The first five boxes of JFK are huge, but a large portion (30-40%) of the material will be consent released. If we can get Board guidelines at the next meeting on reviewing 201, security, and personnel files, that will help enormously. Of course, if the Board decides to release this kind of material, the whole process will slow down, as CIA will fight us on this.
