This further responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of of November 29, 2003 to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), for records concerning one Dr. Solomon Kullback, born April 03, 1907. On February 15, 2017, the FBI forwarded records and your request to this office, and they were received on February 21, 2017.

Coordination with another element of our command has been completed, and we have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order 13526. As a result of this review, it has been determined that the records no longer warrants security classification protection and is partially releasable to you. The record is enclosed for your perusal.

Information has been sanitized from the records that would result in an unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of the individuals concerned. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), per Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(6).

The withholding of the information described above is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Major General Christopher S. Ballard, Commanding, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You have the right to appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 90-day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you from filing litigation in the courts. You should state the basis of your disagreement with the response and provide justification for a reconsideration of the denial. An appeal may not serve as a request for additional or new information. An appeal may only address information denied in this response. Your appeal is to be made to this office, for forwarding, as appropriate, to the Secretary of the Army, Office of the General Counsel.

One Source advised that SUBJECT, while serving in the Armed Forces, attempted to have Source's son assigned to a Signal Corps installation in Virginia; however, while at SUBJECT's home previous to this assignment, Source was advised by SUBJECT's wife that KULLBACK had been offered \$5,000 from an unnamed individual to effect the assignment of this individual's son to the Signal Corps project in Virginia. Believing this to be an indication that payment was desired for the special assignment of his son, Source said no more of the anticipated transfer. This Source further advised that KULLNACK's wife's family had a record of Communist affiliations (3). A previous investigation of KULLBACK completed on 14 November 1950, disclosed that it was alleged that SUBJECT, while a Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Army Signal Corps, had attempted to solicit a \$2,000 bribe to provide a preferred assignment for an army enlisted man. In subsequent investigation of this allegation, it was disclosed that SUBJECT had allegedly obtained employment in a sensitive position for an individual later determined to be KULLBACK's brother-in-law. The brother-in-law was alleged to have affiliated with the Communist Party. Due to the fact that investigation did not substantiate these allegations, no action was taken (14b,19). The Source of the foregoing information, in both investigations, was the same individual, who can possibly be identified with a person who joined the International Workers Order in April 1939 (4).

An investigation of KULLBACK's brother-in-law, Simon Mirin, completed in 1944, by a reliable government agency, disclosed that Mirin consorted and was in full sympathy with known Communists while at the City College of New York; participated in Communit demonstrations; and was alleged to have been a member of the Young Communist League from 1933 until 1940 (31a). This investigation further disclosed that Mirin's mother, Annie Mirin, mother-in-law of SUBJECT, was known by neighbors as a "red hot Communist", and that Annie Mirin had registered as a member of the Communist Party during 1935 and 1936, and the American Labor Party from 1937 through 1942 (31b). Isador Mirin, Simon Mirin's brother and SUBJECT's brother-in-law, was a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade, this investigation disclosed (31c). Simon Mirin listed one b6

Investigation disclosed that SUBJECT does not maintain a close relationship with his wife's family (5,7,8,10,11).

SUBJECT's brothers-in-law, Isador Mirin and Simon Mirin, are the operators of the Woodmoor Cleaners in Silver Spring, Maryland (7).

(Organization) On 10 December 1953, the files of the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Military District of Washington, Washington, D. C., were examined concerning Hadassah and revealed the following information in substance:

Hadassah (Women's Zionist Organization of America), headquarters at 1819 Broadway, New York City, New York, was organized in 1912 to support projects in Palestine and to carry on an educational program in America. Hadassah registered with the Secretary of State for the solicitation and collection of contributions to be used for relief in belligerent countries - Palestine - on November 15, 1939. Junior Hadassah is the youth branch of Hadassah. In February 1951, it was reported that the National Board of the Women's Division of the Jewish Peoples Fraternal Order (cited by the Attorney General, 1950) had recently instructed its members to "join such organizations as Hadassah, the American Jewish Congress and parent-teacher associations clandestinely and to propagandize within those organizations for progressive ideas." In October 1953, at the 39th Annual, Haddassah Convention, speakers attacked congressional committees for "aiming their appeal principally to fear."

Hadassah does not fall within the purview of Executive Order 10450 as designated by the Attorney General of the United States.

The above mentioned investigation also indicated that Simon Mirin's mother, Annie Mirin, nee: Fishbein, was well known in her neighborhood as a "red hot Communist"; and that Knnie Mirin, nee: Fishbein, was listed in the records of the Board of Elections, Borough of Bronx, New York, Tremont Avenue and Third Avenue, Bronx, New York, as a registered member of the Communist Party during the calendar years 1935 and 1936, and as a registered member of the American Labor Party during the calendar years 1937 through 1942. c. The above mentioned investigation further reflected that Simon Mirin's brother, Isadore Mirin, who was born on 1 January 1915, in Salem, Massachusetts, reportedly fought during the Spanish Civil War as a member of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade of the Loyalist Army. Isadore Mirin, in a sworn statement to his draft board, Local Board 97, 1738 Crotona Park East, Bronx, New York, on 9 December 1941, stated, "I was in Spain during the Civil War..... I was there for a year and a half". d.
