Subject: Conversation with Nina Noring Regarding State Dept. Memo on Russia, Belarus
As I said in my voice mail message to you, I spoke to Nina after you and I had spoken on the telephone. She said the fax to us was more of an FYI, but she was glad to get my additional comments that David had given me. I told her that David said the following:* The Russia section of the memo focuses only on Ministry of Foreign Affairs and not on the other Soviet archives, including the KGB and the Federal Archival System. Jack, Kermit and David had also met with representatives from both of these archives.* One problem was that the Russians were being too narrow in their consideration of what constituted an assassination record. It was important to convey that the scope of records went beyond what they had on Lee Harvey Oswald. We were interested in other documents such as cables that dealt with the Soviet reaction to the assassination and communications with the Cuban government, and other governments, in the aftermath of the assassination.I told Nina that I might get additional comments from Jack this afternoon and could call her back. She said that I should do that and thanked us for following up with her.
