She noted that there was extensive water damage and that they could not order a book from Books in Print to replace it and thus recommended a copy be made usingthere photoduplication service. She estimated the cost at \$118. I think this is too great a sum to pay. Also I think we should fight it given that earlier they thought one book was not returned, Report to the President and the Secretary of Defense, when in fact it had been and it was only through my own search request that the book was found.I called Tenna today to tell he that we are in the midst of a board meeting and that we will be in touch. She appreciated the call back today.
