Reference is made to memorandum dated November 14, 1960, from Mr. Donahoe to Mr. Belmont. On November 28, 1960, [redacted] Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), advised the Liaison Agent that CIA's source of the original derogatory information concerning the subject could not be made available for testimony for at least six months. This situation arises because source is involved in a sensitive intelligence operation in Cuba. [redacted] advised that at the end of six months CIA would be in a much better position to resolve the source's availability for testimony (X)

[redacted] (S) stated that as a result of the Bureau letter dated November 10, 1960, CIA requested its office in Havana to submit a status report concerning the matter. He indicated that this would be handled in an expeditious manner. (X)
