Jeremy also understood that the Board's decision about how to review these materials would have further implications for other Secret Service records. I prepared summaries of the contents of these sections on Monday and Tuesday. I was attending the Board meeting when these materials were under discussion. I was also present while the Board discussed other FBI-related matters. I would point out that my review of the Secret Service liaison sections was hampered and delayed by Jeremy's ill-conceived insistence last Friday morning that I rush through a review of the Secret Service HSCA material. I attended the Board's open meeting on Monday in order to learn about your plans for the next several months. Since Jeremy has failed to communicate his plans to me, I had no choice but to learn--along with members of the public--what he has in mind. I would have drafted his letter this morning. I will at this point record my objection to the path he has chosen, and I will monitor the results of this letter. I note that he has failed to provide me with a copy of his draft. Would you please ask him to give me a copy of his letter? I do not appreciate Jeremy's feeble attempt to create the impression that I am doing anything less than what I should be doing.
