

### Colorado Reporter's Story

## Possible Accomplice Tie Probed

By Clark Lobb Tribune Staff Writer

A Colorado reporter covering the Theodore Bundy escape from Aspen, Colo., said Wednesday whether the accused murderer and convicted kidnaper is still in the Aspen area is contingent upon whether he had an accomplice - a possibility being checked by Pitkin County authorities.

Al Cunningham, assigned to the Bundy story for the Rocky Mountain News in Denver, said in a telephone conversation that a report from an unidentified city employe - a woman

- led to investigation of the possibility that the prisoner planned his escape and did not climb from a second story window in the Pitkin County Courthouse "as a spur of the moment thing.'

The Denver writer said the woman, attending a hearing on a motion by Bundy (the former University of Utah law student is handling his own defense), said she remarked to a friend that it seemed unusual that on such a hot day Bundy would be wearing a sweater, a turtleneck shirt and obviously another shirt or sweater under the turtleneck.

"The sheriff's department just didn't put two and two together and did not investigate the cutline of a possible third garment.'

Mr. Cunningham said a report that a "T. Bundy" rented a car Tuesday in Aspen was being checked out as were all car rentals for the day. He said he feels an accomplice hardly would use the name "Bundy." or Bundy himself would hardly use the name "Bundy."

Meanwhile, authorities in Pitkin. County, who left the kidnaper alone in the court room with access to the law library and the window to freedom,

were going on the theory that Bundy is in the mountains around Aspen.

Mr. Cunningham explained the town is situated in a valley with one road through. "If he didn't have an accomplice it would be tough getting out because there's only two ways to go -from the east end or the west end.

# Federal Fugitive Charge Is Lodged In S.L. Against Theodore Bundy

A federal fugitive charge was filed against accused murderer Theodore Bundy Thursday in Salt Lake City after reports were received he had escaped to Wyoming.

The charge of unlawful flight to avoid confinement was filed by Asst. U.S. Atty. James W. McConkie before U.S. Magistrate Daniel Alsup.

The complaint says that Bundy, who was convicted of aggravated kidnaping in Sait Lake City and was in Aspen, Colo., to face a first degree murder charge, "did move and travel in interstate commerce from Aspen to a point outside the State of Colorado."

"A police informant has said that Bundy was in Wyoming," Mr. McConk-

ie said. "Apparently the Colorado authorities wouldn't issue an unlawful flight warrant so the FBI came to us here," he said.

Melvon C. Jensen, an FBI agent, signed the complaint and notes that it is based on an investigation he conducted and information provided by Salt Lake County Sheriff's Detective Bill Oefinger.

Deputy Salt Lake County Atty. David E. Yocom said the information was based on a "report the Aspen police received that Bundy had been seen in Riverton, Wyo." Mr. Yocom prosecuted Bundy in Salt Lake City on the kidnaping charge.

Bundy was committed to Utah State Prison June 30, 1976, to serve a 1-15 year sentence for the aggravated kidnaping of Carol DaRonch in November, 1974, from a Murray shopping mail.

The unlawful flight charge will allow the FBI to search for the former law student.

In other action, Bundy was charged in Salt Lake City Court with being a "fugitive from custody." Since he has fled from authorities in Colorado, he is no longer in Utah State Prison custody.

The complaint was signed by Detective Oefinger before City Judge Floyd H. Gowans.

The FBI said they were preparing an all-points bulletin on Bundy.



ASPEN: Colo. (AP) - Searchers donned ski-racing bibs to identify themselves, and officials used specially trained dogs to comb neighboring hills Wednesday for Theodore R. Bundy. who escaped from the Pitkin County Courthouse.

"We've had no new leads, nothing at all, to indicate where he might be," said a sheriff's department spokeswoman.

Bundy, 30, is charged with the January 1975 slaying of a vacationing Michigan nurse. He escaped during a recess in a pretrial hearing by leaping from a second-floor window Tuesday.

About 150 persons conducted a houseto-house search in Aspen and surrounding areas Wednesday, Officials concentrated their search within a 20-mile radius of this Rocky Mountain resort town, still insisting that Bundy, file escape charges against Bundy. was in the area.

#### Cancel School Sessions

Officials also canceled school in Aspen Wednesday. The sale of guns and ammunition has been banned in the area since his escape Tuesday.

Roadblocks remained up around this Rocky Mountain resort town and on major highways as far as 90 miles away.

Officials in Garfield County said Wednesday they are looking for one of Bundy's former cellmates who walked away from a work release program in Glenwood Springs last week.

#### Women Extremely Cautious

Aspen-area residents, meanwhile, reacted to the escape with a mixture of fear and anger. Many residents arrived home early Tuesday night, locking doors and windows not normally: secured.

Melinda Severance, a city employe, said the sheriff's department was "patently naive, bordering on criminally stupid, to leave Bundy in the

courtroom alone." Deborah Pollow, an instructor, at Colorado Mountain College, said she thought women in the area were

especially concerned and many were taking the advice of authorities not to go out alone at night. "The whole thing distresses me," she said. "This man is dangerous enough for the police department to warn citizens to stay inside and lock their doors, but he wasn't dangerous enough for them to watch him while he was in the courtroom."

Dist. Atty. Frank Tucker also criticized the lack of security which allowed Bundy to escape. Tucker said he had often warned about Bundy's desires to escape and also had requested that Bundy be shackled at all times and under a two-man guard, which was denied by the court.

"There's no excuse for what happened yesterday," he said. The district attorney added that he would

The former law student was charged with first-degree murder in the death of Caryn Campbell of Dearborn, Mich. Her nude, frozen body was found beside a rural road a month after she disappeared.

A one-time worker for the Republican party in Washington, Bundy was extradited from Utah to stand trial here. He was serving a 1-to-15 year sentence in Utah for the 1974 kidnaping of a Salt Lake City girl.





## Bundy Left Alone in Aspen Courtroom, Leaps Out Window, Escapes Into Hills

ASPEN, Colo. (AP) — Accused murderer Theodore Bundy, left unguarded in an empty courtroom, jumped from a second-floor window of the Pitkin County Courthouse on Tuesday, ran a half-mile along Main Street, and escaped into the hills east of town.

Teams of police officers and sheriff's deputies combed the aspen- and cotton-wood-covered hillsides that are dotted with expensive homes. Handbills with Bundy's picture were circulated throughout town, roadblocks were set up on outbound highways and a Rocky Mountain Rescue Service helicopter was pressed into the search.

A tracking dog traced Bundy's trail to the Roaring Fork River near the courthouse, where a group of young boys said they had seen a man who fit Bundy's description cross the river.

Additional bloodhounds were being flown in from Denver to continue the tearch.

Two deputies had been assigned to guard Bundy during his appearance in

district court here for pretrial arguments, but a witness said she saw Bundy pacing alone in the courtroom just minutes before the escape.

The Pitkin County Sheriff's Department confirmed that Bundy was left unguarded during a recess in the court proceedings. Sheriff Dick Kienast had no comment on why Bundy was not being guarded when he escaped.

"When everyone returned to court following the break, it was asked where was Mr. Bundy," said Undersheriff Ben Myers.

"It was at that time that we discovered him missing."

Just later, officials were told a passerby reported, "Someone just jumped out of a window. Is that normal?"

Bundy, 29, has been charged with first-degree murder in the 1975 slaying of a Dearborn, Mich., nurse, Cary's Campbell. Her body, frozen and nude, was found beside a rural road a month after she disappeared while vacat

tioning in this Rocky Mountain resort community.

A former University of Utah law student and one-time worker for the Republican Party in Washington, Bundy was extradited from Utah to stand trial here.

The Tacoma, Wash., native had been serving a 1-15 year sentence in the Utah State Prison for the unsuccessful kidnaping in November, 1974, of a teen-age girl from a Murray, Utah, shopping mali.

He was convicted March 2, 1976, in a non-jury trial of abducting Carol DaRonch, who managed to escape from his Volkswagen a short distance from the mall.

Bundy escaped from the law library in the back of the second-1100r court-room of District Court Judge George Lohr. It was about 15 feet from the window from which he jumped to the steps of the courthouse on Main Street.

National Forest Service workers and members of the Rocky Mountain Rescue squad assisted police in the search for Bundy. Local radio stations carried a police request that parents pick up their children at school and take them directly home.

Long lines of automobiles with out-ofstate license plates were backed up at the roadblocks as tourists fled town.

Bundy had been taken to Aspen from the Garfield County Jail in Glenwood. Springs, where he is being held for security reasons. The hearing Monday concerned motions he had filed to exclude the death penalty if he is found guilty and to bar news media from pretrial evidentiary hearings.

Public defenders assisting Bundy, who is acting as his own attorney, had finished their arguments. Lohr declared a recess prior to hearing prosecution statements. The courtroom emptied, and Bundy was left alone.

The window from which Bundy escaped is directly beneath a statue of a woman holding the scales of justice. Unlike most such statues, there is no blindfold on the statue at the Pitkin County Courthouse.

# Accused murderer leaps from 2nd floor at hearing

ASPEN, Colo. (AP) - Accused murderer Theodore Bundy escaped from custody today by jumping from a second-floor window in the Pitkin County Courthouse during a recess in a pretrial hearing.

The County Sheriff's Department said roadblocks had been set up on Colorado Highway 82, the main road leading out of this mountain resort community. A dispatcher said deputies were searching the streets of Aspen for Bundy.

Bundy, a former political party worker, had been ordered to stand trial on a first-degree murder charge in the slaying two years ago of a Michigan

He was returned to Colorado from Utah, where he was serving a 1-to-15 year sentence for the 1974 attempted kidnaping of a Salt Lake City girl.

Bundy, 29, a former law student at the University of Utah, escaped during a hearing on a motion he filed to waive the death penalty if he is found guilty. Defense attorneys assisting Bundy had finished their arguments, and District Court Judge George Lohr declared a recess before hearing the prosecution

Bundy has been conducting his own defense in the proceedings.

The Sheriff's Department said Bundy jumped from the window during the recess and ran past the courthouse toward the Roaring Fork River. Only a few persons, lawyers and members of the press, were in the courtroom at the time of the escape.

Citizens later reported sighting him near a plush condominium complex.

Bundy is charged in the January 1975 slaying of Caryn Campbell, a Dearborn, Mich., nurse who was vacationing in Aspen when she disappeared. Her nude, frozen body was found a month later beside a rural road.

Utah State Prison Warden Sam Smith said he is very disturbed to hear of Bundy's escape. "He could be dangerous," Smith said.

Shortly after Bundy began his term in the Utah prison, he was transferred from medium to maximum security because he apparently formulated escape plans. Smith said forged identification and notes on airline schedules were found among Bundy's possessions. A search also turned up road maps and a Midwest driver's license.

Bundy was investigated by police in connection with a series of killings in Colorado, Utah and Washington state.

Investigators said several similarities existed in all the killings. In

Washington, he was investigated in connection with the disappearance or murders of eight young women.

He was questioned about the 1975 murders or abductions of five young Colorado women. In Utah, Bundy was investigated in connection with the disappearance of Debra Kent, 17, of Bountiful who disappeared from the parking lot of Viewmont High School on the evening of Nov. 8, 1974.

Bundy was convicted of kidnaping Carol DaRonch, 18, from Fashion Place Mall carlier that day. Miss DaRonch, although partially handcuffed, managed to break away from her abductor a short time later.

Miss DaRonch later identified Bundy as the man who abducted her, pointed a gun at her and stated he was going to blow her head off.

The Bundy case has been a long series of legal maneuvering and delays. He was arrested Aug. 16, 1975, after an investigation and was convicted March 1, 1976. He was sentenced July 1, 1976.

The Colorado charges against Bundy were made Oct. 23, 1976.

Bundy escaped from the same courthouse where entertainer Claudine Longet was tried, convicted and served a 30-day jail sentence for the March 1976 slaying of pro skier Vladimir "Spider" Sabich.

Miss Longet was released from the county jail in the courthouse's basement last month.

The sheriff's spokesman said Bundy, who was waring a turtle neck, slacks and brown loafers, had been left alone in the law library to prepare for presentation of his case when he escaped.

# Back in Courtroom, Dead-Tired Bundy Hears New Charges

ASPEN, Colo. (AP) — Surrounded by seven armed guards, Theodore Bundy, accused of murder in the slaying of a Michigan nurse, was returned Monday to the second-floor courtroom of the Pitkin County Courthouse from which he escaped last week.

He stood, unshaven and shackled, as District Court Judge George Lohr told him he would be charged with escape, burglary and theft and set Thursday for arraignment on those charges.

Bundy, 30, was captured before dawn Monday by two sheriff's deputies who stopped a stolen 1966 Cadillac on the outskirts of Aspen. They said the driver had slumped down and run off the road as their patrol cars passed.

#### **Extremely Fatigued**

Bundy was extremely fatigued and "unable to think anymore," the sheriff's department said, and he complained of getting only 10 hours of sleep since his escape. He was allowed to sleep Monday afternoon in a basement cell in the courthouse.

After questioning Bundy, the sheriff's department said he apparently had been within 10 miles of Aspen since his escape last Tuesday. There was no evidence that he was assisted by

anyone in escaping or hiding out, the sheriff's department said.

A sheriff's department sergeant, Don Davis, said Bundy was asked why he escaped and replied, "I didn't want to go back to jail, it was just too pretty outside."

#### Looking for Opportunity

Davis said Bundy also told him he had been looking for an opportunity to escape. He managed to do that by jumping from a second-floor window in the back of the courtroom when left unguarded during a recess in a pretrial hearing.

"I believe Ted derived a certain amount of satisfaction from the fact he pulled it off as far as he did," said Davis

Bundy was limping when he appeared in court Monday and the sheriff's department said a doctor would examine a knee he apparently injured in his escape leap.

Bundy faces trial here on a charge of first-degree murder in the January, 1975, slaying of Caryn Campbell of Dearborn, Mich. Miss Campbell's forzen and nude body was found a month after she disappeared from a lodge near this Rocky Mountain resort.





#### Fermer Law Student

A former law student and one-time Republican party worker in Washington State, Bundy was extradited from Utah to stand trial. He has been convicted of kidnaping a Salt Lake City girl and is serving a 1-to-15 year sentence in Utah.

Bundy fled east from the courthouse after his escape, climbed Aspen Mountain and dropped down to Castle Creek, about 10 miles south of Aspen, Davis said.

He spent the next several days hiding in a deserted cabin, Davis said, and complained that one morning he was awakened by the sound of a search helicopter overhead.

Bundy confirmed that he had taken a .22-caliber rifle from the cabin, the sheriffs department said, but claimed he left it in the woods when he got tired of carrying it.

He was unarmed at the time of his arrest and offered no resistance, a spokesman for the sheriff's department said.

District Attorney Frank Tucker said Bundy would be charged with felony escape, first-degree burglary, misdemeanor theft for allegedly taking the rifle and felony theft for allegedly taking the car he was driving when captured.

# Escape, theft charges pending

#### Descret News special

ASPEN, Colo. — Accused killer Theodore Bundy, captured early today by sheer coincidence, faces new charges of felony escape, first-degree burglary, felony theft and misdemeanor theft.

Bundy had managed to elude lawmen and tracking dogs in a massive six-day machunt, and then was picked up about 2 a.m. on the outskirts of Aspen by two deputy sheriffs on another assignment who noticed a car being driven erratically.

When they stopped the car on Colorado 82, the deputies recognized Bundy as the driver and arrested him without resistance. He was not armed.

Bundy told investigators today he had been physically and mentally preparing himself for escape for some time, a spokesman said.

The 30-year-old former law student said he escaped because, "I didn't want to go back to jail. It was just too pretty outside."

After his recapture, Bundy was taken to the courtroom of District Court Judge George Lohr to be advised of his rights. Soven armed deputy sheriffs

stood guard as Lohr told Bundy what he would be charged with. Arraignment was set for Thursday.

Bundy escaped from the law library in the same courtroom where he appeared today.

Utah officials said today it is unlikely they will attempt to bring Bundy directly back to Utah.

Bundy was convicted in Utah of kidnaping a young Salt Lake City girl in 1974, and then had been extradited to Aspen, where he was charged with first-degree murder in the 1975 death of a Michigan nurse who was vacationing in Aspen.

He escaped June 7 by jumping from a second-story window in the Pitkin County Courthouse while he was left unguarded during a recess in a pre-trial hearing.

Bundy was dirty, unshaven, had lost 20-25 pounds and had a hurt leg when he was captured, said Colleen Curtis, spokesman for the Pitkin County Sheriff's Office. He had a bandage on his nose, but it was apparently only for disguise purposes.

She said officers thought he might be under the influence of



# Bundy Formally Charged With Four New Felonies

ASPEN, Colo. (AP) — Five new charges, including four felonles, were formally filed Thursday against Theodore Bundy in connection with his escape last week from the Pitkin County Courthouse.

District Judge George
Lohr told the 30-year-old
former law student that
he faces four felony
charges — two counts
each of felonious escape
and one count each of
burglary and auto theft
— and a misdemeanor
count of theft.

He was told conviction on all the escape-related charges could bring up to 90 years in prison and \$30,000 in fines.

The burglary charge is based on a cabin breakin, the misdemeanor theft charge on the taking of a rifle from the cabin, and the felony theft charge on the taking of the car.

Bundy, still 25 pounds

underweight from his seven-day escape into the mountains, told Lohr he wished to remain as his own counsel throughout his homicide trial, but would need an attorney to represent him on the escape charges.

Bundy faces a first-

degree murder charge for the January 1975 slaying of a Dearborn, Mich., woman, whose nude and frozen body was found a month after she disappeared from a lodge near Aspen.

Bundy leaped from a second-story courtroom window June 7, when he was left alone during a court recess. He was captured Monday as he drove a stolen car toward Aspen.

He had not been handcuffed or shackled during a series of pre-trial court appearances until Monday, a few hours after his capture. He appeared before Judge Lohr in leg irons.

Public defenders Charles Lydner and James Dumont were dismissed from Bundy's first-degree murder and Aspen lawyer Steven Ware was tentatively appointed to replace them.





drugs or alcohol because the car he was found in was being driven erratically. But "it turned out he was just very, very tired and was trying to elude them," she said.

She said he apparently stole the car just before his capture and no evidence exists that he received any help during his escape.

Before his capture, the search for Bundy centered around a cabin in the the mountainous Castle Creek area about 10 miles southwest of Aspen. Bundy's fingerprints had been found in the cabin and lawmen said he had been there for some time.

Bundy confirmed to officials that he took a .22 caliber rifle and some ammunition from the cabin, but he left the weapon in the woods when he got tired of carrying it. He said he had only about 12 hours of sleep during the escape.

Ms. Curtis said that under questioning, Bundy disclosed he had been at the cabin twice, once after lawmen searched it. He had spent most of the six days in the area of the cabin, Ms. Curtis said. She said the gun has not been found.

The only food Bundy had was a little at the cabin

and he was very, very hungry, she added.

The atmosphere today at the sheriffs' office was almost partylike as searchers returned home: "You'd better believe he's under tight security," Ms. Curtis said. "We won't lose him again."

After Bundy's escape, a warrant was issued from Utah charging him with being a fugitive from the Utah State Prison.

Based on that warrant, Utah officials had talked of attempting to have him returned directly to Utah after his capture.

But Utah State Prison Warden Sam Smith said today, "As far as I'm concerned, there's no reason now to bring him back. We'll just let him face the Colorado charges."

The warden said he is very relieved Bundy is back in custody.

# Bundy prosecutor seeks review of death penalty

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP) — The prosecutor in the Theodore Bundy murder trial will petition the Colorado Supreme Court to review a district court ruling which declared the death penalty unconstitutional in Colorado.

Deputy district attorney Milton Blakey of Colorado Springs said he will file the petition for the high court's consideration next week in hopes of resolving the dispute before Bundy's scheduled Jan. 9 trial in Colorado Springs.

District Court Judge George Lohr declared Colorado's death penalty unconstitutional Tuesday because it lloesn't allow defendants to tell jurors why they should not be put to death.

# Bundy Colorado calls off search for

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo. (UPI) manhunt for escaped murder suspect Theodore Bundy has ended, and authorities are depending on the public to notify them if Bundy is sighted.

Bundy, 31, has been free at least four days, since he escaped from his cell in the Garfield County Jail in Glenwood Springs by losing 30 pounds so he could slip through a hole in the ceiling.

Officials said he escaped by pulling himself through a footsquare hole that had been cut to accommodate a light fixture. He inched 30 feet through an 18-inch-high crawlspace, dropped down into an unoccupied jailer's apartment and walked out the front door.

The convicted kidnapper is considered dangerous. He is accused in the 1975 slaying of a Michigan nurse in Colorado and has been a suspect in the murders of several other women in Colorado, Utah and Californía.

At least 50 volunteers and officers searched the Glenwood Springs area after Bundy was discovered missing about noon Saturday. Undersheriff Robert Hart said Bundy had escaped Friday night or Saturday morning.

The search was called off Monday, said

"Members of the sheriff's posse had to get back to work, so we decided to call it off and not call out the off-duty men," said Hart. "I'll tell the men on duty to keep an extra watch, and we'll just have to depend on the public to notify the authorities if they see someone matching Bundy's description.

No trace of Bundy was found, although two doctors said Monday a hitchhiker\they helped near Thompson, Grand County, Utah, matched the description of Bundy.

Dr. Dorr Burns of Grand Junction, Colo., said he and his companion picked up a young man on U.S. 50 Saturday who said (Indicate page, name of newspaper, city and state.)

he ran out of gas. The doctor said they drove the man to Thompson for gas, then returned him to his car.

An all-points bulletin remained in effect n in Utah, and the FBI in Denver said it was checking a report by a woman in Tacoma, Wash., Bundy's hometown, who said she was chased by a man fitting Bundy's description. Bundy's mother lives in Tacoma.

Capt. N.D. Hayward, chief of detectives for the Salt Lake County sheriff's office. said local lawmen have received many reports claiming possible information about Bundy. He said all will be investigated, "but it will take time."

Hayward said he doubts Bundy would return to Utah where he is known. The escapee was convicted in 1978 of the altempted kidnap two years earlier of Carol DaRonch, then 17, in the parking lot or a Murray shopping mall. He was sentenced to 1-15 years in the Utah State Prison.

He was sent to Colorado in 1977 to faile murder charges in connection with the death of the Michigan nurse who was killed

Hayward said it wasn't likely that the escapee would return to Utah with any thoughts of revenge. "His only interest might be to pass through."

Police agencies notified Miss DaRonch and her family of the Bundy escape, but refused to say whether any protective surveillance had been provided.

FBI agents said a federal warrant charging Bundy with unlawful flight to avoid prosecution for murder was beingprepared.

The only other lead investigators had in the search for the former University of Utah law student was a scent dogs trailed



# **Jailers** Raked In Bundy Escape

G L E N W O O C SPRINGS, Colo. (UPI) — El Paso County District Attorney Robert Russell, special prosecutor in the case against murder suspect Theodore Bundy, said Wednesday he thought Garfield County jailers had been negligent in allowing Bundy to escape.

Bundy, 31, escaped from the county jail in Glenwood Springs last Friday night or Saturday morning by crawling through a hole in the celing of his cell. He go! into the ceiling by remov ing a light fixture.

Undersheriff Robert Hart said a prisoner had reported before the escape that Bundy had been crawling through the hole in the ceiling. Hart said a welder was called in to seal the hole, bud did not come before Bundy escaped.

Russell said he thought the incident was a case of "absolute negligence" on the part of the jailers. He said he was "extremely disappointed" in the escape.

Bundy, who had escaped once before during a pre-trial hearing in Aspen, was scheduled to go on trial Monday or charges of murdering Caryn Campbell of Dean born, Mich., whose fro h body was found in a owbank outside Aspen ń January 1975.

Hart said he had not known that another prisoner had reported Bundly was crawling around in the ceiling. He said he did not have enough time now to investigate the report and find out why ! nothing had been done earlier to cover up the

Hart said efforts would be concentrated on re-capturing Bundy. The hole was sealed off Tuesday by welding a steel plate across it, he said.

The undersheriff also said a than matching Bundy's description was seen in the Colorado Hotel Saturday a few hours after his escape.

## **More Bundy Photos** Asked by FBI Agen

DENVER (UPI) - A special agent for the FBI said Monday he had requested nationwide circulation of Ted Bundy's photograph and background in an effort to find the escaped murder suspect.

Bundy, 31, escaped Dec. 30 from the Garfield County Jail at Glenwood Springs, Colo., where he was awaiting tiral on a first-degree murder charge.

Ted Rosack, special agent in charge of the Denver FBI office, said he was requesting circulation of the photographs and background. But he said that adding Bundy to the FBI's list of the nation's most wanted fugitives would be up to FBI headquarters a Washington, D.C. and that no decision had been

Bundy was charged in the slaying of Caryn Sue Campbell, a nurse from Dearborn, Mich., who disappeared from a ski resort in Aspen, Colo. Her frozen body was found January 1975 in a snowdrift outside the ski resort.

Bundy, who was scheduled to begin trial this Monday, escaped from his cell by squeezing through a hole in the ceiling where a light fixture had been removed. He inched through a crawlspace and came down in the adjoining, unoccupied apartment of the jailer. Bundy then left through the front door.

It was his second escape. Bundy jumped from a second-story window of the Pitkin County Courthouse in Aspen June 7 during a recess in a pretrial hearing He was recaptured in the area six days later.

# FBI may put Bundy on most wanted list

Combined AP, UPI

DENVER — The FBI may place accused killer Theodore Bundy on its list of 10 most wanted criminals, seeking more publicity and public help in the search for the escaped inmate.

Bundy, awaiting trial for first degree murder in the 1975 slaying of Caryn Sue Campbell, a nurse from Dearborn, Mich., escaped from the Garfield County Jail in Glenwood Springs, Colo., the night of Dec. 30.

The FBI announcement was made Frilay as Mesa County authorities scriened airport passengers in Grand Junction, acting on an anonymous tip that a man fitting Bundy's description was seen trying to hire a car to take him to the airport.

The alert went out Friday morning when the Garfield County Sheriff's Office in Glenwood Springs received a phone call that a man matching Bundy's description had walked into a bar at New Castle, offering to pay anyone \$50 to drive him to the Grand Junction airport "to catch an airplane for a flight to Nevada."

Officers then kept watch on the highways for a car that may have given the man a ride, and five officers screened people at the airport, but Bundy was not seen.

In Denver, a spokesman for Ted

Rosack, special agent in charge of the Denver FBI office, said wanted posters on Bundy probably would begin appearing in law enforcement offices and post offices throughout the country by early next week.

The spokesman said the next step would be placing Bundy on its list of 10 most wanted criminals.

"There are a couple of vacancies on the 10 most wanted, and we could use the publicity," he said. "The last guy put on the list was picked up in two days."

Bundy, 31, was scheduled to no on trial Monday in Colorado Springs, charged with the murder of Miss Campbell while she was on a siding vacation in Aspen, Colo., with her fiancee. Her nude body was found under a snowbank outside Aspen several weeks after her disappearance.

Bundy, a former University of Utah law student, was granted a change of venue for his trial because of publicity stemming from his first escape last summer from the Pitkin County Jari in Aspen. He was recaptured within a week.

Special presecutor Robert Russel charged Garfield County jailers with "absolute negligence" in allowing Bundy to escape a second time.

### Bundy Poster Mulled by FBI Officials

DENVER (AP) — The FBI's Denver field division may ask its national headquarters to authorize distribution of wanted posters for Theodore Bundy, who is accused of murdering a Michigan nurse in 1975, an FBI spokesman said Saturday.

Bundy, 31, escaped from the Garfield County Jail at Glenwood Springs Dec. 30 while he was awaiting trial in the slaying of Caryn Sue Campbell, a nurse from Dearborn, Mich.

Miss Campbell was murdered while she was on a skiing vacation in Aspen.

Fundy has escaped once before, last; surmer, from the Pitkin County jail at Aspen, but was captured within a week.

FBI Agent Simon Tullai said investigators have been chasing numerous leads into the Bundy disappearance the past week, "but still have no hard information as to his whereabouts."

Tullai said the special agent in charge of the Denver office, Ted Rosack, has considered recommending that an "identification order" be put out on Bundy. That step could be preliminary to putting the Tacoma, Wash., man on the FBI's list of 10 most wanted fugitives, he said.

But Tullai said the decision to distribute identification orders, or wanted posters, or to put Bundy on the top 10 wanted list would have to come from the agency's headquarters in Washington, D.C.

# Utah Hitchhiker Link to Bu<del>nd</del>y?

GRAND JUNCTION, Colo. — Two doctors told Grand Junction police Sunday they picked up a hitchhiker Saturday generally meeting the description of Theodore Bundy.

Bundy escaped from jail Friday night or Saturday morning while awaiting trial in Colorado on first-degree murder charges.

Dr. Dorr Burns, Grand Junction, said the man he and a companion picked up was hitchhiking about two miles east of Thompson, Utah, heading west. They said they picked him up at 2 p.m. Saturday.

#### Something Suspicious?

Dr. Burns said they took the hitchhiker into town to get some gas and back to his car, a 1970 maroon Oldsmobile Cutlass.

Dr. Burns, who said he hadn't heard

about Bundy's escape until he returned to Grand Junction from Salt Lake City, said he couldn't give a description of the hitchhiker. But he said there was something about the man's age, size and where they found him which "seemed suspicious" to him.

Utah Highway Patrol officers were told to be on the lookout for the car. Searchers in Colorado combed the area around Glenwood Springs, trying to find some trace of Bundy.

Meanwhile, ground units, helicopters and dogs Sunday joined search efforts for Bundy, scheduled to go on trial Jan. 9 for murder, who escaped from his Garfield County Jail cell.

Bundy, charged in the 1975 slaying of a Michigan nurse near Aspen, Colh., escaped from his 9-by-4-foot jail cell during the weekend by crawling down a 30 foot passageway to a jailer's apartment.

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo. Theodore Bundy, awaiting trial for the murder of a Michigan nurse, escaped Saturday from the Garfield County Jail by crawling through a hole in the roof of his cell, officials said.

It was Bundy's second escape in six months.

Undersheriff Robert A. Hart said Bundy was discovered missing from his cell shortly after noon Saturday. Bunday was last seen in his cell at 7 p.m.

Hart said Bundy apparently crawled through a hole where a light fixture had been and into the jailer's apartment, then walked out the door.

"He had to walk out the front door," said Hart. "There's no other way he could have gotten out."

Hart said the light fixture had been broken in Bundy's cell, but he would not comment on how long the hole had been in the ceiling, or if Bundy had widened it to crawl through.

"I'm not going to comment at this time," he said.

#### Establish Roadblocks

Roadblocks were up throughout the area, and deputies were reported searching for the fugitive.

Bundy leaped from a second-story of the Pitkin County Courthouse last



Law enforcement officials began an immediate search.

Bundy is charged with first-degree murder in the death two years ago of Caryn Campbell, a Dearborn, Michlanders who was vacationing in Aspen.

Miss Campbell disappeared in January 1975, and her nude, frozen body was found a month later beside a rural road.

During a pre-trial hearing last June, Bundy escaped from an empty Pitkin County courtroom through an open window and leaped two stories to the ground. He was the object of an intensive manhunt for almost six days before he was recaptured.

Officials said Bundy was scheduled to be transferred to Colorado Springs, where his trial had been moved on a change of venue. Bundy is scheduled to go on trial Jan. 9.

#### Legal Action

'District Judge George Lohr in Aspen had granted Bundy's request for a change of venue. Bundy had contended he could not get a fair trial in Aspen because of pre-trial publicity.

Lohr said he chose Colorado Springs for the trial site because it is the home of El Paso District Attorney Bob Russel, who is prosecuting the Burdy case along with his assistant Millon Blakey.

Lohr had also granted a defence motion to prevent the death penalty from applying in the Bundy case. Lohr ruled the Colorado death penalty was unconstitutional and constitutes cruel and unusual punishment. Russel has appealed the decision to the Colorado Supreme Court.

Hart said Bundy, 30, left blankets rolled up in his bed to make it look as though he were sleeping.

Bundy had been extradited to Colorado from Utah, where he was serving a 1-to-15-year sentence for kidnapping a Salt Lake City girl in 1974. Officials sail he was disciplined for planning an estape while an inmate in the Utah State Prison.

# Colorado Sets Up Bundy Roadbłock

GRAND JUNCTION, Colo. (AP) — Mesa County authorities set up a rolling roadblock on I-70 and five officers screened airport passengers Friday after receiving a phone tip that escaped murder suspect Theodore Bundy had hired a car to drive him to the Grand Junction airport.

Bundy failed to show, officers said.

Mesa County Undersheriff Hod Hutchison would not term the anonymous phone call a prank. He said such calls are common and that Friday's action was a routine law enforcement practice "in a case with a man like this Bundy."

Bundy escaped from the Garfield County jail at Glenwood Springs Dec. 30. He is charged with murder in the death of a Michigan nurse who was vacationing in Aspen early in 1975.

The alert went oul Friday morning when the

Garfield County Sherist's Office at Glenwood Springs received a phone call that a man matching Bundy's description had walked into a bar at New Castle and offered to pay anyone \$50 to drive him to the Grand Junction airport, about 80 miles east of here.

Garfield County Undersheriff Robert Hart quoted the anonymous caller as saying the man fitting Bundy's description at the New Castle bar "had to go to Grand Junction to catch an airplane for a flight to

Nevada."

Hutchison said, "Hart called us, gave us a vague description of the car. So we watched the highway (I-70) for about three hours and nothin came by" matching Bundy's description from 11 a.m. to about 2

# Probe the Bundy escape

t's difficult to believe the cavaller attitude Colorado authorities are taking toward escaped murder suspect Theodore Bundy.

Not only were jailers negligent in allowing Bundy to escape through a foot-square hole in the ceiling of his cell, but now Colorado authorities have called off the manhunt after only four days. That certainly is taking the matter lightly for a man awaiting trial on a savage murder charge, a suspect in several other murders, a convicted kidnapper and a two-time escapee from Colorado jails.

Such lackadaisical police and jailer conduct ought to be punished at least by reprimand, or even outright suspension.

That action might at least shake up other careless jailers.

The escape raises several questions: Why wasn't Bundy's cell checked more frequently, which might have prevented a long lead time for his escape before officials were alerted? Why was the jail designed so that Bundy's cell was connected by a crawlspace with a jailer's apartment? Why wasn't the ceiling repaired so that no possible escape route was left open?

Bundy not only is clever, he is desperate. Yet those factors seem insufficiently impressed upon the minds of at least two Colorado jailers and others charged with prisoner custody A shakeup is needed.

# Agent wants Bundy posters -

DENVER (UPI) — A special agent for the FBI said Monday he had requested nationwide circulation of Ted Bundy's photograph and background in an effort to find the escaped murder suspect.

Bundy, 31, escaped Dec. 30 from the Garfield County Jail at Glenwood Springs, Colo., where he was awaiting trial on a first-degree murder charge.

Ted Rosack, special agent in charge of the Denver FBI office, said he is requesting circulation of the photographs and background. But he said adding Bundy to the-FBI's list of the nation's most wanted fugitives would be up to FBI headquarters in Washington, D.C. He said no decision has been made.

Bundy was charged in the slaying of Caryn Sue Campbell, a nurse from Dearborn, Mich., who disappeared from a ski resort in Aspen, Colo. Her frozen body was found January 1975 in a snowdrift outside the ski resort.

Bundy, who was scheduled to begin trial Monday, escaped from his cell by squeezing through a hole in his cell's ceiling where a light fixture had been removed. He inched through a crawl space and came down in the adjoining, unoccupied apartment of the jailer. Bundy then left through the front door.

It was his second escape. Bundy jumped from a second-story window of the Pitkin County-Courthouse in Aspen June 7 during a recess in

a pretrial hearing. He was recaptured in the area six days later.



LOS ANGELES — Long Beach, Calif., police said Thursday they are investigating the possibility that escaped murder suspect Theodore Bundy was the man who handcuffed a woman and tried to force her into his car before she struggled free.

Officers said the the method of operation in the case is so similar to Bundy's when he kidnapped a Marray teen-ager that he is considered a suspect.

Bundy, convicted of the Utah kidnapping, remains free after escaping two weeks ago from the Garfield County Jail in Glenwood Springs, Colo., where he was awaiting trial on a first-degree murder charge.

Salt Lake County Sheriff's Detective Capt. N.D. Hayward said he is awaiting word from Long Beach on whethert they consider Bundy a prime suspect, in which case he will send a copy of his file on the former University of Utah law student.

Bundy, a native of Tacoma, Wash., has been investigated in connection with several rape-killings or disappearances of young women in at least three western states. His description nearly matches that of the man in the Long Beach abduction attempt.

Ginger Russell, 28, told police she was walking along the pacific Coast Highway about 2:30 a.m. Thursday when a car with spot lights mounted on either side blocked her path, and a man who said he was a policeman asked for identification and then tried to handcuff her. She said she struggled free and flagged down a passing motorist.

Police Sgt. Robert Lummis said the man also roughly matched a composite drawing of one of two suspects in the so-called Hillside strangulation sex-killings of 11 young women and girls in Los Angeles during the past three months.

The strangler or stranglers have never struck before in Long Beach. However, Lummis said the Hillside Strangler task force had been notified because of similarities in the case.

Bundy, of course, is not a suspect in those crimes because he was in jail in Colorado when they were committed, Hayward said.

Meanwhile, the FBI headquarters in Washington, D.C., has been asked by the Denver field office to place Bundy's name on the "Ten Most Wanted" list.

Special Agent Simon Tullai said Thursday in a telephone interview from Denver that at the least his office wants the Washington office to issue an "identification order" placing Bundy's picture in every post office.

# Bundy 'Not the Man' California Suspects in 3 Assault Cases

ROSEMEAD, Calif. (AP) — California police Friday had discounted possibility that Theodore Bundy is the man posing as a police officer in connection with rape and assault cases.

They had believed Bundy might be the man since that was his method of operation in a Utah kidnapping. He had been a Utah State Prison inmate on that offense and was due to be tried in Colorado for a murder charge. He escaped Dec. 31 from the Glenwood Springs. Colo., jail where he was being held pending trial.

#### Third Case

Friday, however, in the third such case in as many days, sheriff's deputies here reported an assault by a man posing as a police officer.

A 25-year-old woman was driving her car early Thursday morning when she was pulled over by a man who flashed a spotlight at her, deputies said. The man, who wore a pistol in a shoulder holster, reportedly asked for her driver license, examined it and told her it had expired.

#### Attacked in Apartment

He then grabbed the woman and raped her, deputies said. The woman put up a struggle and told deputies she thought she scratched her assailant's face.
