Another conversation with my informal adviser on this approach has resulted in the following additional information:1. We would need a Rules Committee waiver to get authorization language into an appropriation bill. This is not unusual, according to what I have been told, when it involves "short money" and/or a small agency and/or a limited purpose.2. Colby would have to testify before the Rules Committee in favor of the waiver. There is at least the possibility that the waiver relative to the Board would be one of many items on which such a waiver was being sought. If that was the case, we wouldn't stick out in the process. Hoyer is probably our key with Colby.3. Burton of Indiana would have to be on Board, too. Maybe we can discuss ways to get him on our side on Wednesday. If all the "ducks were in line," this is the easiest way to go, according to my adviser. My conversation was not long and we did not discuss details beyond what I have written above.
