Review Board's representative in the call: Ron HaronSixth Floor Museum's representative in the call: Mike CollinsDescription of the Call Date: 03/16/98Subject: Subpoena to 6th Floor MuseumSummary of the Call:I spoke with Mr. Collins regarding the subpoena to the Sixth Floor Museum. I agreed that the return date of March 24 could be postponed to the week of April 20 or April 27. I also agreed that the depostion and document inspection could be done at the Museum. I told Mr. Collins that we were mostly interested in: (1) inspecting all Parkland Hospital records (which Mr.Collins said comprise a cabinet drawer) to ascertain what original records they have and whether they are of such importance that they should be in the National Archives; (2) identifying other original records that were made available to the WC, HSCA, or Church Committee; and (3) getting a copy of the Dorman film.Mr. Collins said that these materials can be made available to us informally and suggested that a deposition may be unnecessary. I told Mr. Collins that we would consider this, but that I would have to check with our General Counsel, who is out of town. My current inclination is to forego a formal deposition and to inspect the materials and meet with the Musem informally (without waiving the right to take a deposition if that is necessary).Don't forget to compose individual Action Item documents for any action items that resulted from the call!
