SUBJECT: Provisional Cryptographic Clearance U. S. Military
Personnel Assigned 7821st Composite Group, EUCOM

REF : FDI Memorandum dated 20 December 1949

1. It is requested that all security files now held on the below listed personnel be reviewed to ascertain if these men can meet the basic requirements of AG 311.5. If it is found that the basic requirements are met according to the information presently held, a provisional cryptographic clearance is requested so that these men can be enrolled for basic cryptographic training.
