Sorry this one has fallen by the way. Milam raises three issues, only one of which I have an answer for at the moment: issue one (appropriately enough). I looked at the 2/26/78 document from Finck to Purdy today while I was at Archives I. It is referred to the CIA, but I'd be shocked if they recommended postponement. The document is a "Memorandum For Record," with the subject heading: "Transcript from Personal Diary." All the subject references on the RIF which Milam finds so odd and suspicious are a function of the notes that Finck took when he attended a 12/8/77 conference at which a Lloyd Braithwaite spoke on "Organized Crime and the JFK Assassination." That is to say, they reflect the contents of a public speech by a third party, nothing more.
