for use by AUSTALE-1 - AD Case No. 6937

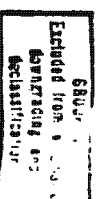
REFERENCE : RI Examination dated 5 April 1953, same subject

1. Examined herewith for use as outlined in Reference are the following two documents issued in []³¹ for AUSTALE-1: []¹¹
Ordinary Passport No. 65702 and U.S. Designation and Internationalization Form L-94 (attached in the passport, page 9). Also furnished herewith is a travel itinerary on which AUSTALE-1 should be entered before he applies for the Argentine visa in Buenos Aires.

2. In keeping with arrangements made by TAD/AD, the National Office is preparing, for direct delivery to WVA, the International Nationalization Certificate in Alias to be used with the above documents. This certificate should be checked for accuracy as to name, place and date of issue. It is also understood that AUSTALE-1 will have received a bona fide call upon reactivation prior to departing from the U.S.

3. TAD/AD prepared the above []¹¹ passport on the strength of information that (BIOZIMMIS) would instruct an Argentine Consular post in the U.S. to place a visa in the passport. The document was prepared in one week from date of request because of operational urgency. The requirement specified use of a []⁰³ passport. To avoid placing a long, time-consuming alternate itinerary in the passport, it was given a recent issuance date, which necessitated issuance on the basis of consular issued nearly one year earlier (the most recent ones available). This short itinerary also would seem to make application at this time in the U.S. for an Argentine visa somewhat unusual. Plans to be now informed that AUSTALE-1 is to obtain his Argentine visa without (BIOZIMMIS) assistance so wish to enter the United States of the documentation provided for this operation, and agreed to by Mr. []⁰³ a matter of record. This confirms discussion with Mr. []⁰³ A telephone check with the Argentine Embassy by RI indicated that a []¹¹ transcript in the U.S. can obtain an Argentine visa in this country.

4. It is understood that the passport will be needed for about six months, following which it is to be returned to TSD/AB. Should further operational need exist for this document beyond that time, it must be borne in mind that the expiration date is 7 March 1959 and that annual revalidations are needed from that time forward. Any such revalidations would have to be entered by TSD/AB. Also, use of this passport for travel other than that originally intended (direct from U.S. to Argentina and back within six months) will require careful scrutiny by TSD/AB of the situation at the time of the intended future travel.

In accordance with verbal arrangements between Knorre, [redacted] and [redacted] please pass on to TSD/AB details of ACTUAL-1's procurement of the Argentine visa and any other travel control events of significance in the use of this passport so that TSD/AB may gain from the experience of this agent in the use of this alias document.
