown to him. Mr. HURLBURT advised that he is the oldest employee in years of service in this section and therefore he could suggest no one else who might recall the employee. Mr. HURLBURT did advise that if the employee was employed as a Cryptanalyst in the Signal Corps he would have worked in the Communications Center.

NEIGHBORHOOD

It has been ascertained in previous investigations of this type that the residences on Aloha Drive, which is located in the Waikiki District, are for the most part used by transient persons and therefore it is difficult to locate anyone who might recall any individual residing in that neighborhood several years ago.

AGENCY CHECKS

The files of the Honolulu Police Department and Credit Bureau of Hawaii contained no information identifiable to the employee.

The files of Confidential Informants Honolulu T-1 and T-2, other government agencies conducting security-type investigations, contained no information identifiable to the employee.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

These records reflect that NATHAN KULLBACK was described as Age 27, born in Russia and occupation was listed as Cutter. IDA GLASSER was described as Age 21 and born in Russia. These latter two individuals were described as being the parents of one child and residing at that time at 430 New Jersey Avenue, Brooklyn, New York.

entered City College of New York in the Evening Session in February, 1924 as a non-matriculated student where he attended until August, 1924, when he became matriculated and was allowed to enter Day Session in the School of Science on September 15, 1924.

Mr. UTSINGER advised that the records disclosed that the employee was above average as a student and his record with the college was clear.

Dean JAMES S. PEACE, Associate Dean of Students, advised that records of student activity prior to 1945 are vague and incomplete. Dean PEACE advised after checking the records available that he could locate no record of any questionable activity on the part of the employee nor was there any record of any disciplinary action ever having been taken against him. Dean PEACE advised that Professor BENNINGTON GILL, Professor of Mathematics, OSCAR BUCKVAR, Professor of Government, FREDERICK KUHLIN, Professor of Mechanical Engineering, and CHARLES CORCORAN, Professor of Physics, were the oldest professors at the college in point of service.

All of the above named professors were contacted and advised that they had been at City College of New York from 1924 to 1927, but they stated that due to the lapse of time and the large student enrollment, they could not recall the employee nor could they suggest the names of any one who might recall him.

Miss CURRY advised that the employee's record with the college was clear and there was no indication that any disciplinary action had ever been taken against him. Miss CURRY further advised that due to the lapse of time she would be unable to advise the name of any one currently at the college who might recall the employee.

On this application, SOLOMON KULLBACK listed his date of birth as April 3, 1907 at Brooklyn, New York and his permanent residence at that time as 5311 Eighth Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C. and his present position as a junior cryptanalyst with the Signal Corps.

This application further reflected that the employee had attended Boys High School, Brooklyn, New York from February, 1920 until January, 1924; City College of New York from February, 1924 until June, 1927; Columbia University, 1929; and George

Washington University in 1934.

A Medical Examination Form, which was made a part of this application, dated December 7, 1935, listed his mother's age as fifty, his father's age as fifty-five, one brother, Age 22, and one sister, Age 25.

An Employment Rating Form signed by the principal of Boys High School, Brooklyn, New York, bearing date April 15, 1929, advised the Board of Examiners of the New York City Board of Education that the employee had taught high school mathematics at the above school from September 9, 1927 until January 31, 1929 as a substitute teacher. On this form, the employee was described as a "serious minded and conscientious teacher who did not spare himself." According to this form, the employee's record at Boys High School was clear and he was recommended for a teaching position.

A similar form dated June 28, 1929 from the Chairman of the Mathematics Department, Jamaica High School, Jamaica, Long Island, advised the Board of Examiners that the employee had served in Jamaica High School from February 4, 1929 until June 28, 1930 and an additional form bearing date September 9, 1935, advised that the employee had subsequently taught at the above high school from October 2, 1929 until February 1, 1930. On this form, the employee was recommended favorably for a teaching position, although it was noted that while at Jamaica High School, he had been unable or unwilling to maintain discipline in his classroom.

A similar form from the principal of Public School 90, 2279 Church Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, dated September 9, 1935, advised that the employee had taught at the above public school for two months and twenty-five days in the school year of 1930.

These records also reflect that the employee had taught for approximately a month or two at the Franklin K. Lane High School, New York, New York, during the period from 1927 to 1930. This record failed to disclose that the reporting officer had made any definite comments concerning the employee due to the limited term of his employment.

A Medical Examination Report dated June 28, 1927 and contained in these records reflected that the employee's address at that time was 500 New Jersey Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. On an application for a teacher's license dated September 12, 1928, the employee listed a new address of 255 East 25th Street, Brooklyn, New York. These records also contained names of various individuals listed by the employee as references. One such name was Mr. D. AYMAN, 1597 Lincoln Place, Brooklyn, New York, which name was contained on the application for a teacher's license dated March 13, 1935.

These records further reflected that the employee had tendered his resignation from the New York City School System on April 16, 1930 while teaching at Public School 90 to take effect on April 28, 1930.

In regard to the application for license dated in 1935, it was noted that the license was refused because of an unsatisfactory interview test.

These records failed to reflect any unfavorable information concerning the employee and failed to reflect any unfavorable information concerning any of the teaching positions held by the employee during the period covered by these records.

In regard to [redacted] who was listed as a reference by the employee in 1935, it is noted that during the course of another investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation in 1953, the files of New York City T-1, another Governmental Agency which conducts security and intelligence investigations, reflected that one [redacted] who resided

The files of New York City T-1 further reflect that it was reported to T-1 that [REDACTED]

New York, New York. According to New York City T-1, this latter fact indicated that AYMAN was either a former student or an instructor at this institution.

In regard to the Teachers Union, it is noted that the Rapp-Coudert Committee, a New York State Legislative Committee investigating subversive activities in New York schools in 1942, declared the Teachers Union to be a Communist dominated organization which has consistently followed the Communist Party line.

In regard to the School for Democracy, mentioned above, the report of the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, dated March 29, 1944, on page 150, contains the following citation:

"At the beginning of the present year, the old Communist Party Workers School and the School for Democracy were merged into the Jefferson School of Social Science."

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

She advised after contacting each of these individuals that none of them had anything but a vague recollection of the employee and she stated that they had advised they would be unable to offer any positive comments concerning him.

IRVING COOPERMAN, 524 New Jersey Avenue advised he has been residing at that address for forty-five years and stated that he had no recollection of the employee or his family ever having resided in that vicinity.

Mr. ABRAHAM GOLDREYER, 498 New Jersey Avenue, advised he has resided in the neighborhood for approximately forty-five years and stated he recalled that the KULLBACK family, whom he thought consisted of the parents, two sons, and a daughter, resided at 500 New Jersey Avenue for a period he estimated at about eight or nine years. He stated he could recall none of their names and stated they left the neighborhood about twenty or twenty-two years ago and he has not seen them since. Mr. GOLDREYER stated that he was unable to furnish any other information concerning the family except that he recalled them as being very good neighbors and "fine people" who were well liked in the neighborhood.

255 East 25th Street

Mrs. W. R. PRICE, Superintendent, advised that she has been residing at that address only since 1953 and consequently she would have no information concerning the KULLBACK family. She advised that Mr. ERNEST STRUWE, Apartment 1-D, was the oldest tenant in the building.

Mr. ERNEST STRUWE advised that he has been residing at that address for twenty-four years and was the former superintendent when he first came to that residence. He stated that he vaguely recalled the KULLBACK family as having resided in Apartment 1-A for a period of approximately six months after he came there as superintendent. He stated that if his memory was correct, he came there in July, 1930 and that the KULLBACK family had left in approximately January, 1931. He stated that

as he recalled, in the KULLBACK family there had been the mother and father, and about three other family members residing there, including one young man in his early twenties. Mr. STRUWE stated that beyond these facts, he could furnish no further information.

MISCELLANEOUS

The following information concerns ANNIE MIRIN and her son, ISIDORE MIRIN, who are the mother and brother, respectively, of the employee's wife, MINNA MIRIN KULLBACK:

The files of New York City T-1, mentioned previously, as checked during the course of previous investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reflected that in 1944, ISIDORE MIRIN was residing at 994 East 172nd Street, Bronx, New York and ANNIE MIRIN was residing at 1010 Longfellow Avenue, Bronx, New York.

New York City T-4, of unknown reliability, who stated he had known ISIDORE MIRIN for approximately twenty years, advised New York City T-1 in 1934 that ANNIE MIRIN was Communistically inclined and ISIDORE MIRIN talked along Communist lines. He further advised that ISIDORE MIRIN had served with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade in Spain in 1937.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

New York City T-4 further stated to T-1 that notwithstanding the above information, he had never had any doubts of ISIDORE MIRIN'S loyalty to the United States and explained that he felt that ISIDORE had joined the Abraham Lincoln Brigade at the age of twenty or twenty-one for no ulterior motive but simply out of a desire for excitement and adventure. He further stated that in regard to ISIDORE MIRIN'S conversation, which he had described as being along Communist lines, he stated that it was his feeling that ISIDORE was simply repeating what had been said in his household by his mother.

New York City T-4 was recontacted during this investigation and advised that he has maintained contact with the above members of the MIRIN family since they left New York in about 1944.

He stated that both are now residing in Washington, D.C. and that ISIDORE is engaged in a dry cleaning business in that area. He stated further that he is well acquainted with the employee and his wife. He stated that the employee and his wife also live in Washington, D.C. in close proximity to the mentioned members of the MIRIN family and that there is a close degree of association between them because of that close proximity.

New York City T-4 advised on this occasion that ANNIE MIRIN is now given to lapses of memory and general senility due to advanced old age and he stated that because of that fact, he would not consider her dangerous to the security of the country in any respect.

He stated further that in regard to ISIDORE MIRIN, whatever doubts may have entered his mind at one time in regard to this individual's loyalty, are now dispelled and he stated that he felt with renewed assurance that Mr. MIRIN'S previous activity had been more the result of his great love for an active and adventurous life, than out of any feeling of disloyalty.

He stated further that he felt that ISIDORE MIRIN was now a "thoroughly converted" individual and a loyal citizen.

In regard to the employee, New York City T-4 stated that he had known him for approximately twenty-five years and stated that he would swear that he was as loyal an American citizen as he could be. He stated in this regard that the employee was

one of the most security conscious individuals he had ever met and by way of illustration, stated that in the quarter century he has known him, he has never known what his job actually is with the Government. He stated that the employee refuses to discuss his work with any one including his wife. New York City T-4 stated that he would unhesitatingly recommend the employee for any position of trust and confidence.

Files of New York City T-1 further reflect that New York City T-5, of unknown reliability, but who advised T-1 in 1944 that she had known the MIRIN family for a number of years and knew ANNIE MIRIN very well. On this occasion, according to the files of New York City T-1, this informant expressed no doubt of the loyalty of ANNIE or ISIDORE MIRIN. It was noted, however, that the files of New York City T-1 reflected that on a previous occasion, New York City T-5 was quoted as saying that she believed ANNIE and ISIDORE MIRIN were Communists.

New York City T-5 was recontacted during this investigation and advised that she had known ANNIE and ISIDORE MIRIN quite well prior to their leaving New York City in approximately 1944. She stated since that time she has largely lost contact with the family. She stated that she had no doubts concerning the loyalty of ANNIE or ISIDORE MIRIN at the present time. She further advised that she recalled that she had met the employee and his wife on approximately two occasions during the early 1940's when they came to visit ANNIE MIRIN in New York City. She stated that the employee had appeared to be a very nice individual and she stated she had never heard anything unfavorable concerning him but she stated due to her limited acquaintance with him, she would decline to furnish any positive comments in regard to his loyalty.

File of New York City T-1 further reflect that New York City T-6, of unknown reliability, advised that he had been acquainted with the MIRIN family while they resided in New York City and he described ANNIE MIRIN as a "red hot Communist."

An attempt was made to recontact New York City T-6 during this investigation and during this attempt, it was learned that this informant had died years ago in Florida.

The employee's personnel file was reviewed during the course of this investigation and it reflected that he listed Brooklyn, New York, as his legal address.

Records of the New York City Board of Elections, Borough of Brooklyn, were checked for the addresses at 500 New Jersey Avenue and 255 East 25th Street, Brooklyn, New York, for the years 1933 to 1940 in an attempt to ascertain whether or not the employee considered either of these addresses to be his present legal address. These records failed to reflect any registration on the part of the employee for the period named.

Records of the New York City Board of Elections, Borough of the Bronx, were checked and reflected the following information concerning individuals bearing the surname MIRIN at the following listed addresses:

"1. For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party, but outside of New York City, they have been unable to win control. (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, Page 78.)

"2. Among organizations that are victims of Communist domination. (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, Pages 40 and 41.)"

The records of the New York City Board of Elections, Borough of Bronx, failed to reflect any registration for any of these named individuals subsequent to the year 1946.

It is noted that the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, reflect that one ISIDORE MIRIN, 994 East 172nd Street, Bronx, New York, signed a Communist Party Nominating Petition for Candidates BROWDER and FORD in the 1940 General Elections. The files of New York City T-1, mentioned previously, also reflect that one ISIDORE MIRIN, 994 East 172nd Street, Bronx, New York, signed a Communist Party Nominating Petition on Page 841 for Candidates HIMOFF and RAPPAPORT on September 21, 1940 in Bronx County New York.

The files of New York City T-7, another Governmental Agency which conducts personnel investigations, reflects that one BETTY MIRIN, 994 East 172nd Street, Bronx, New York, signed a Communist Party Nominating Petition for Candidates HIMOFF and RAPPAPORT on August 7, 1940 in Bronx County, New York.

A representative of the Bureau of Special Services and Investigation and of the Bureau of Criminal Identification of the New York City Police Department, advised that the files




II. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

This investigation is based upon information contained in the files of Washington Confidential Informant T-1, another government agency conducting personnel and security type investigations, to the effect that the employee's mother-in-law, ANNIE MIRIN, and brother-in-law, ISADORE MIRIN, were considered to be Communists by several persons in New York City. Information concerning ANNIE MIRIN and ISADORE MIRIN is being set out by the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

LEONARD J. SEIDENGLANZ, Army Security Agency, advised that he came to the Signal Intelligence Service of the Signal Corps in May, 1941 to a section which KULLBACK headed. He stated that he worked closely with KULLBACK under his supervision until about November, 1944. He stated that this was a very small outfit at the time and that every one was well acquainted with the other workers. He advised that he formerly played softball and bowled with the employee and said that their families were socially acquainted. SEIDENGLANZ advised that he has not had any professional contact with KULLBACK for many years and has had no social contact with him in approximately five years.

SEIDENGLANZ stated that in his business relations with the employee, he has always found KULLBACK to be completely fair and advised that he knows of nothing which would reflect adversely upon KULLBACK's character or loyalty to the United States. He advised that he does not know of any one who ever worked for KULLBACK who would not state that the employee was among the very ablest and fairest men.

SEIDENGLANZ advised that KULLBACK probably contributed as much to the war effort in World War II as any single man in the Agency and stated that he believes the employee to be a completely loyal citizen who would go all out for the United States against any country.

SEIDENGLANZ stated that he recalls meeting the employee's mother-in-law at KULLBACK's home on two or three occasions. He stated that the employee's mother-in-law, who spoke but very little English, often visited KULLBACK and his wife and always appeared to him to be a friendly and nice woman.

GEORGE CHAPARAS, owner and resident, 4800-3rd Street, N.W., advised that he has owned this building since 1947. He advised that there is no one presently residing in this four-apartment dwelling who was residing there prior to 1947. CHAPARAS stated that he is not acquainted with the employee and could furnish no information concerning him.

Mrs. ANNE W. SCHWARTZ, 6614-13th Place, N.W., advised that she has been residing at this residence since February, 1941 and stated that at that time the KULLBACKs had recently bought their home around the corner. She stated that she did not reside here from 1942 to 1946. Mrs. SCHWARTZ advised that she has had very little social contact with the employee but has been more friendly with his wife inasmuch as she played cards with the employee's wife with a group of women. She stated that the employee is a very quiet type individual while Mrs. KULLBACK is quite jovial and the more active one. She stated the employee appears to be a very nice individual of good habits and advised that she has never heard or observed anything which would reflect adversely upon his loyalty. Mrs. SCHWARTZ stated that the employee's son and daughter presently attend school here in Washington, D.C., and that she believes his parents presently reside in Florida.

Mrs. SCHWARTZ advised that Mrs. KULLBACK's mother, ANNIE MIRIN, and her son and daughter-in-law presently live in Washington, D.C., and that her other son lives in Maryland. She stated that the employee's two brothers-in-law are partners in a dry cleaning business. She stated that years ago the employee's in-laws were frequent visitors with the KULLBACKs. She advised that after she returned to this neighborhood in 1946, she recalls that the employee's mother-in-law and her two sons had roomed in the near-by vicinity of KULLBACK's home and that they would eat with the KULLBACKs frequently. She stated that she has not seen the employee's brothers-in-law in a long time and only sees his mother-in-law infrequently. She stated that she has never discussed politics with ANNIE MIRIN and has no cause to question her loyalty.

Mrs. SCHWARTZ stated that the employee teaches one or two nights a week and goes bowling once a week. She advised that she does not know who his social associates are and stated that she believes that the KULLBACKs play bridge with a group but stated she does not know who makes up this group.

Mrs. PAULINE SCHWARTZ, 1251 Van Buren Street, N.W., advised that she has been acquainted with the KULLBACKs since the summer of 1941. She advised that at this time the homes on Van Buren Street were just being built and she met the KULLBACKs on weekends when they used to go up to the

building sites to see how construction was coming along. She stated that she could not possibly think of anything which would reflect adversely on the employee's character, reputation, or loyalty, and stated that from her contacts with him he had always appeared to be a loyal citizen of good character. She stated that she believes KULLBACK has a very responsible position with the Signal Corps and advised that she is not acquainted with any of his social associates.

Mrs. T. J. Adams

Mrs. SCHWARTZ advised that she has met KULLBACK's parents who are now retired and living in Florida, and stated that she believes that he has a cousin who lives in D.C. and works with him in the Signal Corps. Mrs. SCHWARTZ advised that the employee's wife's mother and two younger brothers presently reside in the Washington, D.C. area and that the brothers run a dry cleaning establishment in Silver Spring, Maryland. She stated that one of the brothers, "SI", presently lives in Silver Spring and the other brother, "BILL", now lives with his mother, the employee's mother-in-law, after recently separating from his wife, BETTY. She advised that the employee's mother-in-law and "BILL" live on upper 9th Street, N.W. She advised that she believes that "SI" and "BILL" were in military service during World War II and settled in Washington approximately six years ago. She stated that when "BILL" and "SI" were in service the employee's mother-in-law came to Washington, D.C. and stayed with the KULLBACKs for awhile. She stated that after the sons were discharged the employee's mother-in-law and her sons returned to New York where "SI" finished college and "BILL" drove a taxi. Mrs. SCHWARTZ stated that the employee's mother-in-law and her sons then returned to Washington and stayed with the KULLBACKs for a brief period while looking for a place to live. She advised that KULLBACK's in-laws are very infrequent visitors now and stated that she has not seen them in a long while. She advised that she has never had any conversations concerning politics with the employee's mother-in-law or her sons.

Mrs. MAUREEN DONOHUE, 1255 Van Buren Street, N.W., advised that she has been acquainted with the employee and his family as next-door neighbors for the past 13 years. She stated that she has known Mrs. KULLBACK through the usual neighbor-neighbor contact and has known KULLBACK to a lesser extent. She advised that she is not socially acquainted with the employee or his wife. Mrs. DONOHUE advised that she knows of nothing which would reflect adversely upon the employee's character, reputation, or loyalty.

Mrs. DONOHUE stated that the employee's wife's mother lives only a short distance away from their home on Van Buren Street but is not a frequent visitor to the KULLBACKs. She advised that she has only seen the mother-in-law once in the last year and a half. She stated that the employee has two brothers-in-law, one named "SI", who run a cleaning establishment and who are infrequent visitors to the KULLBACK home also. Mrs. DONOHUE advised that approximately four and a half years ago she moved from this neighborhood and has only been back at this address approximately a year and a half. She stated that KULLBACK's mother-in-law and brothers-in-law are not as frequent visitors as they were prior to 1949. She stated that prior to 1949 they were regular visitors to the KULLBACKs and may have lived with the KULLBACKs for a while. She stated that she can recall this clearly inasmuch as the brothers-in-laws' cleaning truck was constantly parked in front of their house and caused them a lot of parking trouble. Mrs. DONOHUE stated that she was not acquainted with the employee's mother-in-law or brothers-in-law sufficiently to comment concerning their character and loyalty.

Mrs. FLORA COHEN, 6611-13th Street, N.W., advised that she has been acquainted with the employee as a near-by neighbor since the houses were built approximately 13 years ago. She stated that she often plays cards with Mrs. KULLBACK and knows her fairly well, although she is not acquainted with the employee except for the usual neighbor-neighbor contact. She advised that the employee appears to be a man of good character and stated that she has never been given any reason to question his loyalty to the United States. She stated that she does not know anything concerning KULLBACK's activities except that he bowls twice a week and also teaches at night at George Washington University.

She advised that KULLBACK's parents have resided in Florida for the past four or five years and stated that she met them once when they were visiting him in Washington, D.C. Mrs. COHEN advised that the employee's mother-in-law, ANNIE MIRIN, and her sons, "SI" and "BILL", resided with the KULLBACKs for a couple of months while looking for a place to live in about 1947. She stated that the employee's brother-in-law, "BILL", is married to a girl named BETTY. She stated that KULLBACK's in-laws visit them occasionally but she does not know just how frequently. She advised that his mother-in-law lives near-by, within walking distance, and visits at the KULLBACK home more frequently than do the others.

MAX MICHAEL, Paper Hanger, 1369 Sheridan Street, N. W.,
furnished the writer the following signed statement:

"June 9, 1954
Washington, D. C.

"I, MAX MICHAEL, make the following voluntary statement to ROBERT W. BUCHER who has identified himself to me as being a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. In the event that this matter should come up before a Security Hearing Board, I am willing to testify to the following facts in the presence of SOLOMON KULLBACK and his counsel.

"I first became acquainted with SOLOMON KULLBACK and his wife during the years 1933-1937 when our families were co-tenants of a small apartment building located at 5311 8th St., N. W., D. C. During this period I saw quite a bit of the KULLBACKs, and our families on occasion would go the Chesapeake Bay for a days outing. During the years 1940-1944 when SOLOMON KULLBACK resided on Van Buren St., N. W., Wash., D. C., I saw him and his family infrequently at their home.

"SOLOMON KULLBACK's mother-in-law, ANNIE MIRIN, who resided in New York City, used to frequently visit the KULLBACKs both at 5311 8th St., N. W., and later on Van Buren St., N. W. I became acquainted with ANNIE MIRIN, and had many conversations with her when she was visiting the KULLBACKs. ANNIE MIRIN often visited the KULLBACKs and sometimes stayed five or six weeks at a time.

"ANNIE MIRIN told me that she was a member of the Communist Party, and in all her conversations constantly glorified Russia. She always talked about the Communist Party and what a "paradise" the United States would be when the Communists took over. ANNIE MIRIN also told me that she belonged to a Communist Party club in the Bronx, N. Y. and that she was very active in organizing Jewish women for the Communist Party.

"I recall that ANNIE MIRIN spoke to me concerning her sons. She said at one time that one of her sons was fighting with the Loyalists in Spain and that another of her sons was working at Camp Monmouth. She stated that the son working at Camp Monmouth would not be drafted as he had an essential position there. I believe that ANNIE MIRIN told me that SOLOMON KULLBACK had gotten her son his position at Camp Monmouth but I am not positive about this because it was so many years ago.

"I do not recall ever discussing Communism or ANNIE MIRIN's Communist affiliations with the KULLBACKs. SOLOMON KULLBACK is not

a talkative man, and I do not recall ever discussing politics with him. SOLOMON KULLBACK never evidenced any interest in politics, and I believe him to be a conservative man in all respects. I do not believe that Communism would appeal to either SOLOMON KULLBACK or his wife. I have never heard SOLOMON KULLBACK make any statement or express any views which would give me cause to believe that he is not loyal to the United States.

"I have read the above statement and it is true to the best of my knowledge.

MICHAEL stated that in connection with his allegation made to the Army in 1944 that KULLBACK had solicited a bribe from him in return for placing his son in a Signal Corps Installation, that the employee never did actually ask him for any money or even hint that any money should be given him and MICHAEL stated that he never told the Army this in 1944.

He stated that the employee's wife, during a conversation when the employee was out of the room, said something about some friends of the KULLBACKS who had loads of money and would be willing to spend any amount to get their son placed in a Military Installation in the states, but because these friends' son had no technical experience nothing could be done for him. MICHAEL advised that he considered this above comment by Mrs. KULLBACK to imply that KULLBACK was doing a great thing for his own son and that he should have to pay KULLBACK something for this favor.

MICHAEL stated that he was well acquainted with the employee's wife and that she was an extremely greedy person whose only thoughts were about getting more money for better clothes, a bigger car, etc. He stated that MINNA KULLBACK spent all of the employee's money before he got it and that as a result the KULLBACKS were always broke. He stated that he believed MINNA KULLBACK had a tremendous influence upon the employee. He advised that he definitely did not believe Communist philosophy would appeal to MINNA KULLBACK at all and stated that "her mind works the other way around."

MICHAEL stated that he recalls that MINNA KULLBACK did not like the idea of her mother, ANNIE MIRIN being around the KULLBACK house at the time the employee went into uniform on active duty because of ANNIE MIRIN's Communist connections.

MICHAEL stated that in the past couple of years he has passed his and KULLBACKs' old residence at 5311 8th Street, N. W., on a couple of occasions and advised that there was no one presently living there who resided in that building at the time KULLBACK did.

MICHAEL advised that he has never been given any reason to question KULLBACK's loyalty and advised that he does not believe KULLBACK would constitute a security risk to the United States Government in view of his long and apparently satisfactory employment in a sensitive position and "especially now since he makes enough to take care of his wife's wants."

Washington Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised in 1940 that Communist Party Membership Book Number 53828 was made out in the name of MAX MICHAEL, Washington, D. C. T-4 was unable to further identify this MAX MICHAEL.

The Communist Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 10450.

Washington Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised that one MAX MICHAEL joined the International Workers Order in April, 1938, and was a member of Lodge 528 of the IWO as of September, 1951.

Washington Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised in early 1954 that MAX MICHAEL, 1369 Sheridan Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., was a member of the International Workers Order as of December, 1953.

The International Workers Order has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The files of Washington Confidential Informant T-1, previously referred to herein, reflect that T-1 recently completed a partial background investigation of the employee in 1954. Parts of T-1's investigation have not been duplicated. A copy of T-1's investigative report is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Washington Confidential Informant T-7, of unknown reliability, a former clerical employee of the Army Security Agency at Arlington Hall, Virginia, from 1943 to 1947, when contacted in regard to another investigation conducted by this office on June 30, 1950, advised that WILLIAM WOLFE WEISBAND played poker weekly or more often with a group consisting of FRANK LEWIS, LEONARD SEIDENGLANZ, SOLOMON KULLBACK and others.

It is to be noted that [redacted] was investigated in 1950 under the provisions of Executive Order 9835.

The files of the D. C. Credit Bureau reflect that SOLOMON and MINNA M. KULLBACK enjoy a satisfactory credit rating in the Washington, D. C. area. There is no further pertinent information contained in these files.

No record of the employee or his wife was located in the files of the Criminal Division and Special Investigations Squad, Metropolitan Police Department on date checked; at all times an indefinite number of unidentified records being out of file and not available for review.

The files of the Traffic Division, Metropolitan Police Department, reflect that SOLOMON KULLBACK resided at 5311 8th Street, N. W., committed five minor traffic violations in the period May 13, 1928, to August 20, 1934, for which offenses he elected to forfeit bonds of \$2 to \$3.

No record of the employee or his wife is contained in the files of the United States Park Police.

The files of the Division of Police, Arlington, Virginia, contained no record concerning the employee or his wife.

It was ascertained that the files of New York City Confidential Informant T-7, another government agency conducting personnel and background-type investigations, contained no additional pertinent information concerning the employee.

No record of the employee or his wife is contained in the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities.

Established Confidential Informants, of known reliability, who are familiar with certain phases of Communist Party and Communist Front activities in the Washington, D. C., area, advised that they are not acquainted with the employee and could furnish no information concerning him.

On January 12, 1959, BERT I. REAMY, 828 East 12th Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska, advised SA JOHN E. PEYTON that WILLIAM MIRIN had been employed as a plant manager by the Peacock Cleaners, Anchorage, Alaska, until October, 1948. MIRIN on one occasion displayed a photograph alleged to show MIRIN in uniform as an officer of the Spanish Loyalist Army. MIRIN told REAMY that he had never been a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

The Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On February 27, 1959, Mrs. CORRINNE NORMAN, Office Manager, Peacock Cleaners, advised SA PEYTON that MIRIN was employed as plant manager for this firm from June 26, 1958, to November 29, 1958, when he was discharged as unsatisfactory. Mrs. NORMAN said that MIRIN often argued politics and made statements that if people wanted to believe and teach Communism in this country, they should be allowed to do so. She said she challenged him by calling him a Communist, whereupon he became angry and stated that the information published in this country concerning China, Korea, and Russia is all propaganda.

Mr. WILLIAM MIRIN, 312 East Hoover, Las Vegas, Nevada, advised on December 18, 1961 that he formerly owned the Woodmoor Cleaners, 10119 Colesville Road, Silver Spring, Maryland, with his brother SIMON until he sold out to his brother in 1954. Mr. MIRIN said that after selling his part of the business, he left the Washington, D. C. area and has only been back to Washington, D. C. for a short period of time in 1957. Mr. MIRIN stated he also returned to Washington, D. C. to attend the funeral of his mother, ANNIE, in 1958, and for the funeral for his brother, SIMON, in February, 1961.

Mr. MIRIN stated that although his sister, MINNA, is married to SOLOMON KULLBACK he has a very limited association with KULLBACK. Mr. MIRIN stated that he has only been in the KULLBACK home on an average of twice a year and these were occasions when the entire family was invited. He also said that Mr. KULLBACK has never called him by telephone or written to him and that all communications come to him from his sister, MINNA. Mr. MIRIN stated that since leaving Washington, D. C. in 1954 he has traveled and worked in Florida, Saudi Arabia, New York, and has been in Alaska since 1957. Mr. MIRIN stated he never considered himself to be close to Mr. KULLBACK inasmuch as he has not been in the Washington, D. C. area for quite a while and because of the definite difference in their backgrounds. Mr. MIRIN explained that he is familiar with the dry cleaning business, steam fitters trade, and construction work and is presently employed as a taxicab driver by the North Las Vegas Cab Company, North Las Vegas, Nevada. Mr. MIRIN said that his background is so different than Mr. KULLBACK'S that they never had a mutual ground to become close in-laws or close friends. Mr. MIRIN said that he was certain he could never exercise any influence in any way over Mr. KULLBACK because he felt he was not held in any high regard by Mr. KULLBACK. Mr. MIRIN



From a review of the above file it appears that the source of the information concerning MIRIN's membership in the YCL originated in a G-2 interview of MORTON GOTTSCHOLL, Dean of Men, City College of New York.

There are two interviews of GOTTSCHOLL in the file, one conducted 6/24/42, the other 11/29/43.

In the former interview, GOTTSCHOLL advised that MIRIN "was a member of the Young Communist League if not actually a member of the Communist Party and because of this he could not recommend MIRIN for a position of trust."

In the latter interview, he stated he came in personal contact with MIRIN in 1934 at which time a group of Italian Fascist students visiting this country were being welcomed by the college. Certain elements of the student body began booing and hissing the visiting students on the platform. The offending group was composed mostly of communists and socialist sympathizers. Later, when known demonstrators were about to be disciplined, a committee came to GOTTSCHOLL to lodge a protest against the imminent punishment about to be meted the offenders, and also to protest the official welcome of the Fascist students by the college. MIRIN was a member of this committee. MIRIN admitted taking part in the demonstration and was placed on scholastic probation with everyone else who participated.

GOTTSCHOLL further stated in the latter interview that he could not say MIRIN was a member of the Young Communist League as he had no definite knowledge. His group, according to GOTTSCHOLL, identified themselves as being merely liberal.



concerning ISADORE MIRIN and SIMON MIRIN have been reviewed and found to contain no pertinent information subsequent to 1954 other than matters which have already been directed to the attention of the appropriate offices.

Previous New York investigation in this case has been set out in the New York report of SA BERNARD A. HOYE, dated 5/28/54. NY T-4 in that report has been recontacted and set out under his true name. NY T-5 in that report was not recontacted because in 1954 she said she has largely lost contact with the MIRIN family and the MIRIN family had moved to Washington, D.C. in about 1944.

The case file on ISADORE MIRIN reflects that CHARLES LOWENTHAL, 153 West 72nd Street, NYC, according to a G-2 report in 1944, had characterized ANNIE MIRIN as a "rabid, vicious communist." LAWRENCE LOVENTHAL, partner, Loventhal Management Company, 153-55 West 72nd Street, New York, New York, on 12/14/61, advised that CHARLES LOVENTHAL, his father, died on 6/14/52. He noted that this firm manages the premises at 1013-15 Bryant Avenue, Bronx, New York. It is noted that this is a former address of ANNIE MIRIN. LOVENTHAL said he does not know the MIRIN family or the employee.

The case file on [REDACTED] (NY 121-7424) contains no pertinent information, this case having

Miss MIRIN acknowledged that she is the former wife of ISADORE MIRIN, said she has not seen the employee for eight or ten years, and did not care to be interviewed concerning him.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

New York T-8, who is not available for re-contact and who has no personal knowledge of ISADORE or BETTY MIRIN, advised in December, 1947, that ISADORE MIRIN, born in 1915, and BETTY MIRIN, as of December, 1946, were members of International Workers Order (IWO) Lodge 677, Bronx, New York.

The IWO has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

[redacted] advised he has known SOLOMON KULLBACK for 25 to 30 years, or approximately since his own marriage. He explained that [redacted] through marriage of KULLBACK and he maintains periodic contact with Mr. and Mrs. KULLBACK when he visits KULLBACK's brother-in-law, SIMON MIRIN, and SIMON's wife, ELEANOR, who live on Richland Place in Silver Spring, Maryland. KULLBACK and his wife live in the same general area, at 1249 Van Buren Street, Washington, D.C.

[redacted] continued that Mr. and Mrs. KULLBACK have an unmarried [redacted] who lives with them and [redacted] in California. KULLBACK's wife is MINNIE MIRIN KULLBACK and [redacted] noted that KULLBACK's parents lived on Rockaway Parkway, Brooklyn, New York, as of about 25 years ago. He said he could furnish no further information about the KULLBACK family. *MR. Solomon Kullback*

KULLBACK's wife's relatives are her mother, ANNIE MIRIN, who has been deceased for about four years, her brother, ISADORE "BILL" MIRIN, located in Alaska for the past three years, her brother, SIMON and her brother, JULIUS MIRIN, who died one year ago. [redacted] never knew the name of ANNIE MIRIN's husband and said this person died about 20 years ago. The MIRIN family moved to Washington, D.C., from New York City, in about 1944, and have not lived in New York since that time.

[redacted] continued that ISADORE MIRIN had worked for a time in Saudi Arabia, prior to his going to an unknown address in Alaska. He had previously been a partner with his brother SIMON, in a dry cleaning business in Woodmoor, Maryland, which business SIMON is currently operating. ISADORE and his former wife BETTY have been divorced for 6 or 7 years and BETTY lives at an unknown address in Bronx, New York. ISADORE is currently married to [redacted]. Before his death, JULIUS MIRIN had lived in Forest Hills, New York, said [redacted] and the only members of the MIRIN family now in the Washington, D.C. area are SIMON and [redacted]

[] continued that his knowledge of the MIRINs has been gained through hearsay and through casual references in family conversation.

[] said that ISADORE MIRIN joined the Abraham Lincoln Brigade as a young man of 20 or 21, out of a desire for action and adventure. He recalled that ISADORE MIRIN's conversation, as of the 1930's, was along Communist lines, but he could furnish no illustrations or examples of this conversation. [] said it was his feeling that ISADORE was simply repeating what had been said in his household by his mother, ANNIE.

[] said that although he recalls ISADORE MIRIN as having often repeated ideas which were similar to those advocated by the Communist Party (CP), he has no present information as to what these ideas were. After ISADORE MIRIN moved to Washington, D.C., in about 1944, and became a businessman with responsibilities, he seemed to drop his Communist ideas and has not displayed any sympathy or similarity to Communism since living in Washington, D.C. Whatever doubts he may once have had concerning ISADORE's loyalty to this country, have long since been dispelled and he said he feels ISADORE MIRIN's activity with the Abraham Lincoln Brigade was a result of his desire for action and adventure rather than from any disloyalty to the United States. To the best of his knowledge, MIRIN has been a loyal citizen for several years who has displayed no interest in Communism.

[] knew ISADORE MIRIN's former wife, BETTY, only slightly, but he said he believed she must have had pro-Communist tendencies because he understands she met ISADORE MIRIN at a Communist or Communist front gathering many years ago. He has no other information about BETTY MIRIN, said []

He recalled that SIMON MIRIN, another brother of KULLBACK's wife, was once expelled from City College of New York, because of "radical politics". He said he has no further knowledge of this and knew very little about

SIMON MIRIN in the 1930's, when the expulsion took place. He has heard through the MIRIN family that as a young man SIMON participated in May Day parades and other demonstrations of a Communist nature, but he could neither furnish the source of this information nor provide further or more specific details.

[] said he does not feel SIMON MIRIN was ever a CP member and during the ten years or more that SIMON has been in Washington, D.C., he has shown no evidence of Communism. Like his brother ISADORE, SIMON seems to have long ago forgotten any Communist sympathies he may once have had as a young man, and since he became a businessman his interests have been along those lines.

[] added that he never paid much attention to the things SIMON and ISADORE MIRIN said, which were similar or identical to those of Communist propaganda, because they seemed, at that time, to be indoctrinated with a set method of thinking which precluded discussion. According to [] ISADORE MIRIN worked for Messinger Trucking Corporation, in the 1930's, for a few years.

KULLBACK's wife's mother, ANNIE MIRIN was apparently indoctrinated with Communism and he said she apparently was once a Communist Party member. He based this on her statements and citations from the "Daily Worker", which she often carried with her when she visited other members of her family. He said he feels she is the person who taught her children any Communist ideas they once had and he always considered her to have done considerable talking with little real knowledge of what she had said. To the best of [] knowledge, ANNIE MIRIN's husband never agreed with her in politics nor did he take any interest in Communism.

[] could recall nothing specific which ANNIE MIRIN did or said, which indicated she was a Communist or sympathetic to them, but he recalled that she was the family member most interested in causes which [] remembers as Communist. Except for her advocacy of various points of view, as published in the "Daily Worker", [] could recall nothing further about ANNIE MIRIN's statements or actions. [] said ANNIE MIRIN seemed to forget her

Communist ideas after moving to Washington, D.C. and during the 10 years or so previous to her death, she gave little or no evidence of sympathy for Communism. [] repeated that he can furnish no examples or concrete information of sympathy for Communism on the part of the MIRINS.

He never knew JULIUS MIRIN well, said [] and JULIUS never associated extensively with others in his family. Neither did he share the Communist beliefs once held by SIMON, ISADORE and ANNIE MIRIN. He said he has no other information concerning JULIUS MIRIN.

Concerning MINNIE MIRIN KULLBACK, [] added that she never in any way showed any sympathy for Communism or related causes. He advised he has heard her prohibit any discussion of politics by the MIRIN family when her family visited KULLBACK and her. Such visits have been only on relatively infrequent, family-dinner type occasions, said [] and he noted that KULLBACK and his wife originally moved near the MIRINS only because of family ties and obligations in caring for ANNIE MIRIN.

According to [] KULLBACK has associated very little with the MIRINS because of his reserved nature and his higher educational and intellectual level. As a result, KULLBACK has little in common with the MIRINS and only someone at his own intellectual level could influence him. KULLBACK has academic and "bookish" interests, said [] and he therefore lives an entirely different and separate life from SIMON MIRIN or others in the MIRIN family. KULLBACK is called the non-sociable member of the family, according to [] because of his reserve and his separate interests. He is brilliant and extremely discreet about his work, and [] said neither he nor the MIRIN family have ever known what kind of government work KULLBACK does. KULLBACK would never discuss politics with the MIRINS, because of his different intellectual level and complete disassociation with them in this field.

[] said that although he does not have a warm, personal regard for KULLBACK because of the latter's reserve, he feels KULLBACK is without doubt an entirely loyal citizen of unquestioned integrity, character, associates and reputation. He said that although KULLBACK and his wife have had a normal family relationship with the MIRINS, the association has been a familial one, carried on at family occasions such as dinners and anniversaries, rather than because of any commonality of interests or philosophy.

[] emphasized that since living in Washington, D.C., the MIRINS have forgotten their once pro-Communist ideas. In particular, as SIMON developed business interests and responsibility, he has dropped all signs of any interest in the Communist cause. He repeated that KULLBACK has never shown any evidence of agreement with the philosophy or politics of ANNIE, SIMON or ISADORE MIRIN, or any sign of being influenced by them, for the reasons noted above.

[] also said he has no knowledge of one SIDNEY BOROWITZ.

Because his information is heresay and he can recall nothing specific, [] said he does not desire to furnish a signed statement or appear before a hearing board.







A characterization of SIDNEY BOROWITZ will be set forth by another office of the FBI.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

EMPLOYMENT

Mrs. LOUISE FRITZSCHE, secretary, Personnel Office, George Washington University, stated on December 13, 1961, that their records reflect that SOLOMON KULLBACK, born April 3, 1907, in Brooklyn, New York, has been employed there on a part-time basis since 1938 when he entered on duty as a lecturer in statistics. She stated that he is presently employed in the position of Professor of Statistics.

Dr. F. M. WEIDA, Department of Statistics, George Washington University, stated on December 19, 1961, that he knew the employee as a student in his class there during the period 1930-34 and that he counseled the employee on his Ph.D work. He stated that he has known Dr. KULLBACK as a fellow employee of the University since 1938 and is also acquainted with him socially to a limited extent. *WASH, D.C.*

Dr. WEIDA stated that there is absolutely no question in his mind concerning the employee's loyalty to the United States and that he would recommend him as a person of excellent moral character and reputation. He stated that Dr. KULLBACK is naturally a member of various professional groups and is also a member of the Cosmos Club.

Dr. WEIDA stated that the employee's associates have impressed him favorably. He stated that the employee has a son who resides in California and has a daughter but he does not know where she is residing at this time. He stated to his knowledge Mrs. KULLBACK is a housewife. Dr. WEIDA stated that he did not know any other members of the employee's family and that he knows no associate of the employee by the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ.

Dr. WEIDA commented that it is his understanding that the employee is going to retire from the Government next year and that they are planning to employ him full time next year as a professor at the University.

Dr. E. H. JOHNSON, Department of Statistics, George Washington University, stated on December 18, 1961, that he has known the employee as a fellow instructor since the late 1940's. He stated that their association has been primarily of a professional nature and that they have served together on a number of committees at the University.

Dr. JOHNSON said that he has had no reason to doubt the employee's loyalty to the United States and that he regards him as a person whose moral character and reputation are above reproach. He stated that the employee is interested in bowling and is a member of several professional statistical groups. Dr. JOHNSON stated that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is not familiar to him.

Mr. HARRY H. KU, Mathematical Statistician, Statistical Engineering Laboratory, National Bureau of Standards, stated on December 15, 1961, that he first met KULLBACK at George Washington University where the employee was teaching evening classes and he was a student. He stated that he was in the employee's class there for about five years and that although their contact was primarily there, they also had limited social contact and he has met the employee's wife and children. *WAS A, 1/2*

Mr. KU said that he would recommend KULLBACK as a loyal American citizen of excellent moral character and reputation. He stated that he knows of no organizational activities on the employee's part other than with the Cosmos Club and professional statistical groups. He stated that the employee's associates whom he has met have impressed him favorably. Mr. KU stated that he believes [redacted] is presently employed in [redacted] *b6*

[redacted] Mr. KU said that he is not acquainted with any other members of the employee's family and stated that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is not familiar to him.

RESIDENCE

Mrs. FLORA COHEN, 6611 13th Street, N. W., stated on December 15, 1961, that she has known the employee and his family quite well for twenty-one years. She stated that Mrs. KULLBACK is a housewife and that the employee's son resides in the San Francisco area and that his daughter is in Japan.

Mrs. COHEN said that she would recommend the employee and his family as loyal American citizens of excellent character and reputation. She stated that she knows of no organizations in which the employee is active.

Mrs. COHEN said that the employee's father is dead and that if his mother is living, she would be residing in Florida with the employee's married sister. She stated that the employee also has a brother who resides in Monticello, New York.

Mrs. COHEN said that Mrs. KULLBACK's parents are dead and that the employee's wife has one brother SIMON who resides in the Washington, D. C., area and another brother BILL whose whereabouts she does not know. Mrs. COHEN stated that Mrs. KULLBACK's mother used to visit the KULLBACKs frequently and that SIMON and BILL MIRIN also maintained a fairly close relationship with the KULLBACKs. Mrs. COHEN said that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is unknown to her.

Mrs. EVA HELLMAN, 1263 Van Buren Street, N. W., stated on December 14, 1961, that she has been casually acquainted with the KULLBACKs for about twenty-one years. She stated that she is considerably older than they are and consequently does not have too much contact with them.

Mrs. HELLMAN said the employee's [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] She stated that the KULLBACK family have impressed her favorably in every respect and that she has had no reason to question their loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. HELLMAN said that she knows nothing of the employee's parents but did know Mrs. KULLBACK's mother. She said that Mrs. KULLBACK's mother formerly resided in the neighborhood and to her knowledge the employee and his wife enjoyed a normal family relationship with Mrs. KULLBACK's mother. Mrs. HELLMAN stated that she believes Mrs. KULLBACK has several brothers but that she is not acquainted with them. She stated that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is unknown to her.

Mrs. PAULINE YURDIN, 6713 14th Street, N. W., stated on December 14, 1961, that prior to two years ago she resided at 1251 Van Buren Street, N. W., and knew the

employee and his family quite well as neighbors for about twenty years. She stated that she has seen them only occasionally since that time. Mrs. YURDIN said that she considers the employee, his wife, and two children as loyal American citizens and well-respected members of the community. She stated that she is not aware of any organizational activities on the employee's part and that his associates impressed her as being a desirable type.

Mrs. YURDIN said that the [redacted] and that [redacted] is in California. She stated that she believes the employee's mother is residing in Florida with the employee's married sister but does not know their names or address. She stated that the employee has a brother who is an accountant and that she believes he resides in Monticello, New York. Referral/Consult

Mrs. YURDIN said that Mrs. KULLBACK's father died years ago and that her mother, ANNIE MIRIN, died about three years ago. She said that the employee's wife had three brothers but that one of them, JULIUS MIRIN, who lived in New York, died last winter. She said that another brother by the name of BILL, or ISADORE, MIRIN is working in Alaska but she does not know his address or his place of employment. She commented that BILL was married to BETTY MIRIN but that they were divorced about five years ago and BILL has since remarried. She said that the other brother, SY MIRIN, owns the Woodmoor Cleaners in Silver Spring, Maryland, and that BILL was a partner in that business before going to Alaska. Mrs. YURDIN said that the employee's wife has no sisters.

Mrs. YURDIN said that the employee seemed to enjoy a normal family relationship with his wife's mother and brothers. She stated that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is not known to her.

Mrs. MAUREEN DONOHUE, 1255 Van Buren Street, N. W., stated on December 13, 1961, that she has known the employee and his family quite well since about 1940. She stated that the [redacted] is presently employed in California and that [redacted] is [redacted] employee in Japan. Referral/Consult

Mrs. DONOHOE said that nothing has ever come to her attention which would cause her to question the loyalty of the employee or any member of his family and that she considers them to be people of good character and reputation. She stated that she knows of no organizational activities on his part other than the Cosmos Club. She stated that the employee's associates seemed to be a desirable type and to her knowledge do not include anyone of questionable loyalty.

Mrs. DONOHOE advised that the employee's father-in-law has been dead for a number of years and that his mother-in-law, ANNIE MIRIN, died sometime within the past four or five years. She stated that she believes the employee's mother is also deceased.

Mrs. DONOHOE stated that the employee's wife has several brothers but that the only one she can recall at the present time is SY who owns a dry cleaning establishment in the Silver Spring area. She stated that SY frequently visits the KULLBACKs and also picks up and delivers their cleaning. Mrs. DONOHOE said that the names of ISADORE and BETTY MIRIN are not familiar to her although she may know them by sight. She stated that the name of SIDNEY BOROWITZ is not known to her.

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities were reviewed on December 13, 1961, by IC [] and no record of the employee was found.

The files of the Bureau of Personnel Investigations, Civil Service Commission, were reviewed by IC [] on December 14, 1961, and contained no additional pertinent information concerning the employee.

The files of the Criminal Division, Traffic Division, and Special Investigation Squad of the Metropolitan Police Department were reviewed on December 13, 1961, by IC [] and no record of the employee was found; at all times an indefinite number of unidentified records are out of file and unavailable for review.

Washington confidential informants, who have knowledge of some subversive activities in the Washington, D.C. area, were contacted on December 1, 1961, and stated that the employee is unknown to them, and that they possessed no information concerning him.

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION REGARDING ANNA, ISADORE,
AND BETTY MIRIN

WF T-8 advised in October, 1956, that the name of Mrs. ANNA MIRIN, 7621 - 9th Street, N.W., appeared at that time on a white three by five index card which had been in the possession of SELMA REIN.

SELMA REIN appeared before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington, D.C. on February 28, 1956, and refused to answer whether she was a current member of the Communist Party.

WF T-9 advised on November 15, 1956, upon examination of the above-mentioned three by five white index card bearing the name and address of the employee's mother-in-law, that it had been one of the cards comprising the general mailing list of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia. WF T-9 commented that it was his opinion that some of the names and addresses on that mailing list had been selected at random from either telephone directories or city directories and included on the mailing list in an effort to confuse anyone who might have gained possession of the list who did not have authority to see it.

A description of the Progressive Party of the District of Columbia is set forth in the appendix of this report.

WF T-10 advised in September, 1951, that the name of "ANNIE MIRIN, 7621 9 St., N.W." followed by the date of July 19, 1950, appeared at that time on a list which he believed to be subscribers of the "Morning Freiheit."

The previous report in this case made at Washington, D.C., dated June 10, 1954, reflected that the employee's mother-in-law, ANNIE MIRIN, resided at 7621 9th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The "Morning Freiheit" will be described in the appendix of this report.

ISADORE MIRIN, 7621 9th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on August 5, 1953, and advised that he was born on January 1, 1915, at Salem, Massachusetts, and that his mother's name is ANNA, and his wife's name is BETTY. He stated that he has a brother by the name of SIMON MIRIN, who is in the dry cleaning business in Silver Spring, Maryland.

ISADORE MIRIN stated that he served in the Spanish Loyalists Army under an alias from about January to September, 1937. Concerning the circumstances of his joining that army, he stated that he joined as a result of reading an advertisement in a New York paper which reflected that the American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy was looking for volunteers to fight in Spain.

The American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 10450.

ISADORE MIRIN said that the reason for his joining the Spanish loyalist forces was because he was 21, young, and he thought it would be a good "lark." He claimed that he has never been a member of the Communist Party and has no sympathy for the Communist Party.

ISADORE MIRIN stated that he never joined the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, although he has received literature from them.

The Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 10450.

ISADORE MIRIN was reinterviewed by Special Agents of the FBI on May 3, 1954, in Silver Spring, Maryland, and stated that his family had formerly resided in New York City during the 1930's and had resided in a neighborhood where it was common for Communist Party nominating petitions to be circulated. He stated that he remembered that he, his mother, his wife, and probably his brothers all at one time or another signed Communist Party nominating petitions, but that it was strictly due to the neighborhood, and that they had made no effort to seek out the petitions to sign.

ISADORE MIRIN further stated that both he and his mother were insurance members of the International Workers Order, but that they had never taken any active part in the policies of that organization.

The International Workers Order has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to the provisions of Executive Order 10450.

ISADORE MIRIN stated that his mother, ANNIE MIRIN, is presently 70 some odd years of age, and that her whole activity at that time revolved around three or four poker games a week with some of her friends, and that she has no interest whatsoever in the Communist Party. He stated that she does read the "Morning Freiheit" and explained that this was due to the fact that she is unable to speak English very well and the "Morning Freiheit" is published in the Yiddish language.

ISADORE MIRIN explained to the interviewing Agents that no members of his family at the present time is inclined to the Communist Party philosophy. He reiterated that his wife, BETTY, from whom he is presently securing a divorce, his mother, ANNIE, his brother, SIMON, and maybe his brother JULIUS, have all signed Communist Party nominating petitions at one time or another. He stated that his sister, MINNA, according to the best of his belief, has not signed any Communist Party nominating petitions. He stated that MINNA is married to SOLOMON KULLBACK, and that he sees them approximately once or twice a month. ISADORE MIRIN stated that to his knowledge, SOLOMON KULLBACK has no connection whatsoever with the Communist Party.

During that interview, ISADORE MIRIN expressed the belief that the Communist Party represents a threat to the security of the United States, and that he would do all in his power to fight against Russia if this country was ever invaded.

During the interview of ISADORE MIRIN on August 5, 1953, as mentioned previously in this report, he advised that his wife is BETTY MIRIN, and that they resided from 1947 to the present (1953) at 7621 - 9th Street, N.W., which address is also known as 7559 - 9th Street, N.W.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast communist daily newspaper which suspended publication on January 13, 1958.

PROGRESSIVE PARTY OF DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA (PPDC)

On January 15, 1948, Mrs. MARY STALCUP MARKWARD, an admitted member of the Communist Party (CP) and Communist Political Association (CPA) in Washington, D. C., from 1943-1949, advised that at a meeting of the City Committee of the CP of the District of Columbia on January 11, 1948, motions were passed to set up a Political Action Committee in Washington, D. C., for the purpose of coordinating all activity with regard to the "Third Party Movement." It was decided to set up "Wallace for President Clubs" in Washington, D. C. These groups subsequently became the PPDC. On December 17, 1951, Mrs. MARKWARD advised that the PPDC, during the years 1948 and 1949, was dominated and controlled by the CP of the District of Columbia.

A source on February 25, 1952, November 14, 1952, November 27, 1953, and January 31, 1955, identified the leaders of the PPDC, as of the above dates, as either Communist Party members or Communist Party sympathizers. This source added that the PPDC has never opposed the CP on any issue or program.

It is noted that another source on February 8, 1956, reported that the PPDC was dissolved on February 7, 1956.

The Progressive Party, nationally, is characterized separately in the appendix.

Regarding the Progressive Party, nationally, the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," prepared and released on January 2, 1957, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U.S. House of Representatives, Washington, D. C. on page 74, states:

- "1. 'Communist dissimulation extends into the field of political parties forming political front organizations such as the Progressive Party. ***The Communists are thus enabled to present their candidates for elective office under other than a straight Communist label.'
(Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S. Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, P. 91)".

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

SIDNEY BOROWITZ, Professor and Chairman of the Department of Physics at University Heights, New York University, University Heights, Bronx, New York, on December 21, 1961, advised he came to Washington, D.C. in 1940 or 1941, and was introduced to KULLBACK some time thereafter. He knew the employee casually as a social friend for about two years until BOROWITZ left Washington, D.C. in 1943. He has not seen KULLBACK since leaving Washington and he said their relationship was never close. BOROWITZ recalled that the employee was a cryptanalyst, but he never knew anything about what KULLBACK did. He said he may have been invited once or twice to the employee's house on a social occasion because he himself at that time, was single and had no established home. He said his recollection of the employee after the several intervening years since he has seen him, is one of a solid member of society who was a good family man and one whom BOROWITZ respected as an established person of accomplishment.

BOROWITZ continued that he recalls introducing a friend of his, ARTHUR J. LEVENSON to KULLBACK in approximately 1940, when LEVENSON was out of work. BOROWITZ knew vaguely that KULLBACK was a mathematician or engaged in work requiring mathematics, and he felt there was a possibility the employee could suggest possibilities for employment to LEVENSON. To the best of his knowledge the outcome of this incident was that KULLBACK suggested that LEVENSON take a home study course in cryptanalysis, but LEVENSON was drafted before this course was completed. LEVENSON

is still in Washington, D.C. and BOROWITZ had no further information concerning this matter. BOROWITZ stated that he has never told anyone that he knew KULLBACK from 1933 to 1942, noting that this would have been impossible inasmuch as he knew the employee only casually for about two years in Washington in 1942 or 1943. He said that he probably knew LEVENSON from about 1933 to 1942.

According to BOROWITZ, his association with the Communist Party (CP) occurred after he left Washington and when he was living in New York in about 1943. Therefore, KULLBACK was not aware of his CP affiliation and BOROWITZ said in any event KULLBACK was never a close enough friend to him to divulge that type of information.

BOROWITZ stated that he has very little information concerning KULLBACK because of his very slight knowledge of him about 18 years ago, but, to his knowledge, there was never anything concerning his patriotism, character, habits or associates which would cause doubt. Professor BOROWITZ stated he could furnish no further information.

The following information concerns SIDNEY BOROWITZ:

New York T-9 who is unavailable for recontact, advised in December, 1943, that the name SIDNEY BOROWITZ appeared on a list maintained in the New York County Headquarters of the CP as of December, 1943. This list reflected that BOROWITZ was transferred from Branch C-2 of the Industrial Section of the CP, to the Chelsea Peoples Club, 10th Assembly District. BOROWITZ's address was 165 West 20th Street, New York City.

L.S. GINSBERG, Madison Chelsea Construction Company, 205 East 42nd Street, New York, New York, in connection with the investigation of another matter in 1944, advised his company handled rentals at 165 West 20th Street. GINSBERG said SIDNEY BOROWITZ occupied Apartment 1C at 165 West 20th Street, and as of August, 1943, was employed as an engineer by Western Electric Company, Kearny, New Jersey.

SIDNEY BOROWITZ on February 14, 1952, advised SAS [] and []

[] that he was not a CP member and had never been one and did not believe in Communism or belong to any front organizations. He recalled he had been asked to join the CP in about 1942 or 1943, when he lived at 155 West 20th Street, New York City, and he said he was not sure of the above dates or if the above address was exactly correct. BOROWITZ said he attended several CP meetings, then completely disassociated himself from this group and he never joined the Party.

On October 24, 1952, BOROWITZ advised SA [] that he wanted to correct several statements he had previously made to SAS [] and [] on February 14, 1952. BOROWITZ said he had joined the CP, either late in 1942, or early 1943, in New York City, and was at that time employed by Western Electric Company, Kearny, New Jersey. He said that to the best of his memory he attended four or five meetings in 1943, lost interest in the movement, and stopped attending meetings in 1943.

BOROWITZ advised SAS [redacted] and [redacted] on November 12, 1959, that he found no satisfaction in his membership in the CP, and that since dropping out in 1943, he had no contact with the CP except for a visit by an unknown man in 1954. BOROWITZ said this person tried to talk him into coming back to the CP, but he told this man he had no interest in doing this and the matter was dropped.

The following information concerns SIMON MIRIN. It is noted that [redacted] whose comments appear in a previous New York report in this matter, has stated that SIMON MIRIN is the employee's brother-in-law, and that SIMON MIRIN was once expelled from City College of New York because of "radical politics".

Records of G-2, as made available by Colonel RICHARD H. MERRICK, Commanding Officer, United States Army, Central Records Facility, Fort Holabird, Maryland, reviewed by a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on December 21, 1961, reflect that MORTON GOTTSCHOLL, Dean of Men, City College of New York, advised a representative of G-2, on June 24, 1942, that SIMON MIRIN "was a member of the Young Communist League (YCL) if not actually a member of the CP and because of this, he would not recommend MIRIN for a position of trust."

The YCL and the CP have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

During an interview with G-2, on November 29, 1943, Dean GOTTSCHOLL said he came in personal contact with SIMON MIRIN in 1934, at which time a group of Italian Fascist students visiting this country were being welcomed by this College. Certain elements of the student body began booing and hissing the visiting students on the platform. The offending group was composed mostly of Communists and socialists sympathizers. Later, when known demonstrators were about to be disciplined, a committee came to GOTTSCHOLL to lodge a protest against the imminent punishment about to be meted the offenders and also to protest the official welcome of the fascist students by the College. MIRIN was a member of this committee. GOTTSCHOLL said MIRIN admitted taking part in the demonstration, and was placed on scholastic probation with everyone else who participated.

Dean GOTTSCHOLL stated during the November, 1943 interview that he could not say MIRIN was a member of the YCL, as he had no definite knowledge. His group according to GOTTSCHOLL identified themselves as being merely liberal.

MORTON GOTTSCHALL, 430 West 24th Street, New York, New York, Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, City University of New York, on December 26, 1961, advised SA [] that he vaguely recalls the disturbance in connection with the visit of Italian

fascist students in the mid 1930s and the long faculty discussions concerning placing the offending objecting students on probation or in some cases suspension. Dean GOTTSCHALL advised he does not now recall MIRIN, but if MIRIN were placed on probation, he could not have been a very active participant inasmuch as the really active participants were expelled or suspended. Dean GOTTSCHALL said he cannot furnish further information about SIMON MIRIN and must rely on his information previously given a representative of G-2.

Records of G-2, mentioned above, were checked concerning the employee and his wife and found to contain no record.
