Here is the information you requested, in regard to pursuing whether or not the LBJ Library has the unedited tape(s): LBJ Identifiers: (Their edited version is 3 cassettes) Tape #1: NLJ-3 (WHCA-SRT-969-1) Tape #2: NLJ-4 (WHCA-SRT-969-2) Tape #3: NLJ-5 (WHCA-SRT-969-3)Yesterday, Dennis spoke with Steve Tilley about this, and as a result Steve Tilley called the LBJ library to inform them that ARRB would be contacting them to ask whether they held the unedited tapes--Steve spoke to a Tina Houston, telephone (512) 482-5137.Suggestion: When ARRB calls the LBJ Library, we should ask them for any letters of transmittal or forwarding documents which transmitted the version of the material they now hold to them from the originator. Even if they do not have unedited tapes, this paper trail, which should exist, ought to be quite useful to us in our search for the original tapes.NOTE: The original tapes could be quite lengthy, since four frequencies were available for comms between SAM 26000, SAM 86972, and Washington DC. We do not yet know whether each frequency was used for the full 2 hours and 17 minutes of the flight from Love Field to Andrews, but if so, the original tapes could be as lengthy as 8 or 9 hours.
