1. There follows the monthly operational report for Project LIENVOY activities during November 1963.
2. Target Lines - November 1963
 20-88-0) was disconnected on 30 October to provide a free line for use against a LIENSOR target but this connection was not made.
3. Processing of LIENVOY information
 There was no change in the processing during this reporting period.
4. Exploitation of LIENVOY Information
 The most significant information provided by LIENVOY was record of contact by Lee OSWALD with the Cuban and Soviet Embassies in Mexico prior to the assassination of President Kennedy. OSWALD's contact had been cabled to Headquarters on 8 October 1963 for investigation by ODEWY (MEXI-0435).
- LIENVOY also provided operational background information which lead to the recruitment of a local employee in the Yugoslav Embassy.
- LIENVOY continues to be the principal source for background information on Soviets, Cuban and Soviet Satellite officials operating in Mexico.
5. Maison
 William C. CURTIS maintained regular contact with LIENVOY and LIENVOY-2. LIENVOY's nomination has not resulted in a change in the LIENVOY operation for the present.

The present chief of [redacted] is aware of the LIENVOY operation since it was necessary for CURTIS to request his assistance in investigating
