This may be premature, since I haven't looked at any of the HSCA CIA-referred documents which Barry has begun to return to us, but I presume CIA will be returning at least some documents that have also been referred to other agencies. The referred document databases we have (NARA's referral sheet notebooks, as entered into our Open/Referred/Postponed databases, as well as the HSCA Cross Reference database) indicate the existence of a fair number of such records. Any system we devise for processing the CIA returns must be cognizant of the need to identify such records, so as to ensure that we're not moving documents into the consent database which are actually still outstanding because some other agency's equities (and this will almost always be FBI) have not yet been cleared.
