KovakasDescription of the Call Date: 01/09/97Subject: Civil Div ComplianceSummary of the Call:Mr. Kovakas asked for another extension for the Compliance Statement (from Jan 13 to Jan 21). I agreed. Mr. Kovakas indicated that he needs the additional time because he is having difficulty confirming what the Civil Division transmitted to NARA for inclusion in the JFK Collection. I had informed him that, according to my review, the Civil Division had forwarded papers from the Weisberg v. Webster FOIA case. He expressed surprise that that was done, asserting that he believed that FOIA materials were not assassination-type records. This issue came up several weeks ago with DOJ's Office of Information and Privacy and it is an issue that must be resolved given that DOJ should have a lot of FOIA related papers. We told OIP to first identify the universe of FOIA files relating to JFK assassination documents before we conclude whether they are all, or partly, assassination records that must be processed under the Act. I will communicate the same position to the Civil Division. Don't forget to compose individual Action Item documents for any action items that resulted from the call!
