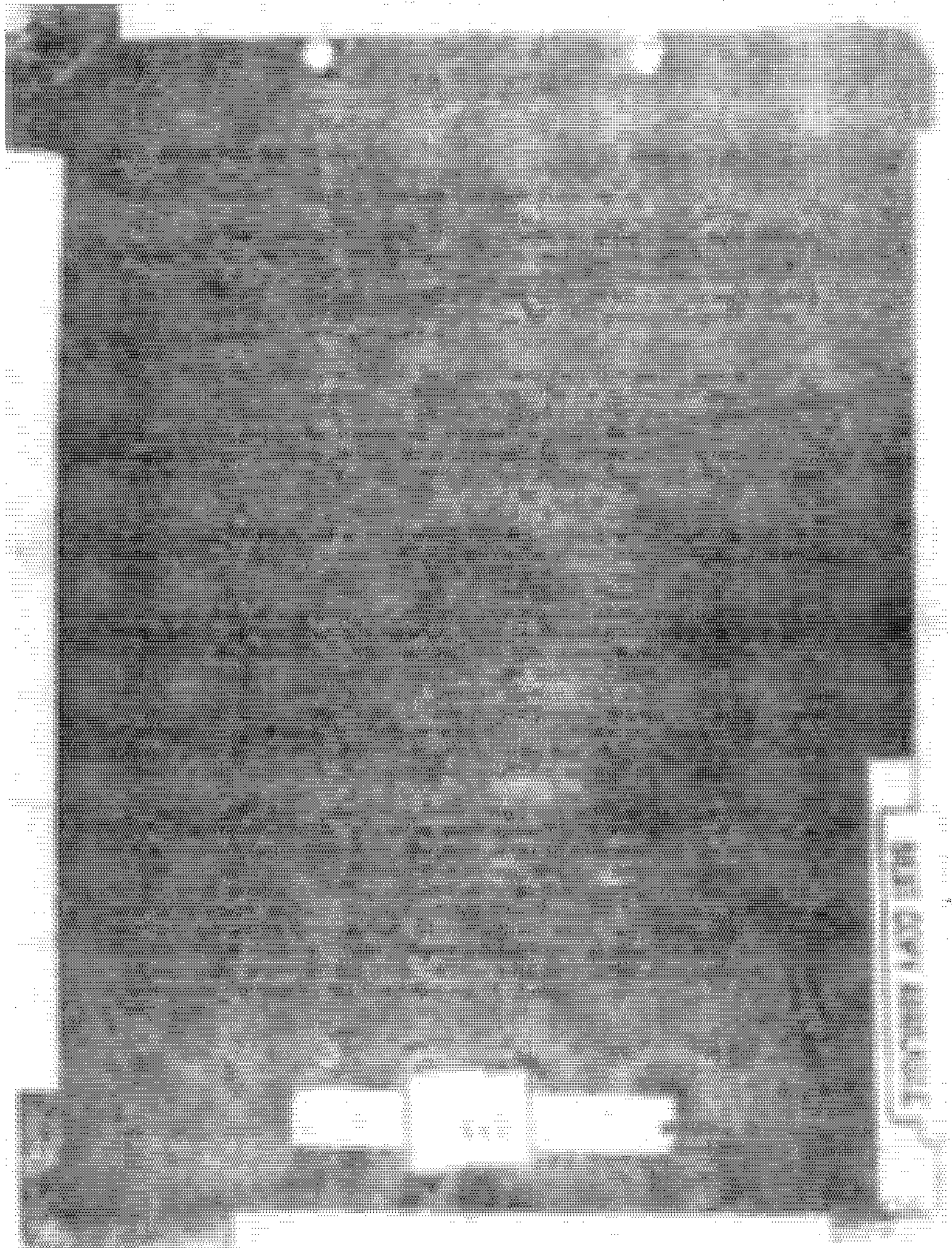

SUBJECT: Contact Report - Antonio VECIANA Blazquez

5. (D) The latest plan of this group is to collect funds for the purchase of eight boats for use in their military activities. VECIANA stated that they already have four boats and enough cash, arms and ammunition (including explosives) to equip a 25th company. Their need (in addition to personnel) is for boats, food (and related supplies and items) and radios. These boats, costing about \$250,000 each, will have fibreglass hulls and be used for sabotage raids and for carrying small guerrilla bands in Cuba. The raider will be fitted with a contact with the boat and a portable power. VECIANA mentioned packages of electronic price transceivers equipped. VECIANA hopes they will be prepared for 20 - 25 raids against Cuba within 3 weeks. (Notes: This is a duplicate of detailed information contained in ANTI-COMM, DMN 217A, dated 15 January 1960.

6. (D) VECIANA provided copies of the correspondence with the Bureau of Customs regarding seizure of the boat. (See above.) VECIANA stated that the boat was owned by a Cuban-American (living in Miami) who is not a member of their organization. He said that the boat was worth about \$200,000. The supplies and equipment aboard included approximately 10 1/2 million worth of ammunition, food, fuel, ice, watches, and a 1 KW generator. He said the total value of the boat and equipment was about \$2,500,000. The boat was in the Miami River at the time of seizure.

7. (D) VECIANA requested assistance in releasing the boat and equipment. He made a plea for funds (\$10,000), and stated that the Government could assist the group most by allowing them freedom of movement.
