Dear Mr. Greenwald:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated June 17, 2009, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for a copy of the five oldest open FOIA case/requests on record. To include all letters of correspondence to and from the requesters, all interagency memos/communications, a search of all electronic records, etc. I apologize for the

delay in responding to your request. DIA continues its efforts to eliminate the large backlog of pending FOIA requests. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with another agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 63 documents (116 pages) responsive to your request.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 58 documents (106 pages) must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 3 and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3) and (b)(6). Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statutes are 10 U.S.C. § 424 and 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i). Statute 10 U.S.C. § 424 protects the identity of DIA employees, the organizational structure of the agency, and any function of DIA. Statute 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i) protects intelligence sources and methods. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals.

Finally, I have determined that the remaining five documents (10 pages) are appropriate for release in full. DIA has not withheld any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the records.

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated February 19, 1997, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for information concerning Vladimiro Montesinos Torres. I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with other agencies and consult with multiple offices within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 673 documents responsive to your request. Of these documents, 307 were referred other government agencies for their review and direct response to you. This referral is necessary because the documents did not originate with DIA.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 98 documents must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(6). Exemption 1 applies to information properly classified under the criteria of Executive Order 13526. Exemption 2 applies to information which pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the agency, the release of which could risk circumvention of a legal requirement. Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statute is 10 U.S.C. § 424 which protects the identity of DIA employees and the organizational structure of the agency. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals. In addition, some portions were not processed because they are not responsive to the request. All reasonably segregable responsive portions of the documents are attached hereto.

Further, I have determined that 268 of the responsive documents must be withheld in full pursuant to the FOIA. These withheld documents are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(6).

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. Section 552, et seg. This request is made on behalf of the National Security Archive, a nonprofit public interest research institute and library in Washington, D.C. The Archive is a tax-exempt nonprofit organization whose purpose is to earich public policy debate by making widely available records on important areas of major public concern on foreign, defense and intelligence policy. Documents obtained by the Archive, including the records requested in this letter, are carefully analyzed, indexed, organized into collections and published. Archive document collections are also available for inspection and copying at the Archive by scholars, journalists, members of Congress and their staffs, present and former public officials, other public interest organizations, and the general public. Information in these documents is disseminated across the country through distribution of our published collections to research libraries and through the Archive's other publishing and media activities. I am conducting research on the subject of this request as part of an Archive research team which includes experts on the subject and which already has done extensive research and determined that the requested materials are necessary to our project.

Please also waive all fees in connection with this request. In National Security Archive v. U.S. Department of Defense, 880 F.2d 1381 (D.C. Cir. 1989), cert. denied, 110 S Ct. 1478 (1990), the Archive was declared entitled to a waiver of all search and review fees under the FOIA as a "representative of the new: media." This request also qualifies for a waiver of duplication fees because disclosure of the information in the requested documents is in the public interest since release to us of these records, which directly relate to the formation of U.S. policy on the subject, is likely to contribute significantly to greater public understanding of the operations or activities of the government in making that policy. Should you decline to waive or reduce all duplication fees, we are prepared to pay normal reproduction costs if I decide to copy the records produced, but please describe your specific reasons in writing and notify us before incurring costs over \$100.

Dear Ms. Estevez:

This is a status update on your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests (enclosure) received by this office. Your requests were determined to fall within our Complex Track for FOIA processing. This simply means that your requests involved a large amount of records, or that the records requested require significant review within this agency or consultations with other government agencies. Please be assured that our office is committed to processing your requests as soon as possible.

Because your requests falls within the Complex Track and has been pending for a period of time greater than the statutory allowance, this office has determined that it may be helpful for us to provide greater explanation concerning the status of your requests. This office sorts backlogged requests into three functional queues for management purposes. These three queues are explained further below:

Awaiting Tasking Queue: includes requests that must be tasked within the agency for subject matter experts (SME) search and/or review of the responsive records.

This responds to your request under the Freedom of Information Act dated 17 September 1996. Therein you requested records concerning drug trafficking and organized crime organizations in Mexico. A search of DIA's systems of records located 2834 documents responsive to the subject of your request. Of these, 2687 have been referred to another government agency for their review and direct response to you as they did not originate with DIA, and 19 have been referred for review and return to DIA for final determination of releasability. Eight documents are currently still under review by DIA.

Upon review, it has been determined that some portions of 62 documents are not releasable. The portions withheld are exempt from release pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(7), Freedom of Information Act. Subsection (b)(1) applies to information properly classified under the criteria of Executive Order 12958, as amended. Subsection (b)(2) applies to information which pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the agency. Subsection (b)(3) applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statute is 10 U.S.C. Section 424. Subsection (b)(7) applies to information compiled for law enforcement purposes. All reasonably segregable portions of the documents are attached hereto.



This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated June 24, 1997, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for information concerning Guatemalan military units. I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with multiple offices within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 165 documents responsive to your request. Of these documents, 36 were referred to other government agencies for their review and direct response to you. These referrals were necessary because the documents did not originate with DIA.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 39 documents must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(6). Exemption 1 applies to information properly classified under the criteria of Executive Order 12,958, as amended. Exemption 2 applies to information which pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the agency, the release of which could risk circumvention of a legal requirement. Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statute is 10 U.S.C. § 424 which protects the identity of DIA employees and the organizational structure of the agency. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals.

Further, I have determined that 65 of the responsive documents must be withheld in full pursuant to the FOIA. These withheld documents are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), and (b)(6).

Finally, of the remaining 25 documents, one is being processed under DIA case number 0709-1997 and will be released when that case is complete. The other 24 are FBIS documents and were not processed per our agreement. DIA has not withheld any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the records.

If you are not satisfied with my response to your request, you may exercise your right to file an administrative appeal by writing to the address below and referring to case number 0697-1997. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 days after the date of this letter.

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

Dear Mr. Simpson:

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated June 30, 1997, your reference number 970496DIA050, for information concerning Guatemalan military units from 1977 to the present. I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with other agencies and with multiple offices within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 461 documents responsive to your request. Of these responsive records, 279 documents were referred to other government agencies for their review and direct response. This referral is necessary because the documents did not originate with DIA.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 125 documents must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), (b)(3), (b)(6), and (b)(7). Exemption 1 applies to information properly classified under the criteria of Executive Order 13,526. Exemption 2 applies to information which pertains solely to the internal rules and practices of the agency, the release of which could risk circumvention of a legal requirement. Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statute is 10 U.S.C. § 424 which protects the identity of DIA employees and the organizational structure of the agency. Exemption 6 applies to information which if released would constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of other individuals. Exemption 7(C) and (F) applies to investigatory records, the release of which could (C) constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of others, or (F) endanger the life or physical safety of law enforcement personnel. All reasonably segregable portions of the documents are attached hereto.

Further, I have determined that 57 of the responsive documents must be withheld in full pursuant to the FOIA. These withheld documents are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 1, 2, and 3 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. 552 §§ (b)(1), (b)(2), and (b)(3).

If you are not satisfied with my response to your request, you may exercise your right to file an administrative appeal by writing to the address below and referring to case number 0707-1997. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 days after the date of this letter.





I looked at the eleven cases listed in Alesia's email to determine whether they needed SRB consideration. I found that in many of the cases, there were DIA documents that showed no sign of having been reviewed. Also, documents originated by other agencies - which I assume are to be referred to the originators - were generally devoid of any marking to indicate that they had been reviewed for DIA equities.

Of the cases listed, ten are concerned with Guatemalan military officers or related topics. Information of this nature, much of which originated in earlier DIA FOIA releases, is already available in quantity at the National Security Archive website.

I therefore find that the ten cases related to Guatemala do not require SRB review. However, based on the records in FOIAXpress, they do require additional action and correction to ensure that all documents have in fact been properly reviewed and (if appropriate) reducted prior to release to the requestors. The documents originated by other agencies should be reviewed for DIA equities and these equities properly decided before we surrender the documents to other agencies for final release determination.

I did not look at every document, so the following comments may be incomplete. Some specific comments for some cases:

0579-94 - For (b)(3):10 USC 424 , I note that the enclosure (beginning on Page 3 of the document) is annotated as withheld in its entirety, but not redacted in FOIAXpress.

0621-96 -There are two copies of (b)(3):10 USC 424; one redacted, one not.

0692-06 - Has a Coast Guard document in the Navy pile. US Coast Guard belongs to Homeland Security, not Navy.

The eleventh case, 0679-97, is not Guatemala related. Instead, it concerns Operation QUICK

TRANSIT - the evacuation of refugees from Northern Iraq following DESERT STORM. This case, if meant for my review, does not require referral to the SRB. DAN-1A, please check and see if this is the right case or whether this was supposed to be a Guatemala-related case like the others.
