In short, the statement discloses that all DIA records on the assassination were forwarded to NARA on Sept. 9, 1993 and that no other responsive DIA records have been located since then. The Statement is probably not sufficiently detailed in describing the scope of the DIA's search. We will have to meet with DIA and prepare in advance of the meeting (e.g., ascertaining what materials were submitted by DIA to NARA in 1993). Review and Identification of Assassination Records to Date (To Be Completed by ARRB before the Informal Interview With Agency)Informal Meeting With Agency (January-February 1997)Informal Meeting was held at DIA on Jan 28, 1997. Attendees for the Board were Tim Wray and Ron Haron. Attendees for DIA were Anne Winner, , Division Chief, Archives & Records Management Division, R. Paul Richardson, Chief, FOIA Staff, and [Screened by: NARA RD-F on October 12, 2016 according to the John F. Kennedy Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. 2107, Section 6(1)A], Information Service Specialist. DIA indicated that in 1993 they submitted to the National Archives DIA records for inclusion in the JFK Assassinations Collection. This material was of a limited nature, comprising about a box of materials related to DIA responses to document requests of the House Select Committee on Assassinations. We indicated that we are trying to locate any 1963-64 records of DIA that would be related to the assassination, and that such records were not included in what was provided to NARA. DIA is presently commencing their historical declassification program under E.O. 12958 and there are numerous archive records from Suitland that must be reviewed. Ms. Winner indicated that they do not have the resources to review the relevant archive records for assassination materials by the Fall of 1997. To assist, we asked that DIA make available to us the SF-135 forms for 1963-64 DIA records; we would review those forms and identify any boxes that should be pulled from storage; and DIA would make those boxes available for inspection. Ms. Winner indicated that there may be some files that are so sensitive that they fall outside the normal protocal for storing at Suitland. Our ability to assist the DIA in meeting its obligations will, of course, be subject to our own resource limitations. We told DIA that, to the extent that DIA is unable to
