The Bolden file is 1,281 pages (8 file folders). Also, at the April meeting, the Board designated an additional 163 pages of material: two more PRI files and Agreements with the FBI. Some of this material is also ready to be placed in the gray boxes at NARA (John Machado just brought these files on May 23, 1997). Last week, John also stamped open one gray archives box of Warren Commission records at NARA so that is now open to the public. We gave John 43 thick documents from OMB with USSS equitites for the Service to stamp open. A total of 172 pages of USSS records will be considered at the next Board meeting (a PRI file and additional protective memos). At NARA, recently delivered (post-JFK Act) USSS records are contained in 6 gray archives boxes. Also, the USSS newsclippings and newspapers are in 7 large, flat oversized boxes. Of those 800 documents, the Secret Service presented 56 documents with requested postponements to the Review Board. The Service returned the remaining documents to NARA for inclusion in the JFK Collection without any requested postponements. With the exception of about 4 documents with agent addresses or social security numbers and another 5 or so documents (one of which contains 413 postponement requests) the Review Board voted to open them in full. Those 5 documents are still under consideration by the Review Board. The Secret Service has not yet appealed any Board decisions. In addition, out of 45 protective surveys for President Kennedy (March-November 1963) designated assassination records by the Review Board, the Service has requested postponements in 12. These are still under consideration.
