I apologize for the delay in responding to your request, but here is some info:The best descriptions of PFIAB's role may be in the Ranelagh book Rise and Decline of the CIA. It includes details on the creation of the Board under Eisenhower. The Church Report includes a summary section on the evolution of the PFIAB. Clark Clifford's memoirs, Counsel to the President, offers perhaps the best detailed description of the PFIAB during the Kennedy and Johnson Administrations. As a member of the Board at that time, he discusses specific issues which the PFIAB dealt with during the period 1961-66, including Vietnam.I could not find anything at the GWU library pertaining to the PFIAB specifically, although there were some books on the intelligence community as a whole, which might possibly address PFIAB.
