**Subject:** Conversation with Richard Hertling, Staff of Senate Governmental Affairs Committee -- [Corrected Memo; Disregard Earlier Version]

On Wednesday, April 2, 1997, I spoke with Richard Hertling, Staff of Senate Governmental Affairs Committee, 224-4751, regarding the Administration's support for a one year extension of the Review Board. He was pleased to hear that information and was waiting to get the word from Senator Specter's office that Specter will introduce a bill with Senator Glenn as a cosponsor. At that point, when he knows there is going to be a bill, the matter can be brought to the attention of Chairman Thompson. Hertling said that he had watched the Zapruder film hearing on C-Span. He strongly suggested that if the Review Board was going to acquire the film and commit the federal government to an expenditure of several million dollars, the Congress better be consulted first. He added that to do it before the extension is resolved would be "a serious problem; people will start raising questions..." I told Hertling that I would get back to him when we had heard from Senator Specter's office. He suggested that once a Specter/Glenn bill is introduced, we could then talk strategy about how to proceed on the extension and also deal with the Zapruder film issue.
