SUBJECT: *O* Cassa Heiligman FRANK

1. Reference is made to your New York Field Office memorandum dated 23 January 1966, captioned as above. The following amplifies information orally passed your Bureau via liaison on 17 February.

2. On 26 January, [redacted] was contacted in Brussels, Belgium, at his hotel by a woman calling herself [redacted]. Subsequently having the opportunity to check the hotel register, he found that a woman was also registered as a [redacted] travelling on a U. S. passport. Since the call from [redacted] was an inside call, he assumed that this was a name being used by [redacted]. The hotel in question is frequented by communists and particularly by foreign communist elements having dealings with Belgium's pro-Chinese Communist Party.

3. Subject told [redacted] that she planned to stay in Brussels only one day before leaving for her return trip to the United States. She had spent a week in London, contacting many people on behalf of [redacted]. She was unwilling to give any account of contacts but did admit to seeing [redacted] and some of the people involved in the Society for Anglo-Chinese Understanding, a British organization which seeks to promote friendship and contacts with Communist China. Subject stressed that she was representing the Latin Committee in New York, not the Progressive Labor Party. [redacted] was told by [redacted] lieutenant of [redacted] that Subject stated that the Progressive Labor Party was trying to establish fraternal contacts with the Japanese Communist Party and the Japanese Socialist Party.

4. Subject told [redacted] that she had been in Algiers in June at the time of the downfall of [redacted]. She stated that she had been struck by the National Guardian's decision to publish a violent anti-Bertrand Russell article by [redacted] an American living in Paris whom she described as fanatically "Communist."

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5. [redacted] and Subject were joined by [redacted] and [redacted] secretary of [redacted] youth group and now a lawyer. [redacted] outlined the case of EPTDH to them and urged them to get statements on [redacted] behalf from all possible quarters, especially Belgian lawyer's associations. [redacted] were surprised to learn that Subject planned to return to the United States without making similar contacts in France and Italy. Subject stated she had some addresses in Paris, among them Partisans and [redacted]

6. [redacted] found Subject friendly but very uncommunicative, cautious, and somewhat defensive. Subject maintained she had no detailed knowledge of the newly formed Communist Party of the U.S.A. (Marxist-Leninist) in Los Angeles, the Ad Hoc Committee for a Marxist-Leninist Party in Chicago or other Pro-Chinese groups.

7. [redacted] made an appointment to see [redacted] at his home the morning of the 27th. [redacted] learned from [redacted] that his interview with Subject had not been very satisfactory. [redacted] noted that [redacted] visit was the first contact with U.S. Marxist-Leninists and he had asked her for a survey of the situation in the U.S., but she had cut him off and insisted on confining her remarks to the [redacted] case.

8. [redacted] described Subject as about 45 to 50 years old, 5 feet tall, and of squarish build, with dark hair and a "Slavic" appearance.
