MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, Operations (100-400)
VIA Deputy Chief, NY/OC (100-400)
SUBJECT: Handling of NY/OC-Operatives

1. During a meeting with Mr. Wood, C, NY/OC, Mr. Cleveland, DC/ NY/OC and Mr. Swenson, C, NY/OC on 20 June 1963, Mr. Swenson reviewed the following points concerning the handling of the NY/OC-Operatives. These points were the subject of either discussions by Mr. Swenson and the various NY/OC-Operatives in NY Division.

- 2. From the subject NY/OC's proposed activities in NY/OC, the following are to be done:
 - a. To identify NY/OC-Operatives and to get the information to the appropriate country desks as soon as possible. To run traces, including field traces, and to analyze the results. Traces to be run by NY/OC in NY/OC staffs and by the appropriate country desks of NY/OC agents in their respective countries.
 - b. To identify the best target from the NY/OC-Operatives identified by NY/OC and to put them in order of priority, considering their overall value, ease of success, accessibility and proximity. The selection of targets to be done jointly by NY/OC and the NY/OC desks.
 - c. To give consideration to appropriate NY/OC-Operatives agents refer to the NY/OC desks since the NY/OC desks are the ones to be contacted. NY/OC's description of the NY/OC-Operatives to be a greater communication problem in reporting the NY/OC-Operatives to the NY/OC desks. NY/OC-Operatives to be transferred to the NY/OC desks and NY/OC-Operatives to be transferred to the NY/OC desks.
