**Subject:** Board Meeting -- DOJ Documents

After speaking with Laura and Kevin, and thinking some more about this issue, I wanted to recommend an approach to handling certain DOJ documents with proposed postponements relating to foreign counterintelligence and foreign liaison issues (the documents are internal DOJ records regarding the handling of FOIA requests for core JFK assassination files of the FBI). Since the underlying FBI records with foreign liaison issues are being referred to the respective countries, I recommend that, for consistency, we do the same with the DOJ documents that apparently relate to the same records and that have the same liaison issues. I do not think we need to present this matter to the Board. In addition, the FBI is reconsidering certain foreign-counterintelligence issues. Some documents, however, will have soley green issues that can be voted on by the Board. Because these DOJ documents have not been released in any form, and the foreign referral may take some time, I recommend that we tell DOJ to send them to the JFK Collection with the liaison issues redacted (and hopefully to be opened up to a greater extent after referral); this would be consistent with FBI records that are in the JFK Collection with foreign liaison information redacted pending foreign referral. Finally, DOJ wants to redact portions of some DOJ documents as NBR. I will do a short memo recommending that the Board uphold the redactions.
