[emphasis added]" and which would require DoJ to keep and preserve for thirty years "all materials provided by the DoJ and examined by the Committee."I have also come across RIFs from some of the more obscure HSCA record series (Notes & Roll Call Records Taken by Clerk at Hearings and Records Created or Received After the Committee's Expiration) which suggest the existence in the JFK Collection of a final or signed version of the above draft. These other record series are located either at Archives I or II. I will try and secure a copy of a final version if it exists.
