He said that about 6 months ago, the JAG office (Judge Advocate General; i.e., the legal office) at Bethesda put out an internal advisory at Bethesda asking all offices to search for records related to President Kennedy's autopsy. He said that at that time, at the direction of Bethesda JAG, he personally perused the contents of his safe and could find nothing whatsoever related to the JFK autopsy.He went on to state that he would prefer that I talk to Bethesda's JAG officer, CDR Norman, at (301) 295-2298. He said that if CDR Norman tasked him to look again, he would search again, but that he is already 100% sure that his office presently holds no records related to the JFK autopsy.[NOTE: This action about 6 months ago was stimulated by ARRB staffer Dennis Quinn's telephone inquiry to the Bethesda JAG office. Following their internal search, Bethesda JAG did fax a document to Dennis Quinn stating that a search had been conducted and that no additional records were found based on this recent search. At the present time I see no reason to ask Bethesda JAG to repeat actions taken about 6 months ago, at ARRB request; therefore, I will not recontact Bethesda JAG unless there is new justification to do so.]
