Yesterday, SF found an additional 18 boxes (31cubic feet) of the undeeded Sheridan, some of which contain records on the Garrison investigation. She thinks that it would be useful if someone [me] from the ARRB went through the material so that a stronger argument could be made to Mrs. Sheridan that these records must be released. Megan Desnoyers has sent a letter to Mrs. Sheridan asking for Sheridan's oral history. (this was a new one on me as well) I suggest that depending on when Ron takes the deposition, that perhaps I could accompany and review the Sheridan at that time.4. SF and MD seem pretty fired up about Max Kennedy and plan to cite from the legislation to push the envelope
