Yesterday, apparently in response to our newspaper stories in military papers, we received a package containing a statement from a former member of the USAF named Robert G. Vinson. (Mr. Vinson actually went to the trouble of going to an attorney's office and doing an on-tape interview with the attorney; the package includes a transcript of his statement to the attorney plus photocopies of some documents from Mr. Vinson's military and personal records.) The assassination-related gist of Mr. Vinson's statement is that he was an enlisted member of the USAF traveling from Washington, DC back to his home station at Ent Air Force Base in Colorado Springs on November 22, 1963. The military aircraft he was traveling on (apparently a C54) made what he took to be unscheduled stops in Dallas, where it took on passengers, and Roswell, New Mexico, where these passengers got off. Due to the length of Mr. Vinson's statement (approx 40 pages) I told Janice not to make individual FYI copies. Instead, the original is in the "military response" file we've started on send-ins of this sort and one copy has been made for Chris, who's honchoing the military mail-in project.
