Maria Theresa Proenza y Proenza is the subject of Bufile 64-29479. Enclosed are single copies of Havana reports dated 12/1/44 and 4/27/45 concerning her. It appears she is identical with the present employee of the Cuban Embassy, Mexico City.

ARMANDO LOPEZ BETANCOURT

According to a Secret CIA report dated 5/5/60, members of the diplomatic staff of the Cuban Embassy, Mexico City, met with members of the Mexican Communist Party to study plans brought from Cuba by Juan Valdes Gravalosa for attacking different Latin-American countries. Armando Lopez was listed as one of those who attended. This data originated with a British intelligence agency. CIA appended the comment that Lopez was possibly identical with Armando Lopez Betancourt, who, according to a British intelligence agency in February, 1960, reportedly had been sent to the Cuban Embassy, Mexico City, to work against Cuban exiles.

CRISPIN GONZALEZ BOUDET

According to a report from the U. S. Embassy, Havana, Cuba, dated 3/5/48, Crispin Boudet represented the youth group of the Autentico Party. On March 4, 1948, at a ceremony honoring the War Federation of Democratic Youth Delegation which was then in Havana. Reportedly, leaders of communist youth groups were also present.
