Only one of the three you asked for was available at Archives II, whose Studies in Intelligence records are organized as follows: there is a folder for each issue (Spring, 1978; Fall, 1981 etc.) in which individual articles, separately stapled, can be found. But it's clear that not every article from an issue is in the folder -- you can tell because the pages are numbered and there are page gaps between otherwise consecutive (in the folders) articles. In searching for the articles I had to move outside the warm and friendly domain of Steve Tilley and into the unfamiliar (and less hospitable) territory of the Textual Reference Branch. In ordering the "issues" of Studies, I had to put in a pull slip and wait my turn in the public Research Room for the requested issues to arrive. I was not able to reconnect with my contact in the Textual Reference Branch to ask him to confirm/explain why some of the articles were clearly and purposefully missing from the issues. If you'd like, I can call him tomorrow and ask him to confirm for me that they don't have these other articles. Let me know. I apologize also for the legal-size paper -- that's all that's available in the public Research Room.
