Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This is in further response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of August 26, 2015, requesting a copy of the title page and the table of contents, for all INSCOM Annual History volumes from the years 2000 to the present and supplements our response of August 27, 2015.

As noted in our letter, the search has been completed with another element of this command and records have been returned to this office for our review and direct response to you.

We have completed a review of the records in accordance with Executive Order (EO) 13526. As a result of this review, information has been sanitized from the document to protect the personal privacy rights of the individuals concerned. This information is exempt from the mandatory public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(3) and (b)(6). The statute invoked under Title 5 U.S. Code 552 (b)(3) is 50 U.S.C. § 3024(i), which allows for the protection of intelligence sources and methods.

The withholding of the information described above is a partial denial of your request. This denial is made on behalf of Major General Christopher S. Ballard, Commanding, U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command, who is the Initial Denial Authority for Army intelligence investigative and security records under the FOIA. You have the right to appeal this decision to the Secretary of the Army. Your appeal must be postmarked no later than 90 calendar days from the date of this letter. After the 90-day period, the case may be considered closed; however, such closure does not preclude you from filing litigation in the courts. You should state the basis of your disagreement with the response and provide justification for a reconsideration of the denial. An appeal may not serve as a request for additional or new information. An appeal may only address information denied in this response. Your appeal is to be made to this office to the below listed address for forwarding, as appropriate, to the Secretary of the Army, Office of the General Counsel.
