While looking through Rockefeller Commission stuff today, I came across two folders (about an inch to inch and a half) of material entitled "Medical Consultant Panel". I have to confess I wasn't aware the Commission had such an entity. On April 18, 1975 the Commission had five consultants at the Archives to view the autopsy photos, X-Rays, Zapruder film, etc -- the whole dog and pony show. Each consultant subsequently sent in his responses to a series of standardized questions. There is also a transcript (77 pages) of staff interviews with the panel on the day of the event. In Doug's absence, I asked Dennis if he knew about these records and he said no, so I thought I should pass it along.
