MEETING REPORTDocument's Author: Douglas Horne/ARRB Date Created: 06/12/96Meeting Logistics Date: 06/11/96Agecny Name: Witnesses/ConsultantsAttendees: Fred Williamson, David Marwell, Jeremy Gunn, Tim Wray, Doug HorneTopic: Exploratory Discussions re: Kodak Assisting ARRB with Clarification of Various Assassination-Related Film RecordsSummary of the Meeting At ARRB request, Mr. Fred Williamson, Kodak's Director of Imaging Technology Policy for Federal Government Relations, met with ARRB staff to hold tentative discussions re: feasibility of Kodak performing some photographic consultant work for ARRB. In a very general way, problems related to defining scope and cost were discussed. Kodak expressed its desire to help ARRB in this area.At Kodak's request, ARRB agreed to provide Kodak with a photocopy of HSCA Volume 6 (photographic work), to be forwarded by an ARRB document which will define the maximum range of photographic film(s) which ARRB may want investigated, and the general ways in which each film document may require clarification. Kodak's Washington office will forward these items to Rochester for technical evaluation. Following evaluation by Kodak, a Rochester technical representative will come to Washington to meet with ARRB to discuss types of Kodak assistance possible (or not possible) in regard to each ARRB-proposed film item, ranges of cost for various types of assistance, and possible ways to proceed in this area. ARRB representatives stressed that ARRB had made no final decisions yet, and that ARRB did not want to repeat any work done by the HSCA.Kodak stressed its feeling that it was Kodak's patriotic duty to assist the government from time to time when the government required assistance which Kodak was best equipped to provide, and stated that Kodak had no desire or intent to make any profit on any assistance provided to ARRB.
