**Subject:** Review of Files with John Nolan's Name on Them in the RFK Files at the JFK Library  
John NolanI reviewed two files at the JFK Library that had John Nolan's name on them, one from Box 40 and one from Box 34 of the RFK files.The first file, from Box 40, was marked "John Nolan's January 1964 Latin America Trip." It contained information regarding such topics as: illiteracy in Bolivia, youth programs in Mexico, fact sheets on Brazil and Chile, and an Adam Yarmolinsky memorandum on DOD activities in support of the Interagency Youth Committee.The second file, from Box 40, had Nolan's name on it and contained various correspondence on a range of topics that had been forward to, or written to Robert Kennedy. The correspondence appeared to be of a personal nature in which people had written to express their best wishes or to offer condolences.
