Subject: Pike Committee

Pat Murray, Chief Counsel for the House Intelligence Committee, called me today raising certain issues with respect to the 20 unredacted versions of documents that we selected from the Pike Committee files the other week and which we have requested copies of (so the Board can vote on the redactions that were made for the JFK Collection). At first, Murray wanted us to get the materials from the agencies themselves. I said that this is not possible (e.g., Pike Committee interviews may not be with the agencies). Murray then stated that he felt a need to get agency authorization to release the documents to us. I tried various arguments that this was unnecessary, including citing the example of the Senate Intelligence Committee providing us with unredacted copies. I also stated that we were authorized to obtain Pike Committee materials under the JFK Act, that we had security clearances, a SCIF, etc. In any event, I gave him Barry Harrelson's number and told him that the CIA should have no objection to our receipt of these materials. At this point, I am not certain what other agencies Murray may want to get approval from, but I am hoping that this does not become more difficult than it should be. Murray said he would call back after speaking with Harrelson.
