In the context of the HSCA collection, a consent release refers to a NARA-referred document in the collection (referred because the record originated in an agency other than the HSCA) which the originating agency has cleared for release. That is to say, when NARA originally processed the HSCA collection under the JFK Act, if they came across a CIA-originated document (for example) in the boxes, they marked it "Referred" (not open to the public for the time being) and sent it to the CIA to see if the agency had any objection to its release. If the CIA then tells me they have no objection to its release, I move it over to the consent database and the Board never has to actually vote on it. I hope this helps.
