The CIA team understands our policy for AM-crypts to be as outlined below. If any of this is incorrect, please inform us.I. The Review Board will vote to release the digraph, but protect the remainder of AM and LI crypts in the following circumstances: a. When the crypt appears next to a true name that has been releasedb. When the crypt appears next to specific identifying information that is not an agent's or a source's true namec. In other cases, when the CIA has demonstrated a need to protect.This is based on the following concepts: 1. There is a reduced sensitivity in regards to AM and LI digraphs; 2. It is fairly easy to deduce that a person that is identified in the document is involved with either Cuban or Mexican operations.II. The Review Board will vote to release the entire crypt in the following circumstances:a. When the linkage of the crypt to an operation, individual or other is already widely known (and/or has already been released in earlier documents)b. When there is a demonstrated link to the JFK assassination story (ARRB staff will determine linkage)c. The crypt appears in a document that contains no specific identifying informationIII. The Review Board will protect the entire crypt in the following circumstances:a. In special cases, and where the CIA has provided a justification sheet which describes the need for continued protection in full.
