Dear Ms. Peterson,I am the (new) Executive Director of the JFK Assassination Records Review Board. As a part of our work, we are examining the "chain of custody" of White House records from the Kennedy administration. We are particularly concerned about records that may have existed on November 22, 1963, but that are not now available at the JFK Library. It has been suggested to us that you may have some helpful information for us. We are interested in approaching this issue in a tactful and diplomatic, but professional way.
