The parents of Subject have resided in Central America since 1947. The father was an executive in a [soft drink] company in Mexico City and is currently an executive with the [American Chamber of Commerce] in Mexico City.

5. Subject's father was investigated in 1962 for operational approval. His security file, #35003, is generally favorable and tends to establish the citizenship of Subject, the father, and Subject's mother. The father was born in Mexico in 1915 of foreign parents who became naturalized citizens in 1923 and the father has derivative citizenship. Subject's mother is a

natural born citizen.

6. File 201-²³30999 on the father was reviewed in DDP/WH/1. It showed that he was an active contact for the [redacted] between 1947 and 1949. He has been of interest to the [redacted] since 1950 and received an O/A in October 1962. He was a social friend of the recent COS there. He was active in providing the station with anti-communist literature and information, and he was terminated as a contract agent by (the new COS) 27. The Deputy Chief of WH/1 indicated that the father was such a conservative right winger that his information was biased. He is still available as a contact.

9. Credit and criminal checks on Subject and NAC's on Subject, including passport, and NAC's on her father were negative. RI & K checks and OS Indices on Subject and her parents were negative.
