He identified Oswald's companion as James Farlow McCurley. Some paperwork on this found its way into the State of Louisiana's official report on the assassination which was assigned a CD (Commission Document) number and which eventually became CE 1413. The pages of the CD relevant to McCurley were excised, however, and not published by the Warren Commission as part of CE 1413 (I presume because of privacy concerns). The point of telling you all this, of course, is to bring to your attention another local entity (the Sheriff's Office of East Baton Rouge Parish) which may not be on your radar screen.2) FYI, there is some paperwork in WC files from the Department of Justice, State of California, Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation, re: Minutemen.
