Sen. Specter's personal office forwarded me, not to the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI), as I thought might happen, but rather to a Judiciary Committee subcommittee which Specter chairs. On the other hand, if we sent it to Charlie Battaglia, staff director of the SSCI (who knows about the JFK Act because of his involvement in the processing of Church Committee records), we could raise broader issues (Church Committee records) when we followed up on this Humes-related letter.
