Discussed this proposal at length with Stewart Aly. The problem for DOD (and which differentiates it from CIA and FBI in this respect) is that there is no single declassifying agency within DOD that could send a representative to review documents. Rather, documents are farmed out to whatever service or agency (e.g. DIA) that has equities for declassification. Aly thinks -- and, frankly, I agree with him on this -- that probably the best thing to do with respect to the JFK Library is for ARRB staffers to review DOD material, copy whatever is relevant, and then for us to send it over to DOD for them to parcel out to the responsible agency for declassification. I also discussed with him our intention to streamline both consent releases and declassification with DOD -- mainly by bypassing him and going directly to responsible agencies for expedited handling of documents. He's happy with this, and promised to assist us with the authority of his office in making sure this goes smoothly. Finally, he brought up the fact that he owes us some responses to earlier correspondence -- he promised to try to put it together today. (Past experience suggests we may then see it by the end of the week, but you never know. . .)
