Today I returned a voicemail message from Max Holland (recorded while I was on vacation last week). He had the following DeLoach-related observations-requests:(1) He noted that, while he was "down in Dallas," he "found out" that Robert Gemberling ghost-authored the chapters of DeLoach's book on the JFK assassination.(2) According to Holland, DeLoach writes in his book that the FBI had given him access to "6000 separate items" in connection with his research (for the whole book, not just the JFK assassination parts). Holland made a FOIA request to the FBI for these "items," expecting the request to be non-problematic because the material had already been given to DeLoach. The FBI replied by saying there were actually 1300 documents that had been given to DeLoach, and they still needed to be reviewed before being released to Holland, in order to see if they contained privacy information regarding DeLoach. Holland told me that he was mostly interested in documents related to the assassination, and wanted to know if the Board could somehow "speed up" his getting access to assassination-related information in these "DeLoach papers."(3) I told him that I did not know what was in these "DeLoach papers," but that I thought it likely that most of the assassination-related subset of those papers were already available to the public. I told him that I would look at what DeLoach's book says about his access to FBI records and get back to him.
